 REGULATING PROFESSIONAL CORPORATIONS  
 (February 15, 2005)

INTERPRETATION

1.01 Definitions

The following definitions shall apply to the following terms used in this By-law unless there is something in the subject matter or context inconsistent therewith:

- (a) “**Act**” shall mean *The Certified Management Consultants Act* (Saskatchewan);
- (b) “**Council**” shall mean the council of the Institute;
- (c) “**CMC**” shall mean the Certified Management Consultant designation as issued by the Institute;
- (d) “**General Code**” means the Uniform Code of Professional Conduct of the Institute, as amended from time to time by Council;
- (e) “**Institute**” shall mean the Institute of Certified Management Consultants of Saskatchewan continued pursuant to section 3 of the Act;
- (f) “**Management Consultant**” shall mean a person qualified by background and experience whose principal activity is the practise of Management Consulting, who arrives at his/her recommendations through systematic analysis of facts and application of independent judgment based on specialized knowledge and skill;
- (g) “**Management Consulting**” shall mean the service performed by independent and professionally qualified Management Consultants in investigation and identifying management problems related to the policy, organizational, operations, administrative and technical aspects of the principal institutions of our institute, in recommending appropriate solutions to these problems and helping to implement them;

(h) “**Member**” shall mean a member of the Institute who is in good standing;

(i) “**Member in Good Standing**” means a member of the Institute whose fees are not in arrears in accordance to these bylaws and who has not been suspended or expelled or struck from the register in accordance with these bylaws or the Act.

(j) “**Registrar**” shall mean that person appointed as such by the Council pursuant to subsection 11(2) of the Act.

## 1.02 Headings

The division of this Bylaw into sections, subsections and paragraphs and the insertion of headings, sub-headings and index are for convenience of reference only and shall not affect the construction or interpretation of this Bylaw.

### PROFESSIONAL CORPORATIONS

#### 2.01 Incorporation

(a) One or more Institute members may incorporate a corporation pursuant to *The Business Corporations Act* (Sask.) for the purpose of carrying on, in the name of the corporation, the business of providing any management consulting services;

(b) The words “Professional Corporation” or the abbreviations “Prof. Corp.” or “P.C.” shall be part of the name of the Professional Corporation and any such name shall also appropriately depict that the Professional Corporation is engaged in the business of providing management consulting services that may lawfully be performed by members of the Institute.

#### 2.02 Application for Permit

(a) Any member may apply to the Institute on behalf of a corporation for a permit pursuant to Section 8 of *The Professional Corporations Act* by providing to the Registrar:

- (i) A completed Form A;
- (ii) A copy of the Articles of Incorporation including any amendments;
- (iii) A copy of a current Certificate of Status issued pursuant to *The Business Corporations Act* (Sask.);
- (iv) The fee prescribed by the Council;
- (v) Proof that the legal and beneficial ownership of all the issued voting shares of the corporation are vested in one or more members and that all of the directors of the corporation are members;
- (vi) Proof, to the satisfaction of the Registrar, that:
  - (A) A person who will carry on practise of management consulting as a member on behalf of the corporation is a member in good standing;
  - (B) A person who is employed or engaged by a professional corporation is under direction or supervision of a member.
- (vii) Any other information required by the Registrar.

(b) Subject to clause (c), the Registrar may issue a permit to a corporation which complies with the requirements of the provisions of *The Professional Corporations Act*, *The Certified Management Consultants Act* and these Bylaws.

(c) A permit shall be in Form B and may contain any conditions that the Registrar thinks appropriate.

(d) A permit shall, unless sooner revoked, expire on December 31 of the year for which it was issued.

#### 2.03 Renewal of Permit

A corporation wishing to have its permit renewed for the following calendar year shall forward to the Registrar:

- (a) Form C;
- (b) Copy of a Certificate of Status; and
- (c) The renewal fee prescribed by the Council.

