RESTRUCTURING OF THE VILLAGE OF STEWART VALLEY

Pursuant to section 53 of *The Municipalities Act*, the Village of Stewart Valley has applied to restructure to be included in the Rural Municipality of Saskatchewan Landing No. 167.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 1 The Village of Stewart Valley (village) is restructured by inclusion of the village within the Rural Municipality of Saskatchewan Landing No. 167 (RM).
- 2 A new division, namely Division 7, is created in the RM effective July 1, 2023.
- 3 The boundaries of Division 7, being consistent with the boundaries of the former village, is described as:
Township 19, Range 13, the west half of the north-west quarter of Section 7; and
Township 19, Range 14, that portion of Section 12 lying north and east of Plan No. DS5197;
All West of the 3rd Meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan.
- 4 The former village is designated as a Special Service Area (SSA) for the purpose of the assignment of different tax rates, application of different tax tools and provision of different service levels.
- 5 The RM shall allocate to separate general ledger accounts all revenues collected for and on behalf of the SSA and all expenses paid for and on behalf of the SSA.
- 6 A statement of revenues and expenditures of the SSA shall be presented to council annually and any additional time(s) requested by council.
- 7 The terms and conditions of the original restructuring agreement entered into by the village and the RM are approved as shown in the attached Appendix A.
- 8 The restructuring will take effect on July 1, 2023.
- 9 The imposition of special levies is authorized on affected properties for a period not greater than 10 years or in the case of retiring a debt of the village, not greater than the term of the debt, for the following purposes: renewing municipal infrastructure, remedying and reclaiming contaminated sites, and settling any liabilities.
- 10 GRACE POTTER, of Gull Lake, Saskatchewan, is appointed as a transition official to work with the village administrator to facilitate the transition of the village into the RM in accordance with the requirements of the Ministry of Government Relations (ministry) and this Order including:
 - (a) the authority to access all village property, including any private premises where municipal records are located or stored, for the purpose of accessing and reviewing municipal records. "Municipal records" include any written, recorded or electronic records;
 - (b) the authority to remove municipal records from any place where they are located or stored for the purpose of reviewing the records;
 - (c) the authority to prepare or assist in the preparation of all documents and accounts as outlined by the ministry or required for the final audit on behalf of the village;
 - (d) the authority to contact any ministry, Crown corporation, agency, business, or other person to request or provide information regarding the village; and
 - (e) the authority to sign documents and approve payments if the administrator is unable to act.

11 The appointment of Grace Potter is in effect for the period between the signing of this Order and 30 days after the effective date of the restructuring of the village.

12 Remuneration for Grace Potter will be paid at a rate of \$60.00 per hour of work, in addition to travel at the current provincial government kilometre rate effective July 1, 2023, and reimbursement of related miscellaneous expenses.

13 Remuneration for Grace Potter shall be paid by the RM on approval of the ministry's supervising municipal advisor, after the effective date of the restructuring. The RM shall expense any payments to Grace Potter to the SSA ledger accounts.

14 JANELLE DESAUTELS, of Cabri, Saskatchewan, is appointed to adjust and settle the assets and liabilities of the village in accordance with legislation, requirements of the ministry, the restructuring agreement, and this Order, including:

- (a) the allocation of any grants, surplus funds, and reserves; and
- (b) the manner of dealing with liabilities through:
 - (i) the sale of, the disposition of, and conversion into money of sufficient assets to satisfy the liabilities of the village and pay the remuneration of the person appointed by this Order;
 - (ii) the ability to assess, levy, collect and enforce payment of any amount that may be required to satisfy the liabilities of the municipality, including all associated expenses and remuneration of the person appointed by this Order, when the realizable assets do not satisfy the liabilities pursuant to subsection 63(4) of *The Municipalities Act*; and
 - (iii) the authority to access the village funds and bank accounts after the effective date of restructuring, transfer funds to the RM and direct the RM regarding the intended use of the funds including such uses as SSA reserve or revenue accounts.

15 The appointment of Janelle Desautels is in effect for the period between the signing of this Order and the date the appointee submits a final report to the minister.

16 Remuneration for Janelle Desautels will be paid at a rate of \$60.00 per hour of work, in addition to travel at the current provincial government kilometre rate effective July 1, 2023, and reimbursement of related miscellaneous expenses.

17 Remuneration for Janelle Desautels shall be paid by the RM on approval of the ministry's supervising municipal advisor, after the effective date of the restructuring. The RM shall expense any payment to Janelle Desautels to the SSA ledger accounts.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT:

18 Under authority of subsection 7(2) of *The Local Government Election Act, 2015*, a by-election is not required to be held for the existing vacancy on the village's council.

19 An election be held on June 28, 2023, for a councillor to represent Division 7.

20 KAYLA POWELL, Administrator for the RM, is appointed as Returning Officer to conduct the election in accordance with *The Local Government Election Act, 2015*.

21 The term of office for the councillor representing Division 7 shall begin July 1, 2023, and shall expire at the time of the general election in 2024, and every four years thereafter.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED THAT:

22 The area of the RM shall be confirmed as follows:

Township 17, and those portions of Townships 18, 19, and 20, lying to the south of the north bank of Lake Diefenbaker and to the left of the left bank of Swift Current Creek and west of a line joining the intersection of the left bank of the Swift Current Creek and the south bank of Lake Diefenbaker to the intersection of the eastern boundary of the south-west quarter of Section 4-20-13 and the north bank of Lake Diefenbaker in Range 13, Townships 17 and 18, and those portions of 19 and 20 in Ranges 14 and 15 lying south of the north bank of Lake Diefenbaker;

All West of the 3rd Meridian, in the Province of Saskatchewan.

