

Radiation Worker Designation

In accordance with Section 2 of *The Saskatchewan Radiation Health and Safety Regulations, 2024*, any person who during the person's business or occupation may receive a radiation dose greater than the prescribed limit for the public, shall be designated as a radiation worker. To designate a person as a radiation worker, an owner of ionizing radiation equipment shall inform each individual in writing of the following information:

1. That the individual is a radiation worker
2. The risks associated with radiation to which the worker may be exposed during their work, including the risks associated with the exposure of embryos and fetuses to <https://www.cnsccsn.gc.ca/eng/resources/radiation/radiation-health-effects/>
3. The applicable effective dose limits and equivalent dose limits prescribed by *The Saskatchewan Radiation Health and Safety Regulations, 2024*
4. The worker's radiation dose levels
5. Whenever applicable, the rights and obligations of a pregnant radiation worker under the regulations and of the applicable effective dose limits prescribed

Effective Dose Limit

Person	Period	Effective Dose (millisiervert)
Radiation worker, including a pregnant radiation worker	(a) 1-year dosimetry period	50
	(b) 5-year dosimetry period	100
Pregnant radiation worker	Balance of pregnancy	4
A person who is not a radiation worker	1-calendar year	1
