The Regulations printed in this Part of the Gazette form a part of *The Revised Regulations of Saskatchewan* which are being compiled over the next few years. This part contains revised regulations and amendments to revised regulations. Amendments to existing regulations, which are not yet revised, are printed in Part III.

CHAPTER D-24.1 REG 5

The Department of Urban Affairs Act

Section 20

Order in Council 73/85, dated January 23, 1985.

(Filed January 23, 1985)

ORDER

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council, on the recommendation of the Minister of Urban Affairs, pursuant to section 20 of *The Department of Urban Affairs Act*, makes *The Municipal Winter Works Program Regulations* in accordance with the attached Schedule.

Power to establish program

3(1) The minister may establish a program, under the jurisdiction of the department, to create or expand opportunities for jobs in Saskatchewan.

(2) The minister may, singularly or jointly with the Government of Canada, pay grants in accordance with these regulations to municipalities.

Director

4(1) The minister may appoint a person to be the director of the program and that person is responsible for the administration of the program.

(2) The minister may designate the director as the executive officer or co-director of any joint Government of Canada-Province of Saskatchewan job creation program.

Agreements with Government of Canada

5 The minister may enter into agreements with the Government of Canada respecting job creation programs.

Agreements with municipalities

6 To be eligible for a grant, a municipality shall enter into an agreement with the minister, or the director on behalf of the minister, setting out the terms and conditions of its participation in the program and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, shall, in accordance with these regulations, set out the project, the wage payable to the employment candidate, the amount of the grant payable to the municipality for wage subsidies and the period during which the subsidy is payable.

Eligible projects

7 To qualify as a project, each project is to create jobs that:

(a) are new jobs created during the period commencing on January 1, 1985 and ending on February 15, 1985 that:

(i) could not have been created without the assistance provided pursuant to the program; and

(ii) in the opinion of the director, would not normally be created by the municipality during that period;

(b) do not displace any current employees by resulting in:

(i) the lay off of such an employee in another part of the municipality's operation; or

(ii) the loss of a job by such an employee at any time during the term of the project because the work under the project displaces the work being done by that employee;

(c) are full time or provide employment for at least 32 hours per week; and

(d) provide employment for a period of at least four weeks but that period is not to extend beyond June 30, 1985;

(e) in the opinion of the director, provide a demonstrable economic or social benefit to the municipality.

8 To be eligible for grants pursuant to these regulations, a municipality shall: Eligibility of municipality

- (a) create a job in accordance with section 7; and
- (b) satisfy the director that the project does not create a need for a subsidy from the provincial or federal government for a period longer than the period for which the municipality will be entitled to a subsidy.

9(1) Every person who: Employment candidates

- (a) is legally entitled to work in Canada; and
- (b) is unemployed, or self-employed, and available for full-time employment;

is eligible as an employment candidate.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), a municipality may, in hiring persons, give priority to persons who were previously its employees but who were laid off.

10 Notwithstanding any other provision of these regulations and where he considers it to be advisable, the director may exempt any person who wishes to be an employment candidate from any requirement of these regulations. Exemptions

11(1) Where a municipality applies for a grant, it shall make its application to the director in the form approved by the director. Application by municipality

- (2) Applications pursuant to subsection (1) are to contain:
- (a) the name of the municipality or, in the case of a joint project, the names of the municipalities;
 - (b) the type, duration and location of each job comprising the project;
 - (c) the wage and share of the wage and other costs that the municipality will pay;
 - (d) any other costs related to the project; and
 - (e) any other information that the director may require.

12(1) When the decision of the minister, or the director on behalf of the minister, is made to approve or reject an application by a municipality, the minister or director shall notify the municipality of the decision. Approval

(2) The approval of a project is effective on the execution of an agreement pursuant to section 6 with the municipality that will carry out the project.

(3) No grant is payable to a municipality until the project which is the subject of the application is approved in accordance with these regulations.

(4) Where a project is approved after January 1, 1985, the approval may be made retroactive to any date between January 1, 1985 and February 15, 1985 and the grant payable in respect of that project is to be calculated on and from the date that the approval is effective if the job was created on that date.

Amount of grant

13(1) The subsidy of wages is \$4.25 for each hour worked by each employment candidate on a project.

(2) The total amount of grants payable to each municipality as a subsidy is the greater of:

(a) \$5 per capita based on the population of the municipality as determined by the most recent census taken pursuant to the *Statistics Act* (Canada), as amended from time to time; or

(b) \$10,000.

(3) Notwithstanding subsection (2), where two or more municipalities undertake a joint project, any municipality that is a party to that project may assign all or any part of a grant payable to that municipality to any other municipality that is a party to that project.

Schedule of payments

14(1) Payments of grants to municipalities are to be made in accordance with a schedule approved by the director and contained in every agreement pursuant to section 6.

(2) Where any schedule mentioned in subsection (1) is amended, the amending schedule is to form part of the affected agreement made pursuant to section 6.