#### 2.04 Revocation of Permit

(a) The Registrar may revoke the permit of any Professional Corporation which fails to meet the requirements set out in *The Certified Management Consultants Act*, *The Professional Corporations Act* or these Bylaws or fails to comply with any term or condition contained in the permit.

(b) A permit shall be immediately revoked where only one member of the Institute provides management consulting services in the name of the Professional Corporation and that person dies or is expelled or is suspended from the practise of management consulting or ceases to be a member.

(c) The permit shall be revoked if the professional corporation makes a written request, evidenced by means of a resolution passed by the majority of directors, to the Registrar that its permit be revoked and its name removed from the Register.

(d) The Registrar shall notify the Professional Corporation by registered mail of the revocation of its permit.

#### 2.05 Changes in the Corporate Structure

(a) A Professional Corporation shall notify the Registrar in writing within 10 days of any change in its corporate structure, ownership or directors.

(b) Upon receipt of a notice pursuant to Clause 6.06(a), the Registrar may:

- (i) Continue the permit;
- (ii) Amend the permit to add or delete any terms or conditions; or
- (iii) Revoke the permit.

#### 2.06 Corporate Register

(a) The Registrar shall maintain a register of professional corporations which shall include:

- (i) the name of each professional corporation;
- (ii) the registered office and business addresses of each professional corporation;
- (iii) the name and address of each director of each professional corporation;
- (iv) the dates of issuance and renewal of permits; and
- (v) the conditions attached to each permit.

(b) The corporate register shall be open for inspection by all persons during normal office hours of the Institute.

#### 2.07 Review of the Registrar’s Decision

(a) A decision by the Registrar under this part may be reviewed on the application of an aggrieved person by giving notice in writing to the Institute that he/she wishes the matter reviewed by the Council.

(b) The application for review may state that the applicant wishes to appear in person before the Council and in such circumstance the applicant shall be given an opportunity to speak to the matter at the next Council meeting.

(c) The Registrar shall advise the applicant in writing of the Council’s decision regarding the review.

## 2.08 Professional Responsibility of Members

(a) All members who are directors of the Professional Corporation are responsible for the activities of the Corporation and may be subject to discipline for any breach of the Bylaws.

(b) Nothing contained in these Bylaws effects, modifies or limits any law applicable to the fiduciary, confidential and ethical relationships between a member and a person receiving the professional services of a member.

(c) The liability of a member to a person who receives services from the member is not affected by the fact that the services were provided by the member as an employee of, or on behalf of, a Professional Corporation.

(d) The relationship of a member to the Professional Corporation, whether as a shareholder, director, officer or employee thereof, does not affect, modify or diminish the application to him or her of the Act or the Bylaws of the Institute.

INTERPRETATION

### 1.01 Definitions

The following definitions shall apply to the following terms used in this By-law unless there is something in the subject matter or context inconsistent therewith:

(a) “**Act**” shall mean *The Certified Management Consultants Act* (Saskatchewan);

(b) “**Appointed Director**” shall mean the member of the Council of the Institute drawn from the elected members of Council and designated by Council as “Appointed Director”;

(c) “**Common Body of Knowledge**” shall mean the professional standards for management consulting;

(d) “**Council**” shall mean the council of the Institute;

(e) “**CMC**” shall mean the Certified Management Consultant designation as issued by the Institute;

(f) “**Director**” shall mean a member of the Council of the Institute;

(g) “**General Code**” means the Uniform Code of Professional Conduct of the Institute, as amended from time to time by Council;

(h) “**Institute**” shall mean the Institute of Certified Management Consultants of Saskatchewan continued pursuant to section 3 of the Act;

(i) “**Management Consultant**” shall mean a person qualified by background and experience whose principal activity is the practise of Management Consulting, who arrives at his/her recommendations through systematic analysis of facts and application of independent judgment based on specialized knowledge and skill;

(j) “**Management Consulting**” shall mean the service performed by independent and professionally qualified Management Consultants in investigation and identifying management problems related to the policy, organizational, operations, administrative and technical aspects of the principal institutions of our institute, in recommending appropriate solutions to these problems and helping to implement them;

