MINISTER'S ORDER/ARRÊTÉ MINISTÉRIEL***The Municipalities Act***

[section 52.1]

RESTRUCTURING OF THE VILLAGE OF DUFF

Whereas:

Subsections 52.1(1) and (2) and subclause 61(2)(c)(iii) of *The Municipalities Act* provide that:

“52.1(1) The council of a municipality shall request the minister to order a restructuring of a municipality pursuant to subclause 61(2)(c)(iii) or a change in status of the municipality pursuant to clause 61(2)(d) if:

- (a) for two or more consecutive years, the municipality has not complied with the prescribed requirements of this Act or regulations or any other Act or regulations made pursuant to the other Act;
- (b) the municipality has been notified of its non-compliance pursuant to clause (a) and is unable to demonstrate compliance to the satisfaction of the minister with the matters set out in the notice within the period indicated in the notice; and
- (c) for a municipality other than a rural municipality, the municipality no longer meets the prescribed minimum population for two consecutive censuses as set out in this Act or the regulations.

“(2) If a council does not make the request or demonstrate compliance in the period indicated in the notice mentioned in clause (1)(b), the minister shall, after completing any consultations that the minister considers appropriate with affected municipalities, make an order pursuant to subclause 61(2)(c)(iii) or clause 61(2)(d)”.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 1** The Village of Duff (Village) is restructured by including the Village into the Rural Municipality of Stanley No. 215 (RM).
- 2** The former Village is designated as a “Special Service Area” (SSA) for the purpose of assigning different tax rates, applying different tax tools and providing different service levels.
- 3** The boundary of the designated SSA is consistent with the former Village boundaries and is described as:
Lying within Township 22, Range 8, West of the Second Meridian lying south of the north-westerly limit of the right-of-way and station grounds of the Canadian National Railways, in the Province of Saskatchewan.
- 4** The RM shall allocate to separate general ledger accounts all revenues collected for and on behalf of the SSA and all expenses paid for and on behalf of the SSA.
- 5** A statement of revenues and expenditures of the SSA shall be presented to council annually and at any additional time(s) requested by council.
- 6** The terms and conditions of the restructuring agreement entered into by the Village and the RM are confirmed as follows:

Opening Statements

- (1) This agreement has been entered into by the Village of Duff (Village) and the Rural Municipality of Stanley No. 215 (RM) for the purpose of the inclusion.

Restructuring Principles

- (2) All parties agree to respectfully work together to negotiate sustainable, long-range mutual benefits to their citizens now and in the future.
- (3) Where one municipality has concerns on a matter, the other municipality will negotiate in good faith and work cooperatively toward addressing the concern in this agreement.

Establishment of SSA

(4) The lands within the former Village shall be designated as a SSA for the purposes of assigning different tax rates and/or the application of tax tools and providing different service levels.

(5) The designated SSA shall be within the boundaries of the former Village.

Governance

(6) A municipal council consisting of a reeve and 6 councillors will govern the RM.

(7) All bylaws and resolutions in force in the Village continue in force for one year after the date of inclusion or until they are sooner repealed or others are made in their place.

(8) The Council of the RM agrees to establish a committee, namely the SSA of Duff Advisory Committee, and appoint at least three representatives for the term of this agreement. The sole purpose of this committee is to provide advice to council on matters relating to the SSA designated above. A representative from the SSA of Duff Advisory Committee may be present when required at the RM regularly scheduled monthly council meetings to discuss SSA matters. The RM will pay remuneration to committee members from the SSA revenue, and may amend, add or modify any function of this committee as deemed necessary, by resolution.

(9) The SSA of Duff Advisory Committee agrees to annually provide recommendations to the RM Council regarding the SSA's portion of administrative costs.

Disposition of Assets

(10) The assets and liabilities of the Village shall become the assets and liabilities of the RM upon inclusion of the Village.

(11) Cash assets remaining subsequent to settlement of the Village assets and liabilities will be set aside for provision of services and/or benefits within the former Village.

(12) All grants received by the RM in recognition of the former Village will be set aside for provision of services and/or benefits within the former Village.

Service Delivery

(13) All expenditures associated with service delivery within the SSA shall be allocated to the SSA accounts.

(14) The RM will ensure that fire protection services are inclusive and consistent with fire protection service agreements previously in the Village. The RM may amend and modified as deemed necessary.

(15) The RM will maintain the water and wastewater systems in the former Village and expense to the SSA ledger accounts. The RM may amend and modify as deemed necessary.

(16) The RM will continue to contract the following services:

- (a) Grass cutting – Grant Mann (municipal equipment);
- (b) Grass cutting – Tracey Schuman, Nancy Bieber, Louise Thompson (contractor owned equipment);
- (c) Water and Wastewater utility operations – Louise Thompson and Donald Bieber;
- (d) Snow removal – Bruce Keller (contractor owned equipment);
- (e) The RM may amend and modify as deemed necessary.

(17) The RM will provide street maintenance within the boundaries of the former Village at the RM Custom Work Rates.

(18) The RM will continue to work with the cemetery committee regarding the operations including maintenance and donations. The RM may amend and modify as deemed necessary.

(19) The RM ensures the closure of the Duff landfill in accordance with provincial legislation and expense to the SSA.

(20) The joint service agreement in place with the RM and Village for Garbage and Recycling Bins will continue. The RM may amend and modify as deemed necessary.

Integration of Administration

(21) The administrator for the Village will not continue as an employee of the RM.

Amendments

(22) This agreement may be amended:

- (a) by the agreement of the councils which are signatories to the agreement, prior to the application being forwarded to the Minister for approval; and/or
- (b) by the council of the RM after a two-year period from the effective date of the Minister's Order, when an amendment is in the best interest of the ratepayers of the former Village and the RM.

Effective Date

(23) This agreement will come into effect on the date of inclusion as set out in the Minister's Order.

7 The restructuring will take effect on January 1, 2022.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT:

8 WAYNE ZERFF of Regina, Saskatchewan, be appointed as a transition official to work with the Village administrator to facilitate the transition of the Village into the RM in accordance with the requirements of the Ministry of Government Relations (ministry), and this Order including:

- (a) the authority to access all municipal property, including any private premises where municipal records are located or stored, for the purpose of accessing and reviewing municipal records. "Municipal records" include any written, recorded or electronic record;
- (b) the authority to remove municipal records from any place where they are located or stored for the purpose of reviewing the record;
- (c) the authority to prepare or assist in the preparation of all documents and accounts as outlined by the ministry or required for the final audit on behalf of the Village;
- (d) the authority to contact any ministry, crown, agency, business or other person to request or provide information; and
- (e) the authority to sign documents and approve payments if the administrator is unable to act.

9 The appointment of Wayne Zerff is in effect for the period between the signing of this Order and no later than 30 days after the effective date of the restructuring of the Village.

10 Remuneration for Wayne Zerff will be paid at a rate of \$60.00 per hour of work, in addition to 48.50 cents per kilometre and reimbursement of related miscellaneous expenses.

11 Remuneration for Wayne Zerff shall be paid by the RM on approval of the supervising municipal advisor, after the effective date of the restructuring. The RM shall expense any payments to Wayne Zerff from the SSA ledger accounts.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT:

12 VERN PALMER of Buena Vista, Saskatchewan, be appointed to adjust and settle the assets and liabilities of the former Village in accordance with legislation, requirements of the ministry, the restructuring agreement and this Order, including:

- (a) the allocation of any grants, surplus funds and reserves; and
- (b) the manner of dealing with liabilities through:
 - (i) the sale of, the disposition of and conversion into money of sufficient assets to satisfy the liabilities of the Village and pay the remuneration of the persons appointed by this Order;

(ii) the ability to assess, levy, collect and enforce payment of any amount that may be required to satisfy the liabilities of the municipality, including all associated expenses and the remuneration of the persons appointed by this Order, when the realizable assets do not satisfy the liabilities pursuant to subsection 63(4) of *The Municipalities Act*; and

(iii) the authority to access the former Village funds and bank accounts after the effective date of restructuring, transfer funds to the RM and direct the RM regarding the intended use of the funds including such uses as SSA reserve or revenue accounts.

