Minister Ottenbreit travelled to Toronto to co-chair the Council of Ministers Responsible for Transportation and Highways Safety meeting. The purpose of the meeting was to improve the effectiveness and reliability of the Canadian supply chain and to discuss opportunities to improve vehicle safety.

Travel Activity:

- In the meeting, Minister Ottenbreit and Minister Mulroney led a discussion recommending the creation of a task force for the Pan-Canadian Trade Corridor Initiative, which was agreed to and moved forward. Minister Ottenbreit also discussed blockades on railways and the importance of ensuring the reliability of the national rail system.
