Overview of Travel and Objectives

The meeting provided an opportunity to see the progress since the last in-person ministers' meeting in 2021, including the collaborative work to advance the Pan-Canadian Approach to Transforming Species at Risk Conservation in Canada and Supporting the expansion of Canada's network of protected and conserved areas, including through the Pathway to Canada Target 1 initiative.

Travel Activity:

The two-day meetings included:

- Panel discussion with Indigenous people about the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework and Biodiversity outcomes.
- Discussions of the KMGBF in a Canadian context and in relations to conservation efforts.
- Round table on biodiversity loss and outcomes in each jurisdiction.

The conference concluded with a joint communique, which the province signed onto after significant changes were made to align with Saskatchewan's perspectives.