(k) “**Member**” shall mean a member of the Institute who is in good standing;

(l) “**Member in Good Standing**” means a member of the Institute whose fees are not in arrears in accordance to these bylaws and who has not been suspended or expelled or struck from the register in accordance with these bylaws or the Act;

(m) “**Minister**” shall mean the member of the Executive Council to whom for the time being the administration of the Act is assigned;

(n) “**Proxy**” shall mean a completed and executed proxy in the form prescribed by the Institute by means of which a member has appointed a proxy holder to act on his/her behalf at a special or annual meeting of members;

(o) “**Registrar**” shall mean that person appointed as such by the Council pursuant to subsection 11(2) of the Act.

### 1.02 Headings

The division of this Bylaw into sections, subsections and paragraphs and the insertion of headings, sub-headings and index are for convenience of reference only and shall not affect the construction or interpretation of this Bylaw.

### 1.03 Bylaws

(a) Supersession

This By-law repeals and supersedes any previous By-laws of the Institute.

## MEMBERS

### 1.01 Classes and Conditions of Membership

There shall be the following classes of membership, with the following conditions attached thereto, namely:

- (a) Practising Members;
- (b) Non-Practising Members;
- (c) Fellow Members;
- (d) Life Members;
- (e) Prospective Members; and
- (f) Temporary Non-Resident Members.

Each having the following rights and conditions attached thereto:

(a) Practising Members - shall be any person who is engaged in the full time practise of management consulting and who has satisfied the following admission requirements:

- (i) Has complied with the Bylaws with respect to registration as a member as outlined in Section 2.04 “Membership Application Procedure”;

(ii) Has been engaged in the practise of Management Consulting for at least five (5) Practise Years of the preceding eight (8) Years including the Year immediately prior to admission as a Member. A "Year" shall mean any consecutive 12-month period and a "Practise Year" shall mean at least 1200 hours in the practise of Management Consulting in any consecutive 12-month period, provided that two or more Years may not overlap and two or more Practise Years may not overlap;

(iii) Holds a university degree or a professional designation from an institution recognized by council.

(iv) Has successfully completed the course of study and examination as approved by the Council of the Institute from time to time; and

(v) Has paid the prescribed fees.

Current Practising Members who qualified under previous course, practise year and education requirements will remain qualified.

(b) Non-Practising Members – shall be any person who was previously a practising member who is no longer engaged in the full time practise of Management Consulting and who has satisfied the following requirements:

(i) Has been a member in good standing for 12 months preceding application for non-practising status;

(ii) Has provided evidence of no longer being engaged in Management Consulting, and signs a declaration to this effect;

(iii) Has paid the prescribed fees for this category.

Non-Practising Members must advise the institute within 10 days if they return to Management Consulting and pay full regular dues beginning in the month their status changed. If transferring to another Institute, they must reinstate regular membership status prior to making application to transfer.

Non-Practising Members may not vote or hold office or serve as director. Non-Practising Members may continue to use the designation CMC and Certified Management Consultant and must adhere to the Institute's By-Laws.

(c) Fellow Members – shall mean any persons elected as a Fellow of the Institute by Council providing that he or she satisfies the following criteria at the time of election:

(i) Is a practising member (a CMC) at the time of the award;

(ii) Commands exceptional respect and merit in the performance of his/her practise AND at least ONE of the following:

(A) has provided exceptional services to the profession through work in or on behalf of the Institute and/or other provincial or regional Institutes of Certified Management Consultants in Canada; or

(B) has secured broad recognition as an outstanding professional in the practise of Management Consulting within and beyond the confines of the profession itself, and in so doing has brought credit to the profession; or

(C) has made a notable contribution to the community over several years which brings credit to the Management Consulting profession.

A Fellow shall be entitled to use the designation FCMC after his or her name and to receive special recognition under such conditions as Council may determine from time to time. The designation of Fellow will continue in effect if the Fellow moves to another institute with which the Institute has established reciprocity.

