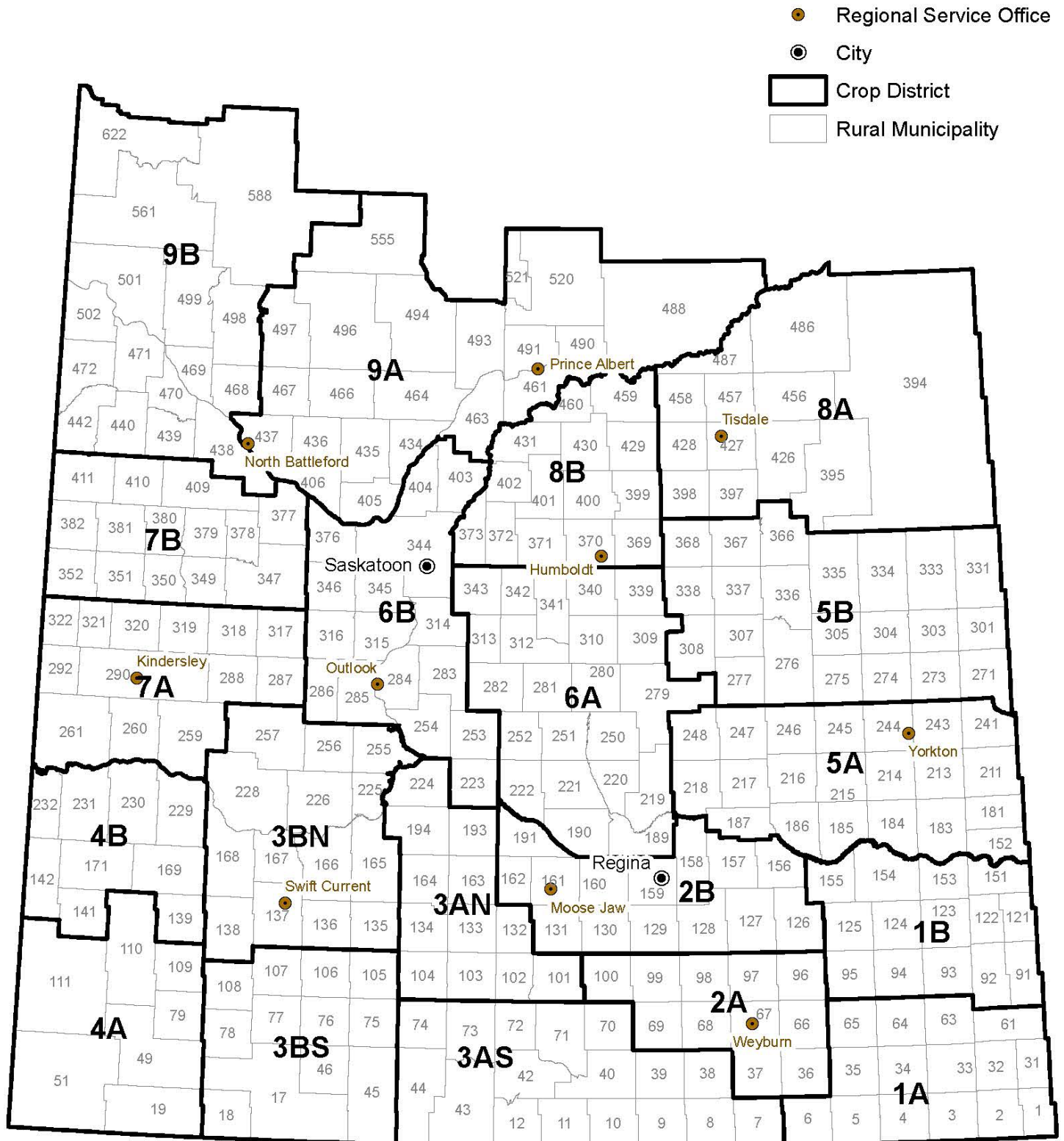

Lentil

The area harvested for lentils in Saskatchewan increased to 3.7 million acres in 2025 from 3.6 million in 2024, an increase of three per cent. Production in Saskatchewan rose to 2.9 million tonnes from 2.1 million tonnes in 2024.

Early indications show India, the United States and the European Union are the largest export markets for Canadian lentils; exports are up slightly to 2.1million tonnes compared to 1.8 million tonnes in 2024.