13 The appointment of Vern Palmer is in effect for the period between the effective date of the restructuring and when the final report to the minister has been submitted to the ministry.

14 Remuneration for settling the assets and liabilities shall be paid to Vern Palmer at a rate of \$80.00 per hour of work, in addition to 48.50 cents per kilometre and reimbursement of related miscellaneous expenses.

15 Remuneration for Vern Palmer shall be paid by the RM on approval of the supervising municipal advisor, after the effective date of the restructuring. The RM shall expense any payment to Vern Palmer to the SSA ledger accounts.

The University of Saskatchewan Act, 1995
[section 100]

The Board of Governors have on the 4th day of October, 2021, approved the Traffic Bylaws made pursuant to section 100 of *The University of Saskatchewan Act, 1995*, as follows:

UNIVERSITY OF SASKATCHEWAN TRAFFIC BYLAWS

Part I – Jurisdiction, Application and Definitions

Jurisdiction and application

- 1(1) These bylaws shall apply to the use, operation, and parking of all motor vehicles and to all traffic and control of pedestrians on the roads, service roads, parking lots, pedestrian walks, on the property of the University as defined in Schedule No. 3, pursuant to the authority granted under *The University of Saskatchewan Act, 1995*.
- (2) Nothing limits or abrogates the right of the University to enforce these traffic bylaws on the property of the University, as defined in Schedule No. 3, and the University shall not be estopped from asserting the right to enforce the traffic bylaws on Schedule No. 3 land at any point in time.
- (3) In addition to these bylaws, where not specifically provided for, the general provisions of *The Traffic Safety Act* shall apply. Where a bylaw hereof is inconsistent with *The Traffic Safety Act*, the bylaw has no effect unless it has been approved by the Highway Traffic Board.

Definitions

2(1) In the Bylaw:

- (a) “**Act**” means *The Traffic Safety Act*, S.S. 2004, c. T-18.1, as amended;
- (b) “**Allowable Quantities**” of goods means dangerous goods being transported for delivery to and from the University:
 - (i) in bulk quantities of less than 1000 kg;
 - (ii) in consumer packaging; or
 - (iii) pursuant to a special permit issued by the president under these bylaws;

and includes fuel in the tank or tanks of the carrier vehicle, provided the fuel is carried in permanently-mounted tanks with direct lines to the fuel system of the vehicle;

- (c) **“Bicycle”** means a vehicle for the carriage of persons, which is propelled by muscular power, having two wheels and including any device adapted from a bicycle by the addition of one or more wheels, and includes an electric assisted bicycle with two or three wheels that is equipped with an electrical assist motor no larger than 500 watts and is designed to be propelled with the combination of muscular power and powers assist from the electric motor and cannot be operated at a speed greater than 32 km/hr;
- (d) **“Bus”** means a coach or bus of the Saskatoon Transit System or any other coach or bus that is licensed in a lawful jurisdiction;
- (e) **“Bus Stop”** means that portion of a road designated by a sign for the purpose of loading and unloading Bus passengers;
- (f) **“Campus”** includes any lands administered and controlled by the University situated in, or in the vicinity of, the City of Saskatoon, as described in Schedule No. 3 hereto;
- (g) **“Carrier”** means any person conveying dangerous goods in, onto, through, or out of the University by any motor vehicle including, but not so as to restrict the foregoing, truck, trailer or tractor-trailer; and includes the operator, owner and lessee of the motor vehicle;
- (h) **“Curb”** means the dividing line of the road between that part of the road intended for use of motor vehicles, and that intended for pedestrians, whether marked with a curbstone or not;
- (i) **“Dangerous Goods”** means any product, substance or organism included by its nature or by the regulations in any of the prescribed classes of dangerous goods pursuant to *The Transportation of Dangerous Goods Act* (Canada) and *The Dangerous Goods Transportation Act* of The Province of Saskatchewan, but shall not include allowable quantities of goods;
- (j) **“Disabled Person’s Parking Stall”** means any visitor stall, metered stall, or parking stall signed for exclusive use of disabled persons;
- (k) **“Disabled Person’s Ramp”** means any area that has been improved and maintained primarily for use of persons using a wheelchair, as defined in the act;
- (l) **“Double Park”** means the standing of a motor vehicle, whether occupied or not, parallel to a motor vehicle parked beside a curb;
- (m) **“Faculty and Staff”** means any person employed by the University or affiliated and federated colleges or any other person employed on campus on a full or part-time basis, but excludes federal and provincial government employees and employees of contractors;
- (n) **“Fire Lane”** means any portion of a service road or road that has been designated as a fire lane, or the entrance and exit of a parking lot, and/or the access lanes and driving lanes within a parking lot;
- (o) **“Forged Permit”** means any device, that has not been issued by Parking and Transportation Services or an approved affiliate, that purports to grant or otherwise provide access to parking privileges, and includes, without limitation, any device or permit that is duplicated, defaced, or otherwise altered;
- (p) **“Loading Zone”** means that portion of a road or an area designated by a sign for the purpose of loading and unloading passengers and/or material;
- (q) **“LPR Parking Lot”** means any parking lot which is designated by sign as being enforced using license plate recognition technology;
- (r) **“Metered Stall”** means a portion of a metered zone or parking lot indicated by a parking meter as a place to park one motor vehicle;
- (s) **“Metered Zone”** means that portion of a parking lot, or an area designated by meters for the purpose of parking motor vehicles;
- (t) **“Mobile Electronic Payment System”** means the PayByPhone online parking system, or such other mobile electronic payment system approved by the president;

- (u) **“Motor Vehicle”** is as defined by *The Traffic Safety Act* and includes all self-propelled vehicles as well as all vehicles propelled by muscular power;
- (v) **“Operator”** means any person who drives or is in charge of a motor vehicle on the campus whether that person is in the motor vehicle or not;
- (w) **“Outstanding Violations”** means any notice of violation issued under this bylaw which is unpaid, whether or not it is overdue;
- (x) **“Owner”** means the person named as the registered owner of a motor vehicle under the legislation of the Province of Saskatchewan or any other lawful jurisdiction;
- (y) **“Parking Committee”** is an advisory committee appointed by the Board of Governors of the University of Saskatchewan with authority to administer Schedule No. 4 – “Terms and Conditions for Use of Parking Lots”;
- (z) **“Parking Enforcement Officer”** means any employee of Parking and Transportation Services, and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, includes any person under contract to or appointed by the University, authorized to direct and control traffic and parking on campus or for enforcement of these bylaws;
- (aa) **“Parking and Transportation Services”** means an office operated by the University which is designated by the president to enforce or administer the provisions of these bylaws;
- (bb) **“Parked Motor Vehicle”** means any motor vehicle which is stationary, whether occupied or not, and irrespective of the period of time such a motor vehicle is stationary, except when progress is temporarily impeded by other traffic or in order to obey traffic signs or signals;
- (cc) **“Parking Lot”** means that area designated for parking within the campus of motor vehicles belonging to faculty, staff and students that have a valid permit. See Schedule No. 4 – “Terms and Conditions for Use of Parking Lots”;
- (dd) **“Parking Meter”** means a machine placed or installed at or near any parking space for the purpose of timing, indicating, regulating and controlling the use and occupation by vehicles of such a parking space;
- (ee) **“Parking Pay Station”** means a machine placed or installed at or near any Pay Station Zone for the purpose of regulating and controlling the use and occupation by vehicles of the Pay Station Zone, and which upon the payment specified on the machine authorizes a vehicle to use and occupy a parking space in the Pay Station Zone and issues a permit indicating the time at which the authorized use and occupation of the space expires;
- (ff) **“Parking Stall”** means any portion of a parking lot or pay parking lot marked by one or more of: painted lines, number, meter, pole, sign, or other device to indicate that it is intended for the parking of one motor vehicle;
- (gg) **“Pay Parking Lot”** means a parking area controlled by either a manned entrance and exit, or an electronic controlled entrance and exit, and/or where a parking receipt has been issued or a fee paid;
- (hh) **“Pay Parking Zone”** means a metered stall, a parking stall in a Pay Station Zone, or a parking stall which is designated by sign as requiring payment on an online payment application;
- (ii) **“Pay Station Zone”** means a designated area where parking is permitted subject to payment of a charge at a parking pay station;
- (jj) **“Peace Officer”** means;
 - (i) a member of a police force in Saskatchewan; or
 - (ii) a person or class of persons designated by the Lieutenant Governor in council as traffic officers;

