

Post-Secondary Education Planning Information for Students with Disabilities

Disability Advisor Information

Meeting individual accommodation needs often requires a team approach, given the various nature of disabilities. Parents, institution staff and administrators work closely with students and their families to navigate the education system and plan for a successful transition into post-secondary education.

Eligibility Requirements

Student aid is available to students with disabilities. Some features of student loans and grants are specific to eligible students with a verified permanent or persistent or prolonged disability status.

Disability advisors play an important role in guiding students with disabilities in obtaining the required documentation, including verification of either a permanent or persistent or prolonged disability and a list of needed accommodations (e.g., Confirmation of Need form), that are coordinated before classes begin.

Verification of Disability

Verification of a disability may include a [Verification of Disability](#) form, medical certificate, psycho-educational assessment or alternate documentation, such as a high school Individual Performance Plan (IPP).

This alternate document may allow the disability advisor to temporarily set up accommodations while waiting for the official psycho-educational assessment. All fees associated with verifying a disability will be eligible for reimbursement.

Students, parents, disability advisors and staff from high school and post-secondary institutions can securely share student information and documentation via the student's My Blueprint account, typically created in high school.