Stocks in Canada are forecast to increase to 1.2 million tonnes, increasing the stocks-to-use ratio to 47 per cent. Seeded acres in the United States saw an increase of 15 per cent for lentils, mainly in Montana. The yields in Montana are forecast to rise by 23 per cent from last year's production. The higher carryover may put downward pressure on prices for 2026-27.

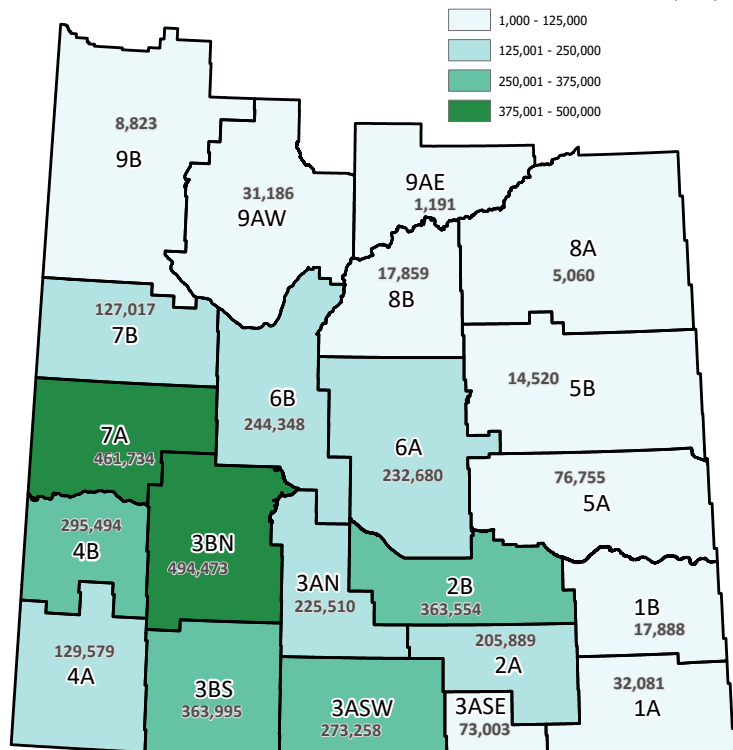

Dry Pea

Saskatchewan grew approximately 47 per cent of Canada's peas in 2025. CDC Meadow was the single largest variety, accounting for 14 per cent of provincial pea acres. Canadian yellow pea production is estimated to rise to 2.8 million tonnes. Green pea production is also expected to increase, reaching 500,000 tonnes, while specialty pea production is projected to grow to 250,000 tonnes.

Canadian supply levels are expected to be 4.1 million tonnes which is 22 per cent higher than last year. Exports will likely be similar to last year at 2.2 million tonnes. The two top markets in autumn 2025 were Bangladesh and India. Overall, carry-out stocks are estimated to rise sharply which will put downward pressure on pea prices. The expected average price for peas is likely to decrease by over 30 per cent from last year to \$280 per tonne.

Large supply levels may lead to fewer seeded acres in 2026 and carryover for next year could be low at around 11 per cent, which could put upward pressure on prices the following year. However, the demand is also influenced by desi chickpea and cowpea supplies which compete strongly with peas.

The United States Department of Agriculture estimates that their seeded area for peas rose by two per cent and production slightly rose by seven per cent in 2024, mostly coming from North Dakota. Peas from the United States compete with Canadian peas in China and the Philippines but overall, their exports are much lower than Canada's.