- (kk) **“Pedestrian”** means any person on foot, and shall include the occupant of a wheelchair, as defined in the Act;
- (ll) **“Pedestrian Crossing”** means that portion of a road designated by sign or marking for use by pedestrians for the purpose of crossing the road, or that portion of a road which intersects the separate sections of a pedestrian walk;
- (mm) **“Pedestrian Walk”** means any area or strip of land improved and maintained primarily for use by pedestrians;
- (nn) **“Permit”** means:
- (i) any device issued by the president to allow the parking of a motor vehicle as designated; or
 - (ii) any device issued by an affiliate of the University, and approved by the president, to allow the parking of a motor vehicle as designated;
- (oo) **“Permit-Bearing Motor Vehicle”** means a motor vehicle bearing a permit, as defined in clause 2(1)(nn), provided that such motor vehicle is properly displaying an unexpired permit;
- (pp) **“Person”** means a corporation or a partnership as well as a man, woman, or child;
- (qq) **“President”** means that person employed in the position of the President of the University of Saskatchewan, and anyone the president designates for the enforcement or administration of the provisions of these bylaws;
- (rr) **“Registered Motor Vehicle”** means a motor vehicle or trailer:
- (i) which has a valid and subsisting registration permit issued by the administrator pursuant to *The Traffic Safety Act* and includes any motor vehicle or trailer validly registered under the laws of any other jurisdiction which is being lawfully operated within the Province of Saskatchewan; and
 - (ii) that is properly displaying a valid license plate or registration permit in the manner prescribed by sections 192 and 193 of *The Traffic Safety Act*;
- (ss) **“Road”** means that portion of every road on campus, excepting service roads, intended primarily for use of motor vehicles and includes the entry way to a parking lot, pay parking lot, and access lanes and driving lanes within parking lots and pay parking lots;
- (tt) **“Service Road”** means that portion of every road on campus primarily for use of authorized service vehicles;
- (uu) **“Service Vehicle”** means a University owned vehicle or a motor vehicle leased by the University which is identified by a University crest affixed to it, or a motor vehicle that displays a valid and subsisting service permit issued by the University under these bylaws;
- (vv) **“Sessional Lecturer”** means a person who is hired by the University of Saskatchewan to teach on a “per course basis”;
- (ww) **“Skateboard”** means any board with attached wheels that is ridden in a standing or crouched position and propelled by foot;
- (xx) **“Student”** means any person enrolled at the University on a full or part-time basis or enrolled at an affiliated or federated college on the campus;
- (yy) **“Traffic”** means pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, motor vehicles, bicycles, skateboards and other conveyances, whether singly or together;
- (zz) **“Traffic Sign”** means any sign, signal, marking or other device placed, painted or erected for the guidance, regulation, warning, direction or prohibition of traffic and parking;
- (aaa) **“University”** means the University of Saskatchewan as defined in *The University of Saskatchewan Act*, S.S. 1995, c.U-6.1;

(bbb) **“University Owned Vehicle”** means a motor vehicle owned by the University and identified by a University crest affixed to it;

(ccc) **“University Service Stall”** means a parking stall specifically designated for parking only a University owned vehicle, as defined in clause 2(1)(bbb);

(ddd) **“Unlawfully Parked”** means a motor vehicle on campus, which is:

(i) parked in contravention to any section within these bylaws or the Act; or

(ii) otherwise lawfully parked on campus with the owner or operator of the motor vehicle operator having unpaid parking fines or outstanding violations pursuant to these bylaws, or, being found liable or duly convicted or having outstanding fines pursuant to *The Summary Offences Procedure Act, 1990* (as amended);

(eee) **“Violation Ticket”** means a notice of violation;

(fff) **“Visitor”** means any person other than a student or faculty and staff member;

(ggg) **“Visitor Stall”** means any stall in a loading zone, metered zone, pay station zone, time limited stall or pay parking lot designated for a visitor.

(2) Any words not defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed to them in *The Traffic Safety Act* or any amendments thereof.

(3) All schedules to this bylaw are part of this bylaw.

Part II – Pedestrians

Right-of-way

3(1) Pedestrians have the right of way in parking lots and at all pedestrian crossings and on roads with no paralleling pedestrian walks provided they walk on the left side facing the traffic.

(2) Pedestrians shall yield the right of way when crossing a road other than at a pedestrian crossing.

Waiting on curb

(3) Pedestrians waiting for traffic to pass shall stand on the curb or pedestrian walk.

No Soliciting of Rides

4(1) No person shall stand on a road for the purpose of soliciting a ride from the operator of a motor vehicle.

Boarding

(2) Except in the case of bicycles, no person shall step off or board a motor vehicle or attempt to step off or board a motor vehicle while it is in motion.

Traffic Direction

5 Pedestrians shall comply with any applicable traffic directions indicated on any traffic sign or given by any peace officer or parking enforcement officer.

Part III – Bicycles

Right-hand side

6(1) Subject to subsection 6(3), every person riding a bicycle shall ride as close as possible to the right-hand curb but this shall not apply when the rider is approaching an intersection and indicates an intention to turn left from a direct line by giving a visible signal.

(2) Every person operating a bicycle on a pedestrian walk shall, except when overtaking and passing a pedestrian or bicyclist proceeding in the same direction, operate the bicycle to the right of the center of any such pedestrian walk.

Two Abreast

(3) No person shall ride a bicycle on a road on the left side of any two other persons riding bicycles abreast on that road except for the purpose of passing.

Passengers

7 No person riding a bicycle shall carry an additional person thereon except in the case of a bicycle equipped or designed for the carriage of more than one person.

Stunting

8 Every person operating a bicycle shall have at least one hand on the handlebars at all times, and no person operating a bicycle shall perform or engage in any acrobatic or other stunt.

Bicycle stand

9 Bicycle parking is permitted only in areas specifically designated by the presence of bicycle parking racks or stands. without limiting the generality of the forgoing; bicycle parking is prohibited within two metres of any building entrance or exit; on any stairway; on any egress or ingress ramp; on any loading dock; on any lawn or landscaped area; on any handrail, tree, shrubbery, door, signpost, lamp post, telephone post, parking meter, or other object not maintained or designed for the purpose of securing bicycles; in any lobby, hallway, or room of any building unless the area is specifically designated by the president for bicycle storage or parking.

Seizure of bicycle

10(1) A peace officer or parking enforcement officer may impound a bicycle for any contravention of these bylaws, or if it is abandoned. a bicycle will be considered abandoned when it has been:

- (a) left unattended and unsecured by a locking device; or
- (b) when it has been continuously locked or left unattended in one location longer than seven (7) days.

(2) If it is necessary to circumvent any locking device to impound a bicycle found standing, parked or stored in violation of these bylaws, the University is not responsible for any damage or loss to such locking devices or bicycles, or for replacement of such locking devices.

(3) The owner of a bicycle that has been seized may claim the seized bicycle with proof of ownership and after payment is made for any outstanding violations and seizure costs. Any bicycle impounded and unclaimed for thirty (30) days shall be dealt with as lost or unclaimed personal property, and will be disposed of by the University.

Lights and reflectors

11(1) No person shall operate a bicycle during the period from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise, or at any other time when conditions of poor visibility exists, unless such bicycle is equipped with and displays an operating head lamp together with a red rear light or reflective device.

Horn or bell

(2) No person shall operate a bicycle on campus which is not equipped with a bell or horn capable of emitting sound audible under normal conditions for a distance of not less than thirty-five (35) meters.

Right-of-way

12(1) Bicycles operated on any sidewalk or pedestrian path shall yield the right-of-way to all pedestrian traffic.

