ROY S. MELDRUM } WHEREAS the Province
Deputy of Saskatchewan was,
Attorney General } by Royal Warrant, dated
the Twenty-fifth day of
August, 1906, granted and assigned The Armorial
Ensigns following, that is to say Vert three
Garbs in fesse Or, on a Chief of the last a Lion
passant guardant Gules; and

WHEREAS the Province of Saskatchewan adopted the flower known botanically as *lilium philadelphicum andinum* and popularly called the "prairie lily" as the floral emblem of the province by virtue of the *Floral Emblem Act*, being chapter 404 of the Revised Statutes of Saskatchewan, 1965; and

WHEREAS a committee of the Assembly was established by resolution of the Assembly dated February 28, 1968, and re-established by Order in Council 996/68 dated May 31, 1968, "to consider the matter of selecting a design for a distinctive flag for the Province of Saskatchewan"; and

WHEREAS the said committee recommended to the Government of Saskatchewan under date

of March 26, 1969, the adoption of a Provincial Flag based upon a design selected from amongst four thousand and twenty-five submissions invited by the Committee; and

WHEREAS it is expedient to adopt a flag of historical and regional significance as the Provincial Flag of the Province of Saskatchewan; and

WHEREAS it is desirable that such flag have a background of green and gold symbolic of the northern forested areas of the province and of the southern grain field areas, and that the flag should bear the shield of the Armorial Bearings of the Province granted by Royal Warrant in 1906 and carry in the fly the provincial floral emblem.

NOW KNOW YE, that by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province, We do by these Presents proclaim that the flag described and illustrated in the schedule hereto attached is hereby adopted as the Provincial Flag of the Province as and from the twenty-second day of September, 1969, to be flown and used on the express permission of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Saskatchewan on the advice of the Provincial Secretary.

OF ALL OF WHICH PRESENTS Our Loving Subjects of Our said Province and all others whom they may concern are hereby required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

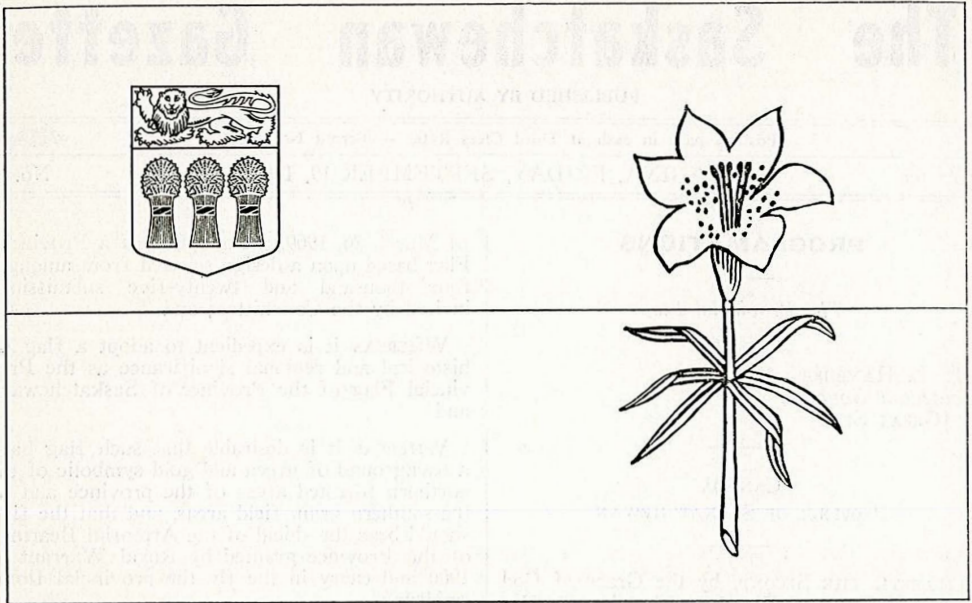