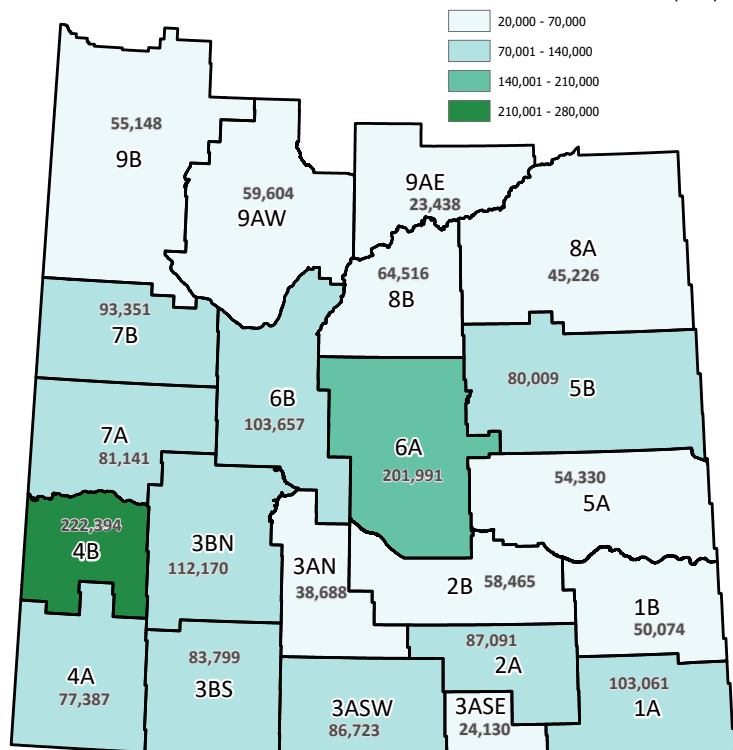

Soybean

The seeded area for soybeans in Saskatchewan rose from 67,000 acres in 2024 to 95,500 acres in 2025. Most of the soybeans are grown in southeast Saskatchewan where climatic conditions are better suited for production. NSC Warren RR was the most common soybean variety in Saskatchewan. Soybean production increased from 45,500 tonnes in 2024 to 108,200 tonnes in 2025.

Forecasted Canadian exports decreased from 5.421 million tonnes to 5.350 million tonnes in 2025. The 2025 carryover is forecast to decrease to 500,000 tonnes from 505,000 tonnes.

Tariffs from China, the United States and biofuel production leaves a lot of uncertainty in the future market for soybean. The crush was up in Canada this past year as it was in the United States.

Much of the soybean production in the United States had been going toward biofuels which resulted in tighter supplies; however, biofuel demand seems to be changing lately resulting in lower demand for soybean. China has been a large buyer for soybean and it is hoped they remain Saskatchewan's top export destination for 2025-26.

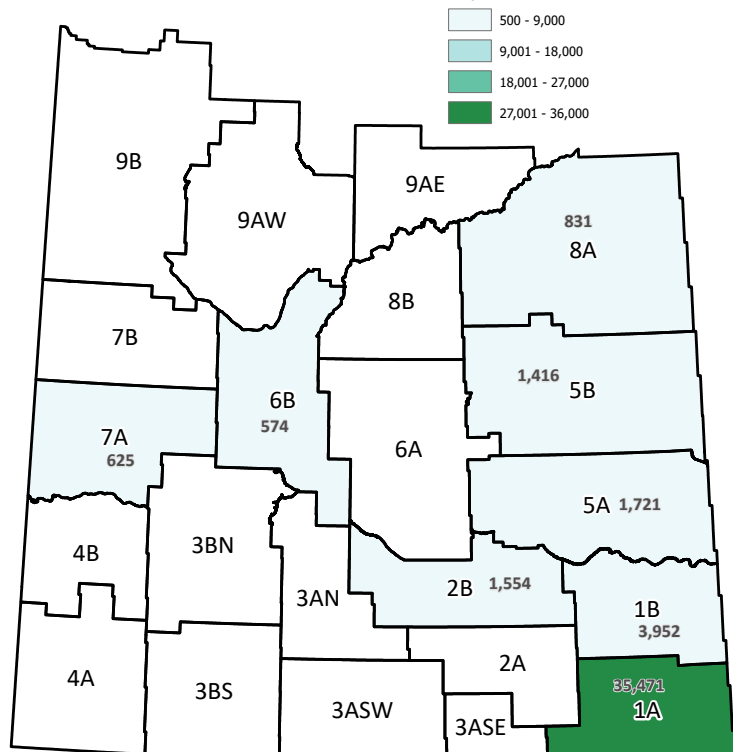
South America production and United States policies on biofuels may have an impact on demand and prices for soybean in the coming year. The dollar value in South America may be a hindrance for them to enter the Chinese market in a substantial way.

Faba Bean

Faba bean seeded area in Saskatchewan was 26,400 acres in 2024 but dropped to 15,300 acres in 2025. This may be due to competition from other high value crops such as canola. Snowbird and Fabelle were the most widely grown faba bean varieties.

Faba bean must also compete with yellow and green pea which is received more favourably in the marketplace due to processor acceptance. Faba beans require good moisture to grow and can reach some very lofty yields when compared to peas, but dry conditions can impact faba bean production significantly. Most faba bean production in Saskatchewan takes place in the black soil zone.

The transition to new low vicine/convicine varieties continues, with efforts to phase out older types that contain this anti-nutritional trait. However, because many growers save and replant the same seed each year, the overall shift to improved varieties has been slow and challenging.

