Overview of Travel and Objectives

Minister Harrison travelled to Edmonton to participate in the Munk School of Global Affairs & Public Policy Forum on the Future of the Federation and to meet with Deputy Prime Minister Chrystia Freeland.

Travel Activity:

Minister Harrison raised the following with Deputy Prime Minister Freeland:

- The need for the federal government to cancel its carbon tax;
- The need to negotiate a new equalization formula that is fair to Saskatchewan; and,
- A commitment for the federal government to develop a plan to ensure Saskatchewan can get its exports to international markets.

The Munk School of Global Affairs and Public Policy convened a group of twenty policy experts and former civil servants for a one-day workshop on the future of the Canadian Federation. Minister Harrison represented the Government of Saskatchewan.
