Laurier Donais has over 25 years' experience with the Government of Saskatchewan, starting with the Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming Authority in 1995. He has held executive positions within the Ministries of Agriculture, First Nations and Métis Relations, Labour Relations and Workplace Safety, Water Security Agency and Government Relations. Laurier has served on several boards and committees, including the Clarence Campeau Development Fund, the Welfare Rights Centre, the Financial Management Council and local charity and fundraising committees.



Laurier obtained his CPA-CA in 1993, a year after graduating with a Bachelor of Administration degree from the University of Regina. During his career in the Government of Saskatchewan, he has provided oversight to various projects such as the consolidation of labour legislation into *The Saskatchewan Employment Act*, amendments to the farmland ownership legislation, as well as the transfer of gas/electrical and plumbing services to the Technical Safety Authority of Saskatchewan. Laurier also provided leadership in program/service delivery in the agricultural sector, disaster assistance and regulatory services.

Laurier lives on the family farm near Balgonie, where he and his wife Lori raised their four children. In his spare time, Laurier enjoys spending time with family and friends, usually while camping, travelling or attending sport or cultural events.