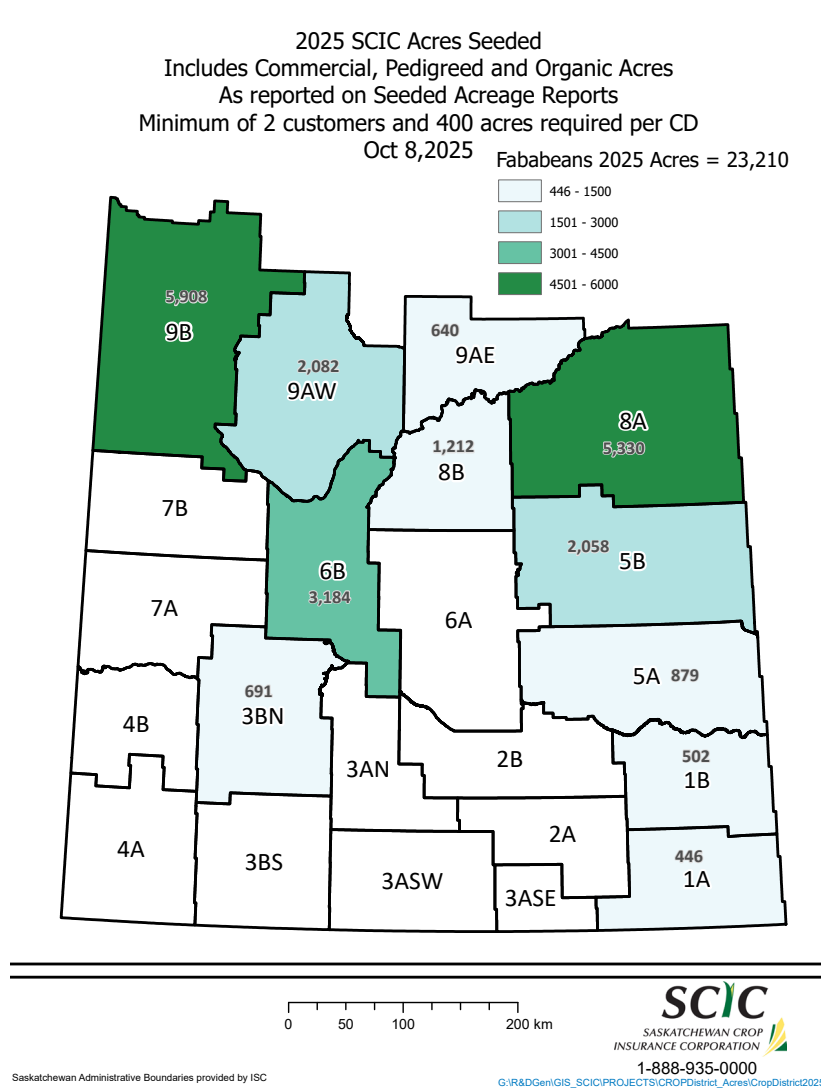
Furthermore, older varieties remain in greater demand as they are well suited for the feed industry. Research continues to evaluate the potential of newer varieties. The industry goal is to have the low vicine/convicine varieties accepted by the food processing market for higher value from protein fractionation.

Most faba bean food exports from Canada go to the United States and Egypt. Competition from Australia is substantial as they have reported an estimated 986,000 acres for 2024 with production at 694,000 tonnes and expect another 24 per cent increase in production for 2025. This hasn't affected pricing and faba beans continue to follow the feed-pea market prices.

Dry Bean

Seeded area for dry beans in Saskatchewan is comprised mostly of pinto and black bean with a small amount of navy bean in production as well. Seeded area of dry beans in Saskatchewan decreased from 18,700 acres in 2024 to 8,700 acres in 2025.

In Canada, estimated dry bean seeded area in 2025 dropped to 400,300 acres from 402,800 acres in 2024. Production dropped to approximately 352,000 tonnes from approximately 424,000 tonnes in 2024. Most of the decrease is attributed to lower acres and lower yields. In Saskatchewan, production decreased from 17,000 tonnes to 7,600 tonnes.

The stocks to use ratio is forecast to drop to five per cent, which will have some upward pressure on prices. Canada is not a major producer of dry bean in the world with Ontario, Manitoba and Alberta having most of the seeded area. Saskatchewan may see increased interest in dry bean production as irrigated acres start coming into production.

