Overview of Travel and Objectives

Minister Skoropad had the opportunity to attend the Canadian Council of Fisheries and Aquaculture Minister's annual meeting. The CCFAM is a minister-led intergovernmental forum for collective action on aquaculture issues of national interest, composed of ministers from the federal, provincial and territorial governments.

Travel Activity:

The two day meetings included

- Presentations from leaders of National Indigenous Organizations and CCFAM ministers
- Federal updates on aquaculture and the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework
- Policy discussions around Aquatic Invasive Species and economic development
- A roundtable discussion about the future of fisheries and fish habitat.

The meeting concluded with a joint communique, which was supported by Saskatchewan.