Notice of changes re project

15(1) The municipality shall notify the director immediately if:

(a) any employee ceases employment during the term of the project;

(b) the project is discontinued;

(c) the project is completed prior to the expiration of the period for which the subsidy is being paid;

(d) any changes to the project occur that may affect the municipality's capacity to conclude the project as outlined in the agreement.

(2) The director may, on notification pursuant to subsection (1), terminate or amend any agreement entered into pursuant to section 6 respecting the project affected, as he considers advisable, and shall provide written notification to the municipality of the termination or amendment.

Termination of agreement with municipality

16(1) The minister, or the director on behalf of the minister, may terminate any agreement with a municipality entered into

pursuant to section 6 for non-compliance with any terms or conditions of the agreement or these regulations.

(2) Written notice of the termination of any agreement pursuant to section 6 is to be given to the municipality affected.

(3) The minister, or the director on behalf of the minister, may, at the request of a municipality, terminate any agreement with the municipality entered into pursuant to section 6.

17 Every municipality shall maintain books and records that, to the satisfaction of the director, convey a clear and accurate account of the operation of the project and account for all funds received pursuant to these regulations.

Municipality to maintain records

18 As a condition of receiving a grant, a municipality shall:

Duties of municipality

(a) submit to the director:

(i) any interim verification of wages and other expenditures concerning the project that the director may require;

(ii) on completion of the project, a record of wages and other expenditures incurred in connection with that project; and

(iii) any other information relevant to the wages and other expenditures related to the project that the director may require;

(b) permit any person designated by the minister or the director to audit any books and records with respect to the project;

(c) permit any person designated by the minister or the director to enter or to have access to records for the purpose of verifying that the jobs are being filled and that the project is in compliance with the terms and conditions specified for the project in the agreement entered into pursuant to section 6 and in these regulations.

19(1) Any municipality may, with respect to any jobs which form a project in respect of which an agreement has been entered into pursuant to section 6, enter into a contract with any person to employ individuals to carry out those jobs in accordance with these regulations.

Power of municipality to subcontract

(2) Where a municipality enters into a contract pursuant to subsection (1):

(a) the employees of the person with whom the municipality has contracted are deemed to be employees of the municipality for the purposes of these regulations; and

(b) the municipality shall, with respect to those employees, certify the pay-roll records of the person it has

contracted with prior to submitting those records as verification of wages for the purposes of these regulations.

Refund **20** Every municipality shall return to the department any monies not spent for the purposes approved in the agreement entered into pursuant to section 6 and any monies unspent on termination of the project after all obligations related to the purposes of the subsidy provided have been met.

Transfer of funds **21** Subject to section 5, the minister may authorize the payment of funds to the Government of Canada for the purpose of providing the provincial share of subsidies payable in connection with a joint Government of Canada-Province of Saskatchewan job creation program established pursuant to these regulations.

Overpayment **22** Where an overpayment to a municipality or balance of monies unspent results for any reason and is not returned to the department by the municipality, the amount of the overpayment or unspent monies may be recovered as a debt due to Her Majesty in right of Saskatchewan or by deducting the amount of the debt from future grant payments or payments to that municipality from other monies payable by the department or the Department of Rural Development to the municipality.

Coming into force **23** These regulations come into force on the day on which they are filed with the Registrar of Regulations.

The Wildlife Act

Section 63

Order in Council 74/85, dated January 23, 1985.

ORDER

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council, on the recommendation of the Minister of Parks and Renewable Resources, pursuant to section 63 of *The Wildlife Act*, makes *The Wildlife Amendment Regulations, 1985* in accordance with the attached Schedule.

SCHEDULE

1 These regulations may be cited as *The Wildlife Amendment Regulations, 1985*. Title

2 *The Wildlife Regulations, 1981* are amended in the manner set forth in these regulations. R.R.S. c.W-13.1 Reg 1

3 Section 4 is repealed and the following substituted: New section 4

"4(1) Subject to the other provisions of these regulations, outside of game preserves, wildlife refuges, wildlife management units, regional parks, provincial parks, protected areas or recreation sites, any person may, without a licence, hunt: Permitted hunting

- (a) reptilia (snakes);
- (b) amphibia (frogs and salamanders);
- (c) lagomorpha (rabbits);

- (d) insectivora (shrews);
- (e) chiroptera (bats);
- (f) rodentia (mice and rats), other than red squirrels, muskrats, black-tailed prairie dogs and, subject to subsection (2), beavers;
- (g) skunks and raccoons; and
- (h) crows, magpies, cowbirds, blackbirds, grackles, starlings, English sparrows and common pigeons (rock doves).

“(2) Subject to the other provisions of these regulations, outside of game preserves, wildlife refuges, wildlife management units, regional parks, provincial parks, protected areas or recreation sites, any person may, without a licence, hunt:

- (a) bears in Wildlife Management Zones 1 to 41 and 44 to 47;
- (b) beavers in the rural municipalities listed in Table 6 of the Appendix excluding those portions that are fur conservation areas”.
