

Routine Immunization Schedules

Vaccines help keep Saskatchewan residents healthy and protected against preventable diseases.

- Getting vaccines on time and following the recommended schedule gives you and your children the best protection against many serious and easily spread diseases.
- These vaccines are free and available through Public Health and some healthcare providers.

Childhood Immunization Schedule

2 months	DTaP-IPV-Hib (Diphtheria, Tetanus, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio & <i>Haemophilus influenza</i> type b) Pneu-C-15 (Pneumococcal conjugate 15) Rot-5 (Rotavirus)
4 months	DTaP-IPV-Hib (Diphtheria, Tetanus, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio & <i>Haemophilus influenza</i> type b) Pneu-C-15 (Pneumococcal conjugate 15) Rot-5 (Rotavirus)
6 months	DTaP-IPV-Hib (Diphtheria, Tetanus, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio & <i>Haemophilus influenza</i> type b) Rot-5 (Rotavirus)
12 months	MMRV (Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella) Meningococcal conjugate ACYW-135 (Meningococcal conjugate ACYW-135) Pneu-C-15 (Pneumococcal conjugate 15) Hepatitis A (if living in a SK First Nations community, in the Athabasca Health Authority or in a non-First Nations community in Northern SK (excluding Creighton, Air Ronge and La Ronge).
18 months	DTaP-IPV-Hib (Diphtheria, Tetanus, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio & <i>Haemophilus influenza</i> type b) MMRV (Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella) Hepatitis A (see above)
4-6 years	Tdap-IPV (Tetanus, Diphtheria, acellular Pertussis, inactivated Polio)
Grade 6	HB (Hepatitis B) HPV-9 (Human papillomavirus – 9 strains)
Grade 8	Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, acellular Pertussis)
6 months - 17 years	COVID-19 (yearly), Influenza (yearly)
Schedule Adult Immunization	
18 years & older	Influenza (yearly), COVID-19 (yearly) Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria, acellular Pertussis) every 10 years and in every pregnancy HPV-9 (Human papillomavirus – 9 strains for those younger than 27 years old) MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella for those born since January 1, 1970) IPV (inactivated Polio for eligible adults) Varicella (for eligible adults)
65 years and older	Influenza (yearly) (vaccine formulated for adults 65 years & older is recommended) COVID-19 (yearly) Pneu-C-21 (Pneumococcal conjugate 21) for adults 65 years & older who have never received any previous pneumococcal vaccines
