Introduction

To assist motorists in locating Regional Parks in the province, the Ministry may install directional signs at qualifying locations in advance of the park access.

Policy

At the request of an applicable Regional Park, the Ministry may install the IS-63 or IS-64 directional signs in advance of the Regional Park access.

Application

Application will be made to the Ministry on a standard application form for evaluation. This form can be found in Roadside Management Manual, Part II (RSMM) 1110-40 or 1170 and on the Ministry's website.

Eligibility

The Regional Park must be a member in good standing of the Saskatchewan Regional Parks Association.

In order for a Regional Park to be eligible for signing, it must meet the following criteria:

- The park will be open to the general public for recreational or cultural activities. The park will have staff members available to provide services to the general public.
- The park will be open to the general public from at least 9:00 a.m. to dusk, seven days a week between Victoria Day and Labour Day weekend with the exception of Historic Parks where public access may be restricted.
- When the park is solely a winter park the facilities will be open from at least 10:00 a.m. to dusk, six days a week, during the winter recreation season.

The advance sign assembly will consist of:

- The Regional Park symbol on the left side of a sign panel that;
 - Names the park, and provides either;
 - Next Left/Right Directional information, if applicable; or displays the distance to the nearest access road from the sign assembly, to the nearest kilometre. The Advance sign should be installed two kilometres in advance of the access when practical.
- A maximum of two full rows of symbols, selected by the applicant from an approved list, to be attached below the Advance Sign. Blanks will be used to maintain an overall symmetrical appearance of the installation.
- A Closed tab, if the park is not operational for a full 12 month period. Placement of the tab will be the responsibility of the park.

Cost**Advance Signing**

The cost of the Advance Sign for a rural Regional Park will be borne by MHI.

The cost of the Advance Sign for an urban Regional Park will be borne by the community.

The cost of symbols to be added to the Advance Sign requested by the park will be as described in the RSMM Part II Sign Pricing Policy 1050-10.

The cost of blank symbols required to complete a row will be borne by MHI. Additional information on Advance Park Signing costs is located in RSMM 1170 and on the Ministry's website.

Sign Removal

Signs may be removed if, in the opinion of the Ministry, the conditions of the policy are not being met.

Modifications/Relocation

If modifications are requested after installation, the applicant will be charged a cost as described in the Roadside Management Manual (RSMM) Part II Sign Pricing Policy 1050-10. If relocation is requested, the applicant will be charged the Ministry's actual relocation cost.