(2) Every person operating a bicycle upon any sidewalk, trail, or lawn area shall sound a horn or bell prior to overtaking and passing any pedestrian or bicyclist proceeding in the same direction upon any such sidewalk, trail or lawn area.

(3) When a bicycle is proceeding from a pedestrian sidewalk or lawn area and crossing a road or service road, the bicycle shall yield the right of way to any pedestrian traffic, and to any vehicular traffic on the road, and where crossing a road along with pedestrian traffic, the bicycle operator shall dismount and walk through the crosswalk.

Rate of speed

13(1) No person shall operate a bicycle at a speed greater than what is reasonable and safe in the circumstances, or so as to startle, endanger, or interfere with any other person.

(2) A person shall not operate a bicycle on a road, service road or pedestrian walk in a contest of speed, nor shall they operate a bicycle without due care and attention.

Skateboarding

14 Skateboards shall be limited to use as a means of transportation only. No person shall perform or engage in any acrobatic or other stunt with a skateboard.

Identification of operator

15 Any person who is found to be in contravention of any section of Part III will provide lawful identification to any peace officer or parking enforcement officer on demand. Where lawful identification is not provided when demanded, any peace officer or parking enforcement officer may seize the offending bicycle or skateboard and hold the bicycle or skateboard until lawful identification has been provided. The University will dispose of a bicycle or skateboard that is not claimed and for which lawful identification of the owner has not been provided after a period of thirty (30) days.

Part IV – Operation of Motor Vehicles**Splashing pedestrians**

16 When water, mud or slush is lying on a road, the operator of a motor vehicle shall drive on the road in a manner so as not to splash any pedestrian; or project dirt or water at or onto any pedestrian or other motor vehicle by spinning tires or accelerating quickly.

Sufficient distance

17 Every operator driving a motor vehicle behind another moving motor vehicle shall preserve a sufficient distance to be able to stop without accident in the event the leading motor vehicle stops.

Starting and turning

18(1) Any operator of a motor vehicle, before starting or turning from a direct line, shall signal their intentions and ensure that such movement can be made in safety.

(2) The operator of a motor vehicle entering the flow of traffic from a standing position at the curb shall yield the right-of-way to other motor vehicles using the road.

Backing up

19(1) No person shall back a motor vehicle around a corner at any time; or back a motor vehicle along any road, except when reasonably necessary.

(2) An operator of a motor vehicle, before backing, shall give ample warning of their intention to do so, and shall not back up unless such movement can be made without interfering with other traffic and can be made without injury to persons or property.

Obstructing traffic

20 No operator shall drive or stand a motor vehicle upon any road or service road in such a manner as to block, obstruct, impede or hinder traffic thereon. Where the obstruction is unavoidable due to mechanical failure, the operator will not be in breach of this section, provided proper measures to clear the faulty motor vehicle from the road are taken immediately.

Entering intersection

21 No operator of a motor vehicle shall enter an intersection unless there is sufficient space to accommodate the passage of the motor vehicle without obstructing traffic.

Cruising

22 No operator of a motor vehicle for hire shall solicit business while traveling on a road; nor shall an operator or passenger of any motor vehicle annoy any person by soliciting or enticing any person to the motor vehicle.

No U-turns

23 No operator driving a motor vehicle shall make a U-turn or turn a motor vehicle around on any road or intersection.

Towing

24(1) No person shall tow more than one motor vehicle upon any road, and the connection must be so arranged that the towing motor vehicle and the towed motor vehicle are separated by no more than two (2) meters.

Pushing speed

(2) No person shall push any motor vehicle on any road at a speed greater than thirty (30) kilometers per hour.

Maximum speed

25 Unless otherwise posted, no operator shall drive a motor vehicle on any road or service road at a speed greater than forty (40) kilometers per hour.

Off road and barricades

26(1) No operator of a motor vehicle other than a bicycle or skateboard shall drive on any surface other than a road, service road or parking lot, unless permission has been obtained from the president.

(2) No operator of a motor vehicle shall drive through or enter upon any road, parking lot, or portion thereof which is roped off, barricaded or indicated by a notice or sign as being closed.

Snowmobiles

27 No person shall drive a snowmobile or motor toboggan on campus.

Wheel construction

28 Motor vehicles fitted with wheels or appliances which are of such a type that would cause damage to road surfaces shall not be driven on any road unless written permission has been obtained from the president.

Covering of loads

29(1) No person shall operate any motor vehicle transporting ashes, garbage, trade waste, refuse, or debris of any kind or description whatsoever along or over any road unless the load is covered and securely fastened in such a manner as to prevent it or any portion of it falling from the motor vehicle.

Spilt material

(2) No person shall allow anything to fall from a motor vehicle onto any property of the University. Should any material being transported be spilt, whether innocently or negligently, it shall immediately be removed by the person transporting such material so that the University property shall be in as clean and usable a state as before the material was spilt. If the person transporting the material does not immediately remove such material, the University may remove it and charge the cost of doing so to the owner of such material, the owner of the motor vehicle transporting such material, or the operator of the motor vehicle, all of whom will be jointly and severally liable for such cost and damages sustained to the University from the spill.

Dangerous goods

(3) No operator shall travel on University property with dangerous goods in excess of the allowable quantity, without express written permission from the president. No operator shall stop a motor vehicle conveying dangerous goods on campus except where loading and unloading, in compliance with the directions of a traffic signal or sign, in compliance with the directions of a peace officer or parking enforcement officer, or with express written permission from the president. No operator shall convey dangerous goods on University property except between the hours of 09:00 to 16:00 Monday to Friday, except statutory holidays, unless written permission is obtained from the president. The movement of dangerous goods shall be governed by the regulations of *The Transportation of Dangerous Goods Act* (Canada) and *The Dangerous Goods Transportation Act* (Saskatchewan). The owner of the dangerous goods, the owner of the motor vehicle transporting them, and the operator are jointly and severally liable for the delivery of the dangerous goods, and in the event of a spill the owner of the dangerous goods, the owner of the motor vehicle transporting the dangerous goods and the operator are jointly and severally liable for such cleanup cost and other associated damages.

Part V – Parking**Designated areas only**

30(1) Parking of a motor vehicle is permitted only in designated areas.

(2) No operator shall park any motor vehicle in an area not designated for parking (such as, but not limited to, landscaped areas, undeveloped areas, roads, service roads, and sidewalks). written permission to park in a non-designated area must be obtained from the president.

Permit-bearing motor vehicles

- 31(1)** A permit-bearing motor vehicle may be parked in the manner and location designated on the permit.
- (2) Permit-bearing motor vehicles may park in visitor stalls providing the time limit is observed and the fee paid.
- (3) No operator shall park a non-permit-bearing motor vehicle in a parking lot during the reserved period specified on the traffic sign at that parking lot, and in accordance with the conditions outlined in subsections 31(4), 31(5), and 31(6).

Display of permit

- (4) A permit shall be displayed on the rear-view mirror of the motor vehicle, front-facing, with the permit number and expiry date, when applicable, fully visible through the windshield. Where it is not possible to display the permit on the rear-view mirror, the permit must be prominently displayed, with the permit number and expiry date, when applicable, fully visible through the driver's side portion of the windshield. Where the motor vehicle is a motorcycle, the permit shall be affixed to the motor vehicle so that it is prominently displayed and the permit number and expiry date are fully visible.
- (5) In addition to the requirements set out in subsection 31(4), a permit shall be affixed or so attached to the motor vehicle according to any instructions printed on the permit or provided with the permit.
- (6) All permits are issued subject to observance of the terms and conditions and bylaws applicable. Where permits are required, a permit shall be invalid:
- (a) after the date of expiration;
 - (b) when it is not affixed to the motor vehicle in general accordance with subsection 31(4);
 - (c) when it has been cancelled or revoked in accordance with the terms and conditions in Schedule No. 4;
 - (d) when the permit has been reported lost or stolen;
 - (e) when the owner disposes of the vehicle;
 - (f) when the vehicle is parked other than as designated on the permit;
 - (g) when the permit has been sold or sublet contrary to subsection 31(10);
 - (h) when the information supplied by the applicant was false, misleading or unsubstantiated;
 - (i) where a person obtains more than one parking permit;
 - (j) where payment was made by cheque and the cheque is returned by the financial institution;
 - (k) when the permit has been used in breach of these bylaws;
 - (l) when it is a forged permit;
 - (m) where the prescribed fee for the permit has not been paid in full; or
 - (n) where multiple permits have been issued for a single parking stall, and more than one of said permits is present in the assigned parking lot at one time.
- (7) When a motor vehicle is sold, the permit holder shall remove the permit from the motor vehicle.
- (8) All Permits which are no longer valid shall be removed from the motor vehicle.