(d) Life Members – shall be any person who has satisfied all of the following criteria:

(i) Has attained the age of sixty (60) or more;

(ii) Is no longer engaged full time in the practise of Management Consulting (less than 400 hours per year), and signs a declaration to this effect;

(iii) Has been a practising member for ten (10) or more years; and

(iv) Has been nominated and approved by the Directors as a Life Member.

Life Members shall be exempted from paying membership fees.

Life Members must advise the institute within 10 days if they return to the full time practise of Management Consulting and pay full regular dues beginning in the month their status changed.

(e) Prospective Members – shall be any person who has applied for enrollment as a Prospective Member and who:

(i) Has paid the prescribed fees;

(ii) Is practising as a Management Consultant;

(iii) Has complied with the Bylaws with respect to registration as a member as outlined in Section 2.04 "Membership Application Procedure"; and

(iv) Has the requisite 5 years of management consulting experience as determined by the Council, or meets the education requirements as outlined under "Practising Members".

(f) Temporary Non-Resident Members - shall be any CMC who, while working full time in Saskatchewan for a period of less than one (1) year, and who is a member in good standing of another professional organization of Management Consultants which has an established agreement of reciprocity with the Institute. A Temporary Non-Resident Member shall be afforded all of the rights and privileges of a member of the Institute, except for any voting rights of the members provided under this Bylaw.

(g) Recognition – The Institute of Certified Management Consultants of Saskatchewan will recognize and grant equivalence of title to FELLOWS, LIFE MEMBERS and HONOURARY MEMBERS transferring from another Institute of Certified Management Consultants in Canada or from a foreign Institute with which the Institute has established reciprocity.

## 2.02 Registration of Members

Every member admitted as a member is to be registered in the class of member to which he/she is admitted as determined by Council.

## 2.03 Certificate of Membership

(a) Every certificate issued to members shall be in such a form as the board may, from time to time, determine.

(b) Each certificate of membership shall be signed by the president and the secretary or other authorized officer, and shall bear the seal of the Institute.

(c) Each certificate shall remain the property of the Institute and the Institute may demand the immediate return of the certificate held by a member:

(i) Upon the member's resignation;

(ii) Upon the member's relocation to an affiliated Institute;

(iii) Upon the member's suspension or expulsion from the Institute; or

(iv) When the member is struck from the Register.

**2.04 Membership Application Procedure**

(a) Every application for membership in the Institute shall be submitted in the form prescribed by Council and addressed to the Registrar at the Head Office of the Institute.

(b) Every applicant for membership in the Institute shall be sponsored in writing by two Certified Management Consultants who are members in good standing of the Institute.

(c) The Registrar of the Institute shall forward to the Membership Committee of Council all membership applications that are complete and in proper order.

(d) The Membership Committee shall be appointed from time to time by Council and shall be responsible for recommending to Council the qualification for admission of members and reviewing applications to determine if the qualifications are met as well as making such further inquiries as it deems appropriate and thereafter recommending to Council whether the applicant should be admitted as a member;

(e) Following examination of the recommendation from the Membership Committee, Council shall determine whether to admit the applicant as a member and shall communicate its decision in writing to the applicant;

(f) There shall be no obligation on Council to provide a refused applicant with reasons for its decision and all such decisions of Council shall be final and binding on the applicant subject to his/her right to re-apply for membership in the Institute one (1) year after Council's decision.

**2.05 Obligations of Members**

(a) The General Code is hereby adopted as a code of ethics applicable to the members;

(b) All members shall, at all times, comply with the General Code and the Bylaws of the Institute;

(c) All members who fail to comply with the General Code or the Bylaws of the Institute shall be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the Act and the rules, if any, of the Discipline Committee;

(d) All members shall, in practising their profession, exercise the knowledge, skill and judgment of a professionally competent management consultant and shall otherwise have due regard for the welfare of those served by the profession.

(e) The Professional Conduct Committee may investigate any complaint or incident of professional incompetence or misconduct of any member at any time.