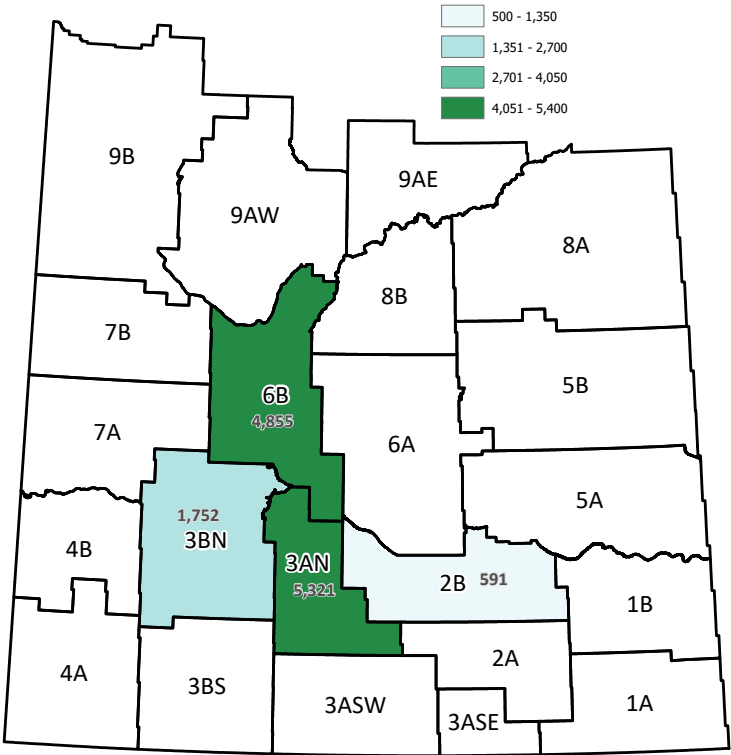
The United States and European Union are the largest export destinations and are expected to remain so for 2027. Smaller markets for Canada are Mexico, Italy and Japan.

Chickpea

Most of the chickpea production in Western Canada is in Saskatchewan and Alberta. In 2025, the seeded area in Saskatchewan increased from 411,000 acres to around 493,400 acres, an increase of 20 per cent. In Saskatchewan, yields increased from 1,504 lb./acre to 1,809 lb./acre. CDC Leader was the most widely grown chickpea variety.

The United States and European Union have been the largest buyers of chickpea from Canada to date. Most of the production in Saskatchewan is of the larger Kabuli type due to market demand.

Carryover stocks are forecast to be higher this year which will put downward pressure on pricing for the new year. Canada is a small producer of chickpea in the world and is generally a price taker.

Canada has an advantage with lower shipping costs to the United States because of Saskatchewan's proximity to the United States market.

In 2025, the United States Department of Agriculture forecasts increased seeded area in the United States to be eight per cent higher than 2024. Production estimates in the United States are forecast to be around 234,000 tonnes, up 32 per cent from 2024.

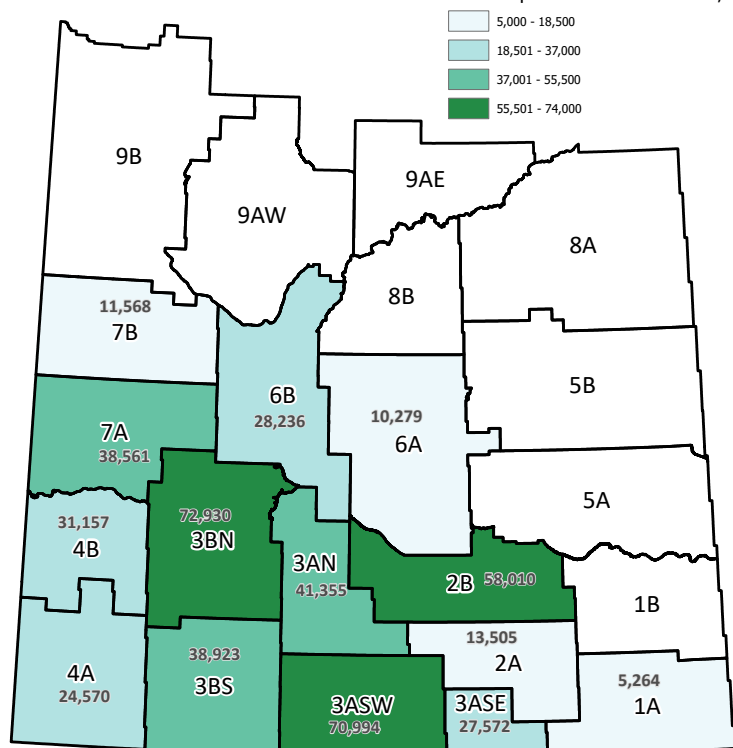

Hemp

Hemp production in Saskatchewan dropped to 6,700 insured acres in 2025 from 6,900 acres in 2024. In the Prairie region, seeded hemp acres have dropped from 70,000 acres in 2022 to 30,500 acres in 2024. Yields for the Prairies remained similar to 2024 at 1,237 pounds per acre.