The seven divisions shall be confirmed as follows:

DIVISION 1:

Township 17 and that portion of the south half of Township 18 lying to the left of the left bank of the Swift Current Creek in Range 13.

DIVISION 2:

Township 17 and the south half of Township 18 in Range 14.

DIVISION 3:

Township 17 and the south half of Township 18 in Range 15.

DIVISION 4:

RESTRUCTURING AGREEMENT

*between the Village of Stewart Valley
and the
Rural Municipality of Saskatchewan Landing No. 167*

OPENING STATEMENTS

1 This agreement has been entered into by the Village of Stewart Valley (Village) and the Rural Municipality of Saskatchewan Landing No. 167 (RM) for the purpose of the dissolution of Village and the inclusion in the RM.

RESTRUCTURING PRINCIPLES

2 All parties agree to respectfully work together to negotiate sustainable, long-range mutual benefits to their citizens now and in the future.

3 Where one municipality has concerns on a matter, the other municipality will negotiate in good faith and work cooperatively toward addressing the concern in this agreement.

ESTABLISHMENT OF SPECIAL SERVICE AREA

4 The lands within the Village shall be designated as a Special Service Area (SSA) for the purposes of assigning different tax rates and/or application of tax tools and providing different service levels.

5 The designated Special Service Area shall be within the boundaries of the former Village.

ESTABLISHMENT OF NEW DIVISION

6 Upon inclusion, the lands of the former Village shall be considered a separate division within the boundaries of the RM and, as such, a councillor shall be elected to represent that division. The municipal costs of the election process are a charge on the RM as a whole.

GOVERNANCE

7 A municipal council consisting of a Reeve and seven (7) Councillors will govern the RM.

8 All bylaws and resolutions in force in the Village continue in force for one year after the date of inclusion or until they are sooner repealed and replaced.

9 The RM agrees that the bylaws in force in the RM will become applicable in the SSA on the expiry of one year after the date of dissolution, unless sooner replaced or amended specifically identifying the designated SSA of Stewart Valley.

10 The RM will assess the time and expense of administration to be split with the SSA, determining a percentage that will be used going forward, and may be modified or changed as deemed necessary.

DISPOSITION OF ASSETS

11 The assets and liabilities of the Village shall become the assets and liabilities of the RM upon dissolution of the Village. These assets will remain in the SSA.

12 Cash assets remaining subsequently to the settlement of the Village's assets and liabilities will be set aside for provision of services and/or benefits within the SSA.

13 All grants received by the RM in recognition of the former Village will be set aside for provision of services and/or benefits within the SSA.

SERVICE DELIVERY

- 14 The Village office will be closed and transferred to the RM office on the effective date of the restructuring.
- 15 The RM will ensure that fire protection services within the SSA are inclusive and consistent with fire protection service agreement currently established by the municipalities.
- 16 The RM will continue lease with the Happy Valley Senior Centre with all major maintenance being SSA responsibility and general maintenance being Happy Valley Seniors' responsibility. The five-year agreement with Happy Valley Seniors' will continue and may be modified or changed as deemed necessary.
- 17 The RM and Village agree to continue the operation of the Chinook Regional Library with the current split of expense staying the same for the SSA and RM and may be modified or changed as deemed necessary.
- 18 The RM shall ensure existing street lights remain within the SSA with the SSA paying the fee for the service.
- 19 The RM will provide street maintenance, snow removal, mowing/spraying services within the SSA boundaries, as well as any other duties to ensure the upkeep of the SSA.
- 20 The RM will ensure Chinook School Division current agreement for snow removal and mowing for 2022/2023 year will be fulfilled and may be modified or changed as deemed necessary.
- 21 The RM will continue garbage/recycle collection services with Triway's under the current contract, a five-year term plus two years that was signed in February 2021, within the SSA consistent with current arrangement and may be modified or changed as deemed necessary.
- 22 The RM will provide water and sewer system operation and testing within the SSA consistent with current arrangements and issue water/sewer/garbage bills bi-monthly to SSA consumers.
- 23 The RM will continue lagoon drainage agreement with S&K Valley Farms LTD. and may be modified or changed as deemed necessary.
- 24 The RM will continue Station Ground and Golf Course hay cutting agreement with Greg King/Mark Carlson and may be modified or changed as deemed necessary.

INTEGRATION OF EMPLOYEES

- 25 The Water Operator, Cory Cook, will continue as employee of the RM for water/sewer operations and testing and the RM may amend or terminate employment as deemed necessary.
- 26 The RM will continue to contract Sid Sirota for the certified water/sewer operations and testing within the boundaries of the SSA consistent with current arrangements and may amend or terminate the contract as deemed necessary.
- 27 The Administrator of the Village will not continue as an employee of the RM.
- 28 The Maintenance Operator/back up Water Operator of the Village will not continue as an employee of the RM.

AMENDMENTS

- 29 This agreement may be amended:
 - (a) by the agreement of the councils which are signatories to the agreement, prior to the application being forwarded to the minister for approval; and/or
 - (b) by the council of the RM after a two-year period from the effective date of the Minister's Order, when an amendment is in the best interest of the ratepayers of the SSA and the RM.

EFFECTIVE DATE

- 30 This agreement will come into effect on the date of inclusion as set out in the Minister's Order.

- (e) in cases where registered producers cannot determine the SR&ED contribution, provide that information when possible;
- (f) provide each registered producer with information identifying the percentage of the total levy that was used to fund SR&ED in the year; and
- (g) advise registered producers in which province the SR&ED was performed.