(f) All members shall pay the appropriate annual membership dues for their membership category and such other initiation, examination, transfer or other fees as set by Council or by the Bylaws.

(g) Observance of the program of continuing professional development, as set out by Council from time to time, is a condition of maintaining membership.

**2.06 Meetings of Members**

(a) Types of Meetings

A special meeting of members may be convened by resolution of Council or a written demand of five percent of members or 10 members, whichever is greater, and such resolution or written demand shall specify the transaction of business to occur at the special meeting.

**DISCIPLINE****3.01 Publication of Findings**

(a) If any member has been expelled from the Institute or reinstated, the Registrar shall give notice thereof to every member and to the public.

(b) If any member has been suspended from the Institute, the Registrar shall give notice thereof to every member and to any other association or body or the public which, in the opinion of the Council, should be so informed.

(c) If the Discipline Committee or the Council has reprimanded any member, the Registrar shall send a summary of the decision, with the name of the member deleted, to every member and to any association or body, which in the opinion of the council, should also be informed. This summary may also be published on the Institute's website as a means of educating members and the public.

**3.02 Continuance of Membership**

(a) Any person, who is the subject of an investigation or has been named in a complaint pursuant to Section 22 of the Act, remains a member, for the purpose of any outstanding or subsequent discipline proceedings, until the discipline proceedings regarding him or her have been completed, whether or not the person has been suspended, expelled or struck from the register for any reason.

**3.03 Complaints**

(a) Where Council receives a complaint it will immediately be turned over to the Registrar without any review or discussion by Council.

(b) Where the Registrar is in receipt of a complaint alleging that a member is guilty of professional misconduct or professional incompetence, the Registrar shall:

(i) acknowledge receipt of the complaint in writing to the complainant; and

(ii) forward the complaint and a copy of the acknowledgement to the chair of the Professional Conduct Committee.

(c) The Professional Conduct Committee shall review the complaint and investigate it by taking any steps it considers necessary, including but not limited to:

(i) interviewing the complainant and advising the complainant of his/her right to provide additional relevant documentary evidence;

(ii) interviewing the member;

(iii) giving the member an opportunity to provide a written response within thirty (30) days;

(iv) interviewing other individuals as required;

(v) reviewing relevant documents and other evidence including client files and incident reports.

(d) Upon completion of its investigation, the professional conduct committee shall provide a report, in writing, to the discipline committee recommending one of the following options:

(i) That no further action be taken with respect to the matter under investigation; or

(ii) That the discipline committee hear and determine the formal complaint set out in the report.

The Professional Conduct Committee shall provide, or cause the registrar to provide, a copy of the written report to:

- (i) the Council;
- (ii) The person, if any, who made the complaint; and
- (iii) The member whose conduct is the subject of the complaint.

If, at the conclusion of its investigation, the Committee finds there is insufficient evidence to refer a matter to the Discipline Committee but investigation tends to show undesirable practise, the Professional Conduct Committee may issue a letter(s) of guidance for the purpose of giving confidential feedback or suggestions in order to improve consulting practise.

(e) A report signed by a majority of the Professional Conduct Committee is the decision of that Committee.

(f) Where a report from the Professional Conduct Committee recommends that the Discipline Committee hear and determine a formal complaint:

(i) Pursuant to Section 24 of the Act, the Registrar at least fourteen (14) days before the date that the Discipline Committee is to sit:

(A) shall provide to the member whose conduct is the subject of the hearing a copy of the investigation report, including the formal complaint, and copies of all documentary evidence considered; and

(B) serve notice on the member whose conduct is the subject of the hearing of the date, time and place of the hearing.

(ii) The Discipline Committee shall hear the complaint in accordance to with section 24 of the Act and shall determine whether or not the member is guilty of professional misconduct or professional incompetence as expressed in Section 26, 27 of the Act.

