- Fund and implement infrastructure required for growth;
- Get borrowing in place; and
- Carry out responsibilities required by statute.

Meeting the challenges of growth requires a dedicated and professional municipal administration. It requires an administration that understands its strengths as well as its limitations. Municipalities require the human, technical and mechanical resources to operate on a daily basis and support council decisions with respect to planning for growth.