Lost or stolen permit

- (9) In the event a permit is lost or stolen, the permit holder shall provide proof that this has been duly reported to a law enforcement agency. Fees and conditions for replacement permits will be determined from time to time by the president. If the original permit is found and the replacement permit is returned to Parking and Transportation Services, a refund may be applied for, and may be given, at the discretion of Parking And Transportation Services.

Sale of permit for gain

- (10) Permits issued by Parking and Transportation Services in accordance with these bylaws shall not be sold or traded for gain.

Forged Permit

- (11) No person shall make or use a forged permit. The owner of a permit who allows their permit to be used to make forged permit will have their permit cancelled.

Method of parking

32(1) Unless any on-street parking stall or loading zone is otherwise posted, no operator shall park a motor vehicle other than parallel with the curb, and with the right-hand wheels of the motor vehicle within thirty (30) centimetres of the curb, nor shall any operator park, stand or stop a motor vehicle in an on-street parking stall or loading zone so that any part of it projects into a road.

(2) Unless any parking stall within a parking lot is otherwise marked, no operator shall park a motor vehicle in any parking lot other than 90 degrees to the curb and with the bumper of the vehicle no less than 30 cms from the curb.

(3) In addition to the requirements set out in subsection 32(2), no operator shall park a motor vehicle in any lpr parking lot other than nose-in to the curb.

Stall boundaries

(4) Where parking stall boundaries are indicated by painted lines, a meter, pole, sign, or other device, no operator shall park a motor vehicle other than entirely within the boundary of a single parking stall.

Left side to curb

(5) No operator shall park a motor vehicle with the motor vehicle's left-hand side to the curb.

Time Limit

33(1) No operator shall park a motor vehicle beyond the time limit specified by the traffic sign or the time limit specified on their valid permit for the location.

(2) Any peace officer or parking enforcement officer may place an erasable chalk mark on the tread face of a tire in order to determine the time said motor vehicle has been parked and neither the peace officer, parking enforcement officer, nor the University shall incur any liability for doing so.

(3) No person shall remove an erasable chalk mark placed under subsection 33(2) while the motor vehicle remains parked in the location where it was marked.

Pay parking zones

34(1) Subject to subsection 34(2), no operator shall park a motor vehicle in a Pay Parking Zone for longer than the amount of time purchased in relation to a parking stall in that Pay Parking Zone.

(2) A motor vehicle shall be deemed to be unlawfully parked if the motor vehicle remains parked in a Pay Parking Zone and:

- (a) the license plate of the motor vehicle is not registered as paid on any mobile electronic payment system approved by the president for use in the Pay Parking Zone; or
- (b) at a metered stall, the parking meter display shows: "time expired" or "out of order" or "fail" or "00:00" or any other message indicating that the time paid for has expired; or
- (c) at a pay station zone, the license plate of the motor vehicle is not registered as paid at the pay parking station.

(3) Pay Parking Zones will be enforced in the manner specified by any traffic sign posted at the Pay Parking Zone.

(4) Upon parking a motor vehicle in a Pay Parking Zone, payment must be made without delay, and as indicated on the parking meter, on the parking pay station, or on any traffic sign posted at the Pay Parking Zone, and as specified in Schedule No. 2.

(5) In addition to the requirements set out in subsection 34(4), the operator of a motor vehicle parked in a Pay Parking Zone, where they intend to pay via the mobile electronic payment system, or in a pay station zone shall forthwith enter the license plate number of the motor vehicle without delay and, if using the mobile electronic payment application, the location id number, in accordance with the instructions on the pay station or within the mobile electronic payment application. Incorrect entry of the motor vehicle's license plate or the location id number shall result in it being deemed that payment was not made for the parking stall, and the motor vehicle shall be considered to be unlawfully parked as if the motor vehicle was not registered as paid.

(6) Under no circumstances does a permit extend privileges to park in a Pay Parking Zone unless specifically designated on the permit or as noted hereof.

Hooded meter

(7) Where a meter hood has been placed over a parking meter indicating either "reserved", "no parking", or "disabled parking", no operator shall park a motor vehicle at the hooded meter unless a valid permit is displayed on the motor vehicle which allows parking at that location.

Double parking

35 No operator shall double park any motor vehicle.

No stopping on campus roads

36 No operator shall stop a motor vehicle (excepting buses for the purpose of loading and unloading passengers) on campus roads, except when necessary to avoid collision, due to conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with the directions of a parking enforcement officer, peace officer or traffic sign.

Unauthorized use of electrical outlet

37 (1) No operator shall plug a motor vehicle into an electrical outlet for which they are not authorized to do so, or for which they have not paid the fee, nor shall they plug in any device with a greater wattage than is authorized.

(2) No person shall alter or tamper with any electrical outlet, unless they are a trained and qualified contractor or employee under contract with and directed by the University to perform work on said electrical outlet.

Engine running where prohibited

38 No operator of a motor vehicle shall leave the engine running while loading or unloading goods at any loading dock or at any location where prohibited by a sign.

Bus stop

39(1) No operator shall park, stand, or stop any motor vehicle other than a bus in a bus stop.

Fire hydrant and fire lane

(2) No operator shall park a motor vehicle within three (3) metres of a fire hydrant except for the purpose of loading or unloading, and then only provided the operator remains at the wheel of the motor vehicle at all times ready to move the motor vehicle when required.

(3) No operator shall park a motor vehicle anywhere within a designated fire lane, nor the entrance and exit of a parking lot or any access lanes or driving lanes within a parking lot. In an emergency, this section shall not apply to police, fire, ambulances and University service vehicles.

Obstruct Pedestrian Crossing

(4) No operator shall park a motor vehicle in a manner which obstructs in any way a pedestrian crossing.

Disabled Parking

(5) No operator shall park a motor vehicle, or encroach in any way, on a space identified as a disabled person's parking stall, or park any motor vehicle or encroach in any way on a disabled person's ramp, unless it is displaying a valid Province of Saskatchewan disabled person's placard, or a University permit for a person with a disability, or a disabled person's placard issued by a lawful jurisdiction, provided such parking is in accordance with the conditions on the sign and the time limit posted.

Stall occupied

40 No operator shall park a motor vehicle in a metered stall if the stall is already occupied by another motor vehicle. If two or more motor vehicles are parked in a single metered stall, a peace officer or parking enforcement officer shall have sole discretion to decide which motor vehicle(s) are parked in a non-designated area and subject to a violation ticket. The peace officer shall view which motor vehicle appears to have arrived at the metered stall first and/or which motor vehicle's front or rear right wheel is more closely adjacent to the parking meter.

Unlicensed vehicle

41(1) No operator shall park a motor vehicle or trailer upon campus unless the motor vehicle or trailer is a registered motor vehicle.

License plate not visible/legible

(2) No operator shall park a motor vehicle upon campus while displaying a license plate that is not distinctly visible and legible to a parking enforcement officer, nor shall any operator park a registered motor vehicle upon campus in such a manner that the license plate would not be distinctly visible and legible to a parking enforcement officer.

(3) No operator shall park a motor vehicle in a LPR parking lot while the license plate is obstructed by any material or otherwise not able to be read by an LPR camera.

Propane-fueled motor vehicle

42 No operator shall park a propane-fueled motor vehicle within an indoor enclosed parking garage or indoor loading dock.

Abandoned vehicles

43 No operator shall park a motor vehicle in any location for longer than 72 hours unless permission has been obtained from the president.