(g) Where the Discipline Committee finds a member guilty of professional misconduct or professional incompetence, it may make one or more of the following orders:

(i) That the member be expelled from the Institute and that the member's name be struck from the register;

(ii) That the member be suspended from the Institute for a specified period;

(iii) That the member be suspended pending the satisfaction and completion of any conditions specified in the order;

(iv) That the member may continue to practise only under conditions specified in the order, which may include, but are not restricted to, an order that the member:

(A) not do specified types of work;

(B) successfully complete specified classes or courses of instruction;

(C) obtain medical treatment, counseling or both.

(v) That the member be reprimanded;

(vi) That the member pay to the Institute, a fine in a specified amount not exceeding \$2,000 within a fixed period;

(vii) That the member pay the costs of the investigation and the hearing into the member's conduct and related costs, including the expenses of the Professional Conduct Committee and the Discipline Committee and costs of legal services and witnesses.

Where a member fails to make payment in accordance with an order, that member's registration can be suspended.

(h) The Member, within thirty (30) days after receipt of the Discipline Committee's decision, may appeal to the Council, in writing, in accordance with s.31 of the Act the severity of the penalty and/or costs assessed.

(i) The Professional Conduct Committee shall:

(i) Monitor the member's compliance with the decision of the Discipline Committee;

(ii) Upon confirmation of compliance, provide a report and relevant documents to the Registrar; and

(iii) In the event of non-compliance with the decision of the Discipline Committee, such non-compliance shall be deemed to constitute a new complaint pursuant to this section, prepare and deliver a written report, signed by a majority of the Professional Conduct Committee members, to the Discipline Committee recommending that the Discipline Committee hear the new complaint.

(j) A member who appears in person or by counsel before the Discipline Committee is deemed to have received proper notice unless the appearance is for the purpose of challenging the notice.

## DIRECTORS

### 4.01 Remuneration

(a) Directors shall receive no remuneration for acting in their capacity as Directors of the Institute. Directors may be paid such amounts of their out of pocket expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties as Directors as may be determined by Council from time to time.

## UNIFORM CODE OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

In this part of the Bylaws, where the term "Member" or "Members" is used, it refers to Regular Members, Life Members, Fellows, Non-Practising and Prospective Members.

The purpose of the Uniform Code of Professional Conduct (the "Code") is to identify those professional obligations that serve to protect the public in general, the client in particular, and the reputation of the profession. The Code also clearly identifies the Institute's expectations of Members with respect to the profession and to other Members of the Institute.

### 5.01 Responsibilities to the Public

(a) Legal

(i) Members shall be aware of, and comply with, applicable legislation and laws at all times.

(ii) Members shall not cause any person or persons to contravene applicable legislation or laws at any time.

(iii) Members shall not serve or act on behalf of any person or persons who cause(s) or will cause them to contravene applicable legislation or laws at any time.

(b) Representation

(i) Members shall not make public statements on behalf of the Institute or its Members unless authorized to do so.

(ii) Members asked by another person or party to make a representation on behalf of Institute or its Members shall, as appropriate, either:

(A) refer the request to a designated spokesperson(s) of the Institute; or

(B) ask the Institute for authorization.

(iii) Members who wish to speak on behalf of the Institute or its Members shall secure the proper authorization before doing so.

(c) Public Protection

(i) Given the public's right to confidence in Members (individually and collectively), any actions that mitigate such trust will be considered unbecoming, including:

- (A) violation of any applicable legislation or laws;
- (B) breach of the Uniform Code of Professional Conduct; and
- (C) actions inside or outside of the context of consulting that may be, or may be perceived to be, detrimental to the profession.

(ii) Members shall ensure that their behaviour does not threaten their responsibility to the public interest, in perception or reality.

**5.02 Responsibilities to the Profession**

(a) Knowledge

Members shall maintain their knowledge and understanding of the Uniform Code of Professional Conduct and the Common Body of Knowledge, including any amendments or updates

Members shall develop their skills and knowledge beyond the fundamentals described in the Common Body of Knowledge, particularly in their area(s) of preferred practise, to a level that is consistent with the needs of their clients and comparable to the services provided by other consultants in the same field.

