## **Overview of Travel and Objectives**

Minister Eyre travelled to Toronto, ON to attend the world's premier mining convention (PDAC) and connect with mining industry stakeholders.

## **Travel Activity:**

At PDAC, Ministry of Energy and Resource officials staffed the Government of Saskatchewan Trade Show Exchange booth throughout the week (Feb. 29-Mar 4) to connect with convention attendees and promote Saskatchewan's mining interests.

Minister Eyre's travel occurred between March 2-4 and provided an opportunity to host bilateral meetings with:

The meetings allowed Minister Eyre to discuss issues within the mining sector as well as promote Saskatchewan's mining interests, including highlighting government initiatives to increase our competitiveness and fulfill goals outlined in our new Growth Plan. Meetings with other government officials and Ministers also provided a forum to discuss areas of mutual concern regarding mineral policy and development.

There was an opportunity to meet with TD Bank to discuss and promote Saskatchewan's investment climate in the mining and oil and gas sector. The conversation included discussion of the province's natural resource incentive programs.

The Minister also attended and delivered remarks at the Saskatchewan Reception, co-hosted by the Saskatchewan Mining Association, and networked with mining industry partners.

At the convention, the Minister and Chief Geologist toured the trade show floor to meet with various junior mining companies in Saskatchewan, as well as larger players in the mining industry doing work in Saskatchewan.

The Minister and officials also hosted the annual round table breakfast of mining sector players, which provided a forum for companies to speak to individual and collective concerns and issues.
