Crisis and Respite Services

Who We Are:

Crisis and Respite Services is a comprehensive crisis response system that includes person-centred assessment and stabilization, transition, interim, and respite services to support individuals who receive services from Community Living Service Delivery (CLSD).

Who We Serve:

Individuals who are clients of CLSD and have complex support needs and display dangerous or harmful behaviours that impact their ability to live and/or participate safely in their community, as well as those who require short-term residential options or respite.

Supports

Provided Include:

Planned year-round respite and seasonal respite in a camp setting, as well as stabilization, assessment, and transitional services. All services are provided through a 24 hour/day, 7 day/week home like environment that delivers person-centred, outcome-based services.

Planned Respite:

Southwood Home (Prince Albert) and Athabasca Home (Moose Jaw)

Operating year round, planned respite supports are provided to individuals whose families or care givers require a pre-planned break from caregiving. These homes offer planned and emergency residential support, in one-week blocks, or longer if necessary. Supports provided are person-centred and adapted based on the needs of the individual.

Seasonal Respite

Camp Buffalo (Buffalo Pound Lake) and Camp Thunderbird (Candle Lake)

Seasonal respite supports offered annually, up to five days, during the summer months with a focus of therapeutic, recreational, and outdoor leisure-based activities. Camp Buffalo is located in Buffalo Pound Provincial Park near Moose Jaw. Camp Thunderbird is located in Candle Lake near Prince Albert.

Stabilization and Assessment Services

Brigham Home (Moose Jaw) and McCallum Home (Saskatoon)

Supporting individuals who are at risk of losing or have lost their home or placement, these homes focus on stabilization and assessment offering responsive services for those with an immediate need, who require intensive support, due to dangerous or harmful behaviours. Following a stabilization period the focus of supports shifts to transition planning. These programs can support up to five individuals in each location depending on individual need and readiness to transition to their permanent home.

Southwood Transitional/Interim Housing

Southwood Home (Prince Albert)

This home provides up to five spaces to support individuals who require a transitional period such as when transitioning from the stabilization and assessment services or in-patient care. The home can also serve as a short-term interim residential option for individuals whose future home is not ready to accept them into placement. The focus of this “in between” support option is to prepare individuals for a transition and to support individuals to continue to build on their skills and strengths.

Accessing Crisis and Respite Services

The services provided by Crisis and Respite Services require a formal referral to access. Referrals are reviewed through a formal intake process. To access these services, please contact your CLSD case manager or one of the contacts listed here.