(b) Self Discipline

(i) Members shall strive to discipline themselves to maintain the high standards of professional and ethical practise reflected in the Uniform Code of Professional Conduct.

(ii) Given that Members have the right to trust that other Members will conduct themselves appropriately, any actions which mitigate that trust will be considered unbecoming to the profession.

(iii) Members who behave in a manner unbecoming to the profession are subject to being reported to the Institute by other Members.

(iv) Members shall report to the Institute, and/or encourage those clients or members of the public affected to so report, the behaviour of any Member they perceive to be seriously and/or persistently unbecoming to the profession.

(c) Responsibilities for Others

(i) In addition to being responsible for their own advice and actions, Members shall ensure that any and all management consultants who work under their leadership on consulting assignments, be those consultants Members or not, understand and comply with the Uniform Code of Professional Conduct.

(ii) Such management consultants include the Member's peers, employees and/or subcontracted associates.

(iii) Members shall be responsible for any breach of the Uniform Code of Professional conduct reported to the Institute with respect to any Member of his or her consulting team and will be liable to the same actions and consequences that would apply if the Member alone failed to comply with the Uniform Code of Professional Conduct where it is determined that the Member was aware, or ought to have been aware, of the breach.

(d) Image

(i) Members shall ensure that their behaviour is consistent with and reinforces a positive public image of the profession.

(ii) Members shall ensure that their behaviour does not threaten their responsibility to the public interest, in perception or reality.

(iii) Members shall ensure that their activities will not conflict or be seen to conflict with their integrity, objectivity or independence.

(iv) Members shall ensure that their physical and emotional state is consistent with the requirements of client work, particularly when developing or providing professional advice.

(v) Members shall ensure that all their business affairs are above reproach and that their business affairs as consultants and otherwise shall comply with all applicable legislation and laws, as well as the Uniform Code of Professional Conduct. Additionally, Members' business affairs shall not be, or be perceived to be, detrimental to the profession.

**5.03 Review of a Member's Work**

(a) A Member's work shall be deemed to be under critical review if a client, or the client's representative or advisor, asks another Member to review and comment on any of the Member's written reports, memoranda or working files.

(b) Members shall not accept a request to conduct a review where they have a conflict of interest.

(c) Members shall inform other Members in writing whose work they have been asked to review.

(d) The results of such a review shall be communicated with the Member unless such discussion would be deemed to jeopardize client confidentiality.

(e) At the request of the Discipline Committee, the Institute may request one or more Members to review the work of another. In such cases, the Discipline Committee shall establish terms of reference for the review.

**5.04 Responsibilities to the Client**

(a) (i) Members shall recognize the interests of the client organization, overall, as paramount in every assignment.

(ii) Members shall not promote services, accept engagements, conduct work or provide advice to clients that is in any way to the Member's advantage or potential advantage while to the client's, or the public's, disadvantage or potential disadvantage.

(iii) Members shall not accept or conduct work that is in the interest of any individual or group within the client organization if the work would, in any way, be detrimental or not serve the best interests of the overall organization.

(iv) Members shall not accept or conduct work that is in the interest of any individual or group external to the client organization if the work would, in any way, be detrimental or not serve the best interests of the overall organization.

(v) Members shall always provide objective and independent advice. Members must not allow their objectivity and independence to be influenced by any individual or group either within or external to the client organization.

(vi) Members shall not guarantee specific quantitative results that are beyond their direct control.

(vii) Members shall respond to client requests for quantification of intended benefits or results, or for risk-sharing approaches where the total fees for the member will be related to the benefits or results realized, by specifying as a minimum:

- (A) the client's responsibilities related to the intended benefits or results;
- (B) identifying the risks and assumptions associated with realizing the intended benefits or results;
- (C) identifying the measures to be used; and,
- (D) clearly communicating these elements to the client.

(b) Business Development

(i) Subject to 5.03(a), members shall not criticize other Members, either directly or indirectly, in an attempt to secure business or in any other aspect of their professional work.