Opening of doors

44 No person shall open a door of a motor vehicle on the side exposed to moving traffic unless and until it is reasonably safe to do so, nor shall any person leave a door of a motor vehicle open on the side exposed to moving traffic for a period of time longer than necessary to load and unload passengers.

Repair of motor vehicle

45 No operator shall wash, service, or repair a motor vehicle on University property except in the case of emergency repairs, or where written permission has been obtained from the president.

Uncoupled trailer

46 No person shall leave a trailer or tractor trailer unattached to the motor vehicle used for moving it on any road, service road, visitor stall, bus stop, parking lot or any other place unless permission has been obtained from the president.

Special parking

47 Special parking permits will be issued by Parking and Transportation Services and the fees for such permits will be as set forth in Schedule No. 2 – "Fees, Charges and Expenses". Special parking permits will be issued for the following purposes:

(a) **University Vehicle Permit** – will be issued for University-owned or leased motor vehicles and will allow the parking of the motor vehicle in a University service stall;

(b) **Service Vehicle Permit** – will be issued for privately-owned motor vehicles that are used regularly to carry out University functions and which fall under the definition of service vehicle. This permit allows parking of the motor vehicle in a University service stall. This permit is issued to the owner of a motor vehicle, provided the motor vehicle is already a permit bearing motor vehicle on campus. Application for a service vehicle permit for a private motor vehicle is to be in writing, explaining the use to be made of the motor vehicle, and submitted to Parking and Transportation Services through the office of the dean or senior administrative head. Fees and conditions will be determined from time to time by the president. **Note:** Private motor vehicles with a service vehicle permit are not to be parked in a University service stall for more than two (2) consecutive hours;

- (c) **Contractor Permit** – will be issued for motor vehicles owned by a contractor or its employees under contract to the University and working on campus and will allow parking of the permit bearing motor vehicle in the area designated on the permit. Fees and conditions will be determined from time to time by the president;
- (d) **Special Events Permit** – will be issued for short courses, conferences, seminars, workshops and other special events and will allow parking of the motor vehicle in the area designated on the permit. Fees and conditions will be determined from time to time by the president;
- (e) **Guest Permit** – will be issued to distinguished visitors to the campus. This permit will allow parking of the permit bearing motor vehicle in the area designated on the permit. Fees and conditions will be determined from time to time by the president;
- (f) **Meter Smart Park Cards** – will be available through Parking and Transportation Services. The issue of these cards is restricted to the discretion of Parking and Transportation Services. The time limit posted on the traffic sign in a metered zone must be observed. Fees and conditions will be determined from time to time by the president;
- (g) **Meter Hooding** – Parking meters may be hooded to reserve a space, or spaces. Fees and conditions will be determined from time to time by the president.

Pay parking lots

48(1) Pay parking is available in pay parking lots and is subject to fees as set out in Schedule No. 2, “Fees, Charges and Expenses”, and as indicated on the traffic sign. Electronic parking equipment lots will be operated in accordance with the time periods as specified by the traffic signs and as approved from time to time by the president.

Pay parking lots – failure to pay fee

(2) During the hours of operation of a pay parking lot, on entry to the lot the operator is required to stop and obtain a pay parking ticket from either the attendant or the automated ticket dispenser. The vehicle operator, on exiting from the lot, is required to stop and submit the pay parking ticket to either the attendant or the automated payment machine and pay the required fee. Failure to stop and pay the fee or submit the pay parking ticket is a violation. The assessed fine is in addition to the accumulated parking charges to be paid.

Pay parking lots – passback

(3) No person shall share or allow their authorized permit to be used in aiding additional or subsequent motor vehicles in entering or exiting, or attempting to enter or exit, the pay parking lot without paying.

Pay parking lots – tailgating

(4) No operator of a motor vehicle shall enter or exit a pay parking lot before allowing the gate to fully close after the previous vehicle.

Tampering or damaging parking equipment

(5) No person shall deface, damage, tamper or impair the working of any parking equipment, including but not limited to parking meters, meter pole, electronic parking pay station, pass card reader, ticket dispenser, or pay parking lot gate.

(6) Where an operator or passenger of a motor vehicle is found to have defaced, damaged, tampered with, or impaired the working of any parking equipment, the owner of said motor vehicle shall be liable for the violation, subject to section 55, hereof.

(7) No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter or electronic parking equipment any substitute for a coin of Canada.

Additional penalties

49 Any operator of a motor vehicle that is unlawfully parked is subject to an additional fine, as listed in Schedule No. 1 – “Penalties”, after two (2) hours from the time the previous violation ticket was issued.

Part VI – Traffic Control

Newly painted lines

50 No person shall willfully drive over or walk on a newly painted line indicated by traffic signs.

Interference with traffic signs

51(1) No person shall willfully deface, alter, move, obstruct or interfere with any traffic sign or parking meter.

Unauthorized signs

(2) No person shall erect or maintain any traffic warning or directional sign unless written permission has been obtained from the president. Any unauthorized signs will be removed without notice.

Direction of traffic signs

(3) No person shall disobey any applicable instructions or directions indicated on any traffic sign unless otherwise directed by a parking enforcement officer or a peace officer.

Part VII – Enforcement

Authority

52(1) This bylaw will be enforced by peace officers and parking enforcement officers.

Placing of tickets

(2) No person, other than a peace officer or a parking enforcement officer shall place a violation ticket on any motor vehicle; and no person, other than the owner or operator of a motor vehicle, shall remove a violation ticket from a motor vehicle.

Emergency authority

(3) In case of fire or other emergency, or in order to expedite traffic, or safeguard pedestrians, or prevent accidents or meet any unforeseen conditions requiring traffic control, any parking enforcement officer or any peace officer is authorized to direct traffic in such a manner as may be necessary, whether or not in conformity with the provisions of these bylaws.

Temporary closing of roads

(4) Any portion of a road may be temporarily closed to vehicular traffic by the president.

Violation Ticket

53(1) A violation ticket may be issued by any parking enforcement officer or peace officer to any operator or owner of a motor vehicle, bicycle, or to a pedestrian, or to any other person who is in violation of any of the provisions of these bylaws. The violation ticket shall be substantially in the form as may from time to time be approved by the president.

(2) Where a person or operator commits, or is alleged to have committed, an offense for which a fixed penalty is listed in Schedule No. 1 – “Penalties”, or otherwise violated these bylaws, Parking and Transportation Services, the University, a peace officer or parking enforcement officer shall:

- (a) provide a violation ticket to a person or operator or attach to that person’s or operator’s motor vehicle in such a manner that is visible; or
- (b) where there is electronic, video, or other evidence to corroborate a violation of these bylaws, but it is impractical or impossible for a parking enforcement office or peace officer to place the violation ticket on the motor vehicle at the time of the violation, send a violation ticket via mail to the registered address of the owner of the motor vehicle.

Payment of penalties

54(1) Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of these bylaws for which a specific penalty is provided may pay to Parking and Transportation Services during the posted business hours, in Canadian dollars, the amount specified in Schedule No. 1 for the violation, providing that payment must be made within a period of fourteen (14) days from the proper issuance of the violation ticket. If payment is made within such time and accepted then the person shall not be liable for prosecution for breach of these bylaws under the provisions of subsection 54(2). For payment received within fourteen (14) days from the proper issuance of the violation ticket, the board of governors may, by resolution, allow the parking service’s employees to accept a lesser payment as shown in Schedule No. 1.

Failure to pay penalties

(2) If any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of these bylaws for which a penalty is provided, fails to pay the sum specified within the time allowed under subsection 54(1), then the sum shall be recoverable and enforceable by civil proceedings, or, through summary conviction proceedings under *The Summary Offences Procedure Act, 1990*, either before a presiding justice of the peace or a judge or justice of the courts of Saskatchewan.

(3) Where the owner of a vehicle has been convicted under *The Summary Offences Procedure Act, 1990* and payment has not been received after 30 calendar days, the University may assess a late payment fee in the amount prescribed in that act.

Owner liability

55 The owner of a motor vehicle is liable for any violation of these bylaws and outstanding violations incurred by the owner or authorized operator of the owner's motor vehicle in accordance with section 101 of *The University of Saskatchewan Act, 1995*, as amended.

