Overview of Travel and Objectives

The Philippines is a market of strategic importance for SK with exports valued at C\$167.4 million in 2022. Over the last five years, exports have increased by 156% and the Philippines continues to be a key buyer of SK's potash.

- In 2022, SK served as Canada's largest exporter of potash, non-durum wheat and dry peas to the Philippines. Potash exports to the Philippines has grown more than 300% in the last five years - an impressive growth rate.

This was Minister Merriman's first mission to the Philippines. Mission objectives included to:

- engage with high level government officials to reinforce the Saskatchewan-Philippines relationship and explore opportunities to strengthen the bilateral relationship in trade, agriculture and food security and talent attraction;
- explore trade partnerships with Philippine companies and organizations to increase the demand and export of Saskatchewan products including potash and agricultural goods;
- profile Saskatchewan and highlight employment opportunities in the province's healthcare sector;
- support the official opening of Saskatchewan's Polytechnic's Philippines office and the Memorandum of Understanding between Saskatchewan Polytechnic and the Central Philippines University; and
- engage in meetings with Philippine post-secondary institutions and regulator partners to explore opportunities to align nursing programs and to develop pathways to fast-track Filipino health sciences graduates into Saskatchewan's labour market.

Travel Activity

- While in Manila the Minister conducted meetings with:
 - The Undersecretary of the Department of Science and Technology;
 - Director General of Technical Education and Skills Development Authority;
 - The Philippines Department of Agriculture;
 - Chairperson of the Commission on Higher Education;
 - The Secretary of the Department of Migrant Workers;
 - Director General of Asian Development Bank;
 - The Professional Regulatory Commission;
 - Canadian Chamber of Commerce in the Philippines; and
 - Chancellor of the University of Philippines Los Banos.
- Minister Merriman attended and brought greetings at a Meet and Greet event with some of the 129 Filipino healthcare workers who received conditional offers of employment from the Saskatchewan Health Authority while in Manila.
- Minister Merriman also provided remarks at a "Friends of Saskatchewan" reception to profile the trade and investment opportunities that are available in the province.