(ii) Members shall not participate in misleading advertising, pressure tactics, or other unprofessional methods of obtaining business.

(c) Competence

(i) Members shall not present themselves as qualified to conduct an assignment without having both the relevant education and practical experience to do so. Members shall not undertake assignments for which they do not have relevant qualifications, including education and experience, even if a client, aware of this limitation, specifically request that they do so.

(ii) Members shall describe how their qualifications will be applied in the engagement as well as how those of each member of the consulting team will be applied.

(iii) Members shall also describe their role in the engagement and the role of each member of the consulting team.

(d) Informed Client

(i) Members shall confirm in writing the terms of reference for an assignment.

(ii) Written terms of reference shall confirm:

- (A) assignment objectives;
- (B) steps, milestones and deliverables in the proposed work plan;
- (C) timeline of steps, milestones, deliverables and completion date;
- (D) names, relevant qualifications and role of each consultant proposed;
- (E) fees; and,
- (F) billing arrangements, including how all expenses, disbursements and applicable taxes will be handled.

(iii) Members shall not begin an assignment until the written terms of reference have been accepted by the client.

(e) Fee Arrangements

(i) Members shall confirm in writing the budget and billing arrangements related to professional fees, expenses, disbursements and applicable taxes.

(ii) Should the terms of reference change during the course of the assignment, Members shall ensure that any corresponding impact on fees, expenses, disbursements, taxes or billing arrangements are communicated to the client and agreed to in writing.

(iii) Members shall not permit, for budget or time management purposes, a reduction in consulting time or in senior consulting involvement in an assignment if, as a result, the quality of service will be below that described in the terms of reference.

(iv) Members shall not undertake assignments of a scale or magnitude where the proposed fee arrangements are such that they represent a substantial business risk for the client.

(f) Conflict

(i) Members shall not accept assignments with their clients' competitors or with other organizations with interests that compete with their clients', without the permission of all the organizations involved.

(ii) Members shall disclose to a client, or prospective client, any personal, professional or other business interests that may jeopardize the client's confidence in their integrity or objectivity or their capacity to provide independent judgment

(iii) Members shall follow the instructions of a client, within applicable legislation, laws and the Uniform Code of Professional Conduct, with regard to the client's interests or, where this is not possible, Members shall withdraw from the assignment.

(iv) Members shall not recruit to their own firm, or refer to other firms, any employee of a client unless the client has been informed and has granted endorsement in advance.

(g) Confidentiality

(i) Members shall not disclose any confidential client information without the specific consent of the client.

(ii) Members shall store the information in such a fashion that through diligence and normally accepted administrative practises it is possible to safeguard the information at all times.

(iii) Members must treat any and all information obtained from a client as confidential unless otherwise directed by the client. This rule does not apply to information that can be obtained through public inquiry.

(iv) Upon terminating an assignment, Members shall offer to return to the client any and all material pertaining to the engagement.

(v) If confidential client information that has been obtained by a Member is, at any point in time, exposed to individuals beyond the Member's direct authority to control, the Member shall inform the client immediately and take appropriate action to protect the client's interests.

(vi) Members shall encourage clients to classify sensitive information and, if at all possible, shall refrain from taking possession of sensitive information.

(vii) Members shall keep the client informed as to the location and condition of storage of any and all information that has been deemed to be confidential.

(viii) Members shall refrain from making public statements that may directly or indirectly lead to the disclosure of confidential client information.

(ix) The rules pertaining to confidential client information shall not apply to exchange of information with a recognized investigative body or compliance with a validly issued and enforceable subpoena and summons.

(h) Objectivity

(i) In advance of undertaking assignments, Members shall ensure that they do not accept any terms or conditions that may affect their objectivity.

(ii) When events or circumstances arise that affect a Member's objectivity, or perceived objectivity, the Member shall either:

(A) discuss and attempt to rectify the matter with the client immediately; or

(B) withdraw from the assignment.