Part VIII – General**Administration**

56 (1) The Board of Governors hereby appoints the president to administer these bylaws.

Administration of signs, zones, time limits and bus stops

(2) The Board of Governors hereby appoints the president to authorize the erection of traffic signs that are deemed necessary for the proper carrying out of the provisions of these bylaws.

(3) The Board of Governors hereby appoints the president to establish bus stops, loading zones, metered zones, and pay station zones on such roads, in such places, and in such numbers as it shall determine to be necessary. The president shall establish the time limits or other conditions of use and same shall be designated by traffic signs for the said bus stops, loading zones, metered zones, and pay station zones.

Obstruct Free passage

57 No person shall obstruct the free passage of traffic on any pedestrian walk or road without written permission of the president.

Parades

58(1) No parade or procession shall be held without the permission of the president.

(2) The president is hereby empowered to barricade and obstruct whatever roads deemed necessary during the passage of any parade or procession and to divert traffic to whatever roads is deemed advisable. During any parade or procession all pedestrians not taking part thereof shall be restricted to the use of the pedestrian walks and except with the written permission of the president all parades must assemble and proceed on the right side of the road and not interfere with traffic proceeding from the opposite direction.

Horse riding

59 No person shall ride a horse or drive a horse drawn vehicle on any pedestrian walk or in any landscaped area.

Camping

60 No person shall camp overnight on University property either in a tent, trailer, camper or motor home without permission of the president.

Littering

61 No person shall throw, cast or distribute in or upon any motor vehicle, road, sidewalk, landscaped area, or any other property of the University any hand bills, cards or other advertising matter whatsoever; and except by written consent of the president, no person shall either themselves or through another person, put, place or leave lumber, building material, goods, wares, merchandise or thing of any kind whatsoever upon, or in any way directly or indirectly encumber, obstruct, injure or foul any roadway, sidewalk, landscaped area or any property of the University; and nor shall any person throw glass, bottles, or any other material on any road, pedestrian walk, landscaped area or other property of the University.

Vehicle seizures

62(1) In the event a motor vehicle is unlawfully parked, any parking enforcement officer or peace officer may remove, tow, immobilize by whatever means, or otherwise store the said motor vehicle in the designated motor vehicle compound.

(2) Where a parking enforcement officer or peace officer has removed, towed, immobilized, and/or stored a motor vehicle pursuant to subsection 62(1), it may be impounded by the University until the cost of the removal and storage are paid, together with such outstanding violations levied under and pursuant to these bylaws, in which case the motor vehicle shall be released to the owner or a duly authorized agent after such ownership has been verified.

(3) If the cost of immobilizing, towing, removal, impoundment, and storage and such fines levied as described in Schedule no. 1 – “Penalties” and Schedule No. 2 – “Fees, Charges and Expenses”, of these bylaws, are not paid within the period of thirty (30) days from the date of the removal, the University may recover same from the owner of the motor vehicle by legal action in a court of competent jurisdiction, or sale of the motor vehicle by public auction, or pursue all other remedies available to it under *The Summary Offences Procedure Act, 1990*.

(4) The University is not liable for any loss or damage to a motor vehicle, or to the contents of a motor vehicle, which is seized and/or sold pursuant to this section.

(5) The proceeds of the sale shall be applied in the following order for the payment of:

- (a) the cost of immobilization;
- (b) the cost of seizure of the motor vehicle;
- (c) the cost of advertising the sale, the auctioneer’s fees and other reasonable costs of the sale including solicitor’s costs;
- (d) any and other applicable costs as described in Schedule No. 2 – “Fees, Charges and Expenses”;
- (e) any fines levied and outstanding violations under and pursuant to these bylaws which fines remain unpaid; and
- (f) the claim of any lien holder; or any party claiming a security interest under and pursuant to the provisions of *The Personal Property Security Act, 1993*.

If the owner does not apply for the surplus within thirty (30) days from the date of the sale, the surplus shall be handed over to a solicitor entitled to practice law within the Province of Saskatchewan to be kept in a special trust account for three hundred and sixty-five (365) days after which, if the owner does not claim it, the surplus shall be forfeited to the University of Saskatchewan and shall be transferred to the general revenue account of the University and shall form part thereof.

(6) The immobilization or removal of any motor vehicle under this section shall not relieve the owner or operator of any liability under any other section of these bylaws for any violation for which the owner would otherwise be liable prior to the removal of the motor vehicle.

(7) No person shall interfere with, or attempt to prevent the immobilization or removal of any motor vehicle, pursuant to subsection 62(1).

Directions of parking enforcement officer or peace officer

63 Every person shall comply with any directions given by a parking enforcement officer or a peace officer pursuant to these bylaws.

Penalties

64(1) The penalty for breach of any of the preceding clauses and sections shall be the sum set out in Schedule No. 1 – “Penalties”, attached hereto, plus any fees, charges, and expenses as set out in Schedule No. 2 – “Fees, Charges and Expenses” attached hereto, and other applicable fees as mentioned in these bylaws.

General Penalty

(2) Any Person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of these provisions of the bylaws for which no specific penalty is provided in Schedule No. 1 – “Penalties”, shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty of not less than \$100 and not more than:

- (a) \$2,000.00 in the case of an individual; and
- (b) \$5,000.00 in the case of a corporation;

recoverable and enforceable with costs by summary conviction proceedings before a Saskatchewan court or justice of the peace, and upon default of payment, the terms of imprisonment in accordance with the provisions of *The Summary Offences Procedure Act, 1990*.

Severability

65 A determination of invalidity or unconstitutionality by a court of competent jurisdiction of any provision of this bylaw shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this bylaw.

Revisions and effective date

66 The Traffic Bylaws may be revised from time-to-time by The Board of Governors. These bylaws and revisions thereto shall come into force and take effect after the date of their publication in *The Saskatchewan Gazette*.

- 2** If payment of the penalty is made within fourteen (14) calendar days of the date of the violation ticket, then:
- (a) the operator or owner of the vehicle shall not be liable to prosecution for the violation indicated on the violation ticket;
 - (b) the amount the penalty shall be the discounted penalty, if any, shown in Column B of Section 1 of this schedule; or
 - (c) if no discounted penalty is shown for the offence, the amount of the penalty shall be the amount shown in column a of Section 1 of this schedule.
- 3** At the discretion of parking and transportation services an administration fee may be accepted in lieu of the fine.

Schedule No. 2 – Fees, Charges and Expenses

Removal, Impounding and Storage

1(1) Fees, charges and expenses will be levied and imposed on the owner or operator of any motor vehicle that is removed and stored pursuant to the provisions of subsection 62(1). Fees, charges and expenses may be levied for any one or combination of the following:

- (a) straight tow;
- (b) dolly transfer tow;
- (c) pickup of motorcycle, motor scooter, or any other motor vehicle that cannot be towed;
- (d) impound fee; and
- (e) storage of vehicle per day.

(2) Where any motor vehicle requires services such as immobilization or additional facilities beyond those listed in subsection 1(1) of this schedule for its proper handling, the fees, charges and expenses of such shall be added to the charges of subsection 1(1) of this Schedule.

(3) The fees, charges and expense of this section shall be determined by resolution of the President as required.

Visitor parking fees

2(1) The president may from time to time determine the fees for metered parking.

(1.1) Where the word “nickel”, “dime”, “quarter”, “loonie” or “toonie” appears on a meter, it shall mean a five cent, ten cent, twenty-five cent, one dollar or two dollar coin, respectively of Canada.

(2) The president may from time to time determine the fees for pay-parking lots.

Special Parking Permits

3(1) University Vehicle Parking Permit – the parking fee and heater plug fee to be charged for a University vehicle permit is to be the same as that for a reserved faculty and staff permit with like facilities. The permit may be transferred to another motor vehicle but is not refundable.

(2) The fees and conditions of all special permits listed in clause 47(b) through clause 47(g) will be determined from time to time by the President.

Schedule No. 4 – Terms and Conditions for Use of Parking Lots

Part I – Application and Definitions

Application

1 The terms and conditions shall apply to the parking of all permit bearing motor vehicles within the parking lots of the University of Saskatchewan. When a parking permit has been purchased and for as long as the permit is valid, the terms and conditions shall apply and form part of the Traffic Bylaws.

Definitions

2 All definitions of the University of Saskatchewan Traffic Bylaws apply to this Schedule as if they were written as part hereof.

Part II – Permits

Application for permits

3(1) Faculty, staff shall apply to parking and transportation services for a permit and enter into a parking contract if they wish to park their vehicle, except a bicycle, in a parking lot. Permits will be issued in accordance with the priorities set forth in Appendix A of this Schedule. Permits will not be issued for snowmobiles, motorized toboggans, or motor vehicles longer than seven metres. Permits will not be issued to applicants who do not have a registered motor vehicle in the province of saskatchewan or other lawful jurisdiction.

(2) Faculty and staff applying for a permit shall be prepared to identify themselves, complete and sign the application form, and pay the prescribed fee as set forth in Appendix B of this Schedule. By signing the application form, the applicant has entered into an agreement with the University and will comply with the terms and conditions for use of parking lots.

(3) Students will be assigned a spot in a parking lot in accordance to the conditions outlined in subsection 21(3) of this Schedule and must provide a valid student card when accepting their parking lot permit.

(4) A permit for a faculty and staff parking stall or lot will be renewed if the renewed permit can be issued in accordance with Appendix A.

Refunds

(5) Application for a refund may be made to Parking and Transportation Services. All applicable refunds will be issued on a pro-rated basis. There may be an additional administrative charge for this service. The first and last months will not qualify for a refund.

Parking stall permit

4(1) Parking stall permits are generally issued to allow the parking of a permit bearing motor vehicle in the stall as designated on the permit. The stalls are reserved as noted in Section 8 of this schedule.

Parking lot permit

(2) Parking lot permits are issued to allow the parking of a permit bearing motor vehicle in the lot designated on the permit. Lots are reserved as noted in Section 8 of this Schedule.

Sessional lecturers

5 Parking and Transportation Services and CUPE 3287 will jointly administer sessional lecturers' parking. Assignment of stalls will be on a time-share basis.

Disabled parking

6 Persons with a disability may apply to Parking and Transportation Services for a disabled permit. Medical documentation is required to verify the degree of disability and to assess the length of time for which the disability is expected to last. Applicants who have an authorized placard issued by the authority in their jurisdiction, may be exempt from providing medical documentation. Parking and Transportation Services reserves the right to require independent medical assessment.

Revocation of permits

7 Parking and Transportation Services reserves the right to revoke the issuance or refuse the sale of a parking Permit under the following conditions:

- (a) misrepresentation or providing false information at the time of purchase;
- (b) possession of a fraudulent permit; or
- (c) flagrant disregard of these bylaws.

Part III – Operation of Parking Lots**Reserved parking hours**

- 8(1) Except where otherwise posted, reserved parking lots are reserved 24 hours.
- (2) In lots where night parking permits are required, they will be required September 1 to April 30, Monday to Thursday, 17:00 hours to 22:00 hours.
- (3) U Lot parking stalls are reserved 24 hours per day.

Motorcycle parking

9 Motorcycles are to be parked in the area that has been designated for them.

Electrical Service

10 Parking stalls that are rented with electrical outlets will be energized as required by weather conditions.

Designation of disabled parking

11 Parking for people with a disability will be designated according to need. Other stalls may be designated for use by disabled persons on an as-required basis in accordance with Appendix A.

Temporary Closure

12 Where it is necessary to close parking lots or stalls for such operations as snow removal, maintenance or other valid activities, signs shall be erected and strictly enforced and shall have absolute priority over parking privileges granted herein. If possible, vehicles displaced will be assigned other locations in accordance with Appendix A.

Part IV – General**Administration**

13 The Board of Governors hereby appoints the President to administer these Terms and Conditions for the Use of Parking Lots.

Liability

14 Any motor vehicle parking, operated, or driven on campus, including all parking lots, shall be solely at the risk of the owner or operator. The University assumes no liability for damage to, or theft from, a motor vehicle parked, located or driven on campus, or, any damage caused by an owner or operator's motor vehicle to a third party motor vehicle.

Cancellation of Parking Privileges

15(1) Parking and Transportation Services will retain the right to suspend parking privileges of any person who does not adhere to the terms and conditions contained herein, subject to appeal as outlined in subsection 15(2) of this Schedule.

(2) Permit holders may lodge a grievance with the parking committee. The grievance must be submitted in writing.

Reserved stall occupied by others

16(1) If the operator of a permit bearing motor vehicle finds their designated stall occupied by an unauthorized vehicle, it is the operator's responsibility to park the permit bearing motor vehicle in a metered stall, without payment of fee.

(2) If the action set out in subsection 16(1) of this Schedule is followed, it is imperative that the permit holder advise Parking and Transportation Services as soon as possible:

- (a) that their designated stall is occupied;
- (b) where they have parked; and
- (c) provide their name, Permit number and vehicle license plate number.

The telephone call must be made at the time of the event so the complaint may be properly logged.

(3) If the action set out in subsections 16(1) and 16(2) of this Schedule are followed and the vehicle is issued a violation ticket while parked at the metered stall, the permit holder shall contact parking and transportation services within 72 hours to request cancellation of the violation ticket. If no record exists of the permit holder advising parking and transportation services of their stall being occupied, the violation ticket may not be cancelled.

(4) An unauthorized vehicle in a parking stall will be issued with a violation as set out in the traffic bylaw, subsection 31(3). Towing of an illegally parked vehicle from a parking stall will not normally be undertaken unless the vehicle has been parked for a period of at least two hours or prior to that time, providing there is sufficient justification for its removal, at the discretion of Parking and Transportation Services.

Special parking

17 The University reserves the right under special or unusual circumstances to appropriate parking lots or portions thereof to provide parking for special functions that are authorized by the University.

Reassignment

18 Notwithstanding anything herein, vehicles assigned to any parking stall or lot may be reassigned to other parking stalls or lots if the former is required as a construction site or for other just reasons. Vehicles displaced will be assigned to other parking locations in accordance with Appendix A of this Schedule.

Revisions

19 The Parking Terms and Conditions may be revised from time to time by recommendation of the Parking Committee and the approval of the Board of Governors.

Appendix A – Priority for Assignment of Parking Stalls and Lots**Service vehicles**

20 Notwithstanding anything herein set out, the University reserves the right to assign parking stalls for use by service vehicles.

Parking Lot Assignments

21 Parking shall be assigned in accordance with the following priorities:

- (a) persons with a disability;
- (b) the president, provosts, vice presidents, vice provosts, University secretary, associate vice presidents, chief athletics officer, and deans or executive directors of University colleges, schools, and institutes;
- (c) Students on the basis of an on-line student sale until the total lot capacity of designated student lots are reached;
- (d) faculty and staff:
 - (i) faculty and staff will be assigned to available parking on the basis of years of service at the University;
 - (ii) faculty and staff whose parking stall or lot is closed in accordance with section 18 of this schedule, or whose assigned work has been transferred to another zone of the campus may transfer to another location with equivalent facilities if available. When more than one member is transferred at the same time, priority for available parking will be given on the basis of years of service at the University. Those not receiving equivalent assignment at that time will be given top priority for reassignment;
 - (iii) parking for faculty and staff who are going on a leave of absence will have parking reassigned to them on their return. If they require their stall during their leave, they must request retaining the stall at the time of the leave. All parking privileges revert to parking and transportation services during leaves. Written notification prior to leave and prior to return are required by parking and transportation services. Should the lot or stall be taken out of service during the leave, the member will be given priority in obtaining an equivalent stall or lot as if not on leave and according to the years of service at the University;
 - (iv) for retired faculty and staff, the assignment of parking privileges will be at the discretion of parking and transportation services;
 - (v) parking permits may be issued provided that all faculty and staff which have more seniority and have applied for a permit have been offered parking. Renewal of said permit is not automatic but rather must again meet the previously stated criteria.

22 Parking fees will be determined from time to time by the President.