Hemp production remains vulnerable to market fluctuations and imports from other countries. The market is on the cusp of returning to more average production now that a couple of years of low production have impacted supply.

Most of the hemp grown in Western Canada is exported to the U.S., Netherlands and Turkey. Researchers are exploring new uses for hemp, hoping to increase the demand for hemp in the coming years. Hemp fiber is a potential market but requires large amounts of hemp straw to be viable. Feed for livestock is another potential market opportunity that is currently being investigated.

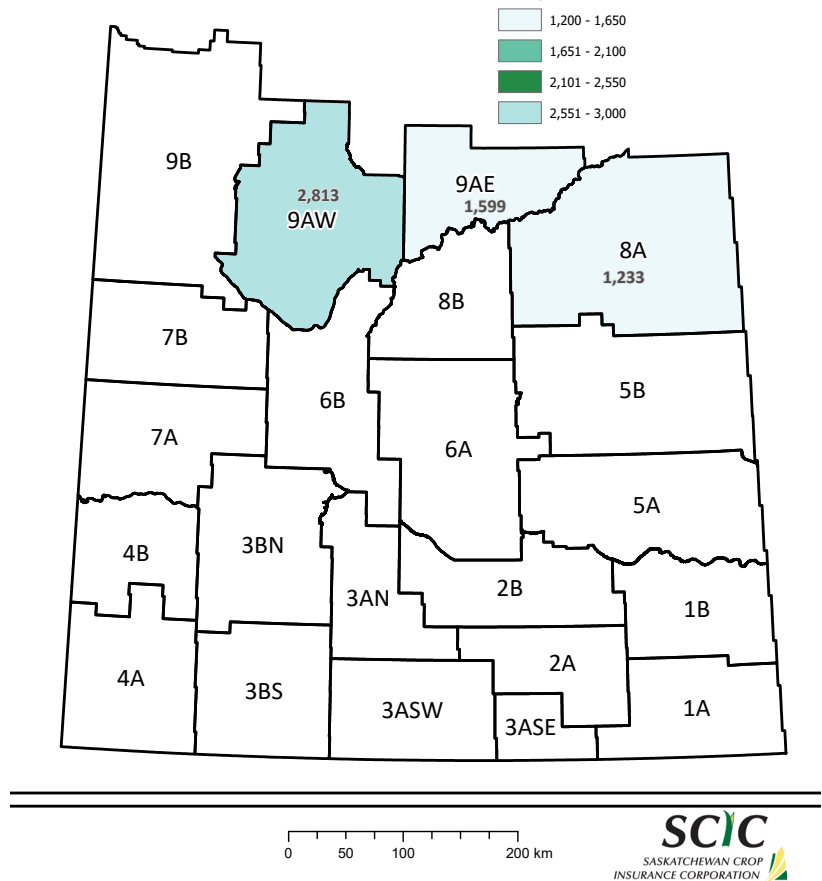
Because the United States are Canada's largest market, potential tariffs levied on hemp exports could hurt the hemp market significantly, so alternative markets will be very important.

Canola

The 2025 growing season in Saskatchewan began with improved spring moisture that supported early crop establishment, though conditions varied widely across the province. Some regions seeded into dry soil and did not receive adequate rainfall until mid-summer, resulting in uneven emergence and early staging, while other areas benefited from timely precipitation that supported favourable growth. Pockets of dryness persisted in central and southern regions, creating localized stress that reduced yields, but overall production was more stable than in 2024. Favourable late-season weather allowed for a timely harvest, and most canola was taken off in good condition.

According to the Saskatchewan's final Crop Report for 2025, 86 per cent of canola was graded number one, above the ten-year average of 81 per cent. Saskatchewan accounted for 56 per cent of national canola acres, with 12.2 million acres seeded in 2025, up 0.8 per cent from 2024. L340PC was the most widely grown canola variety in 2025.

The province contributed 56 per cent of national canola production at 12.2 million tonnes, a 25 per cent increase from 9.8 million tonnes in 2024, reflecting more favourable growing conditions. Canola yields in Saskatchewan increased 24 per cent to 44.4 bu./acre. Higher yields were likely due to timely precipitation late in the season, which helped push canola yields to a record high. Carry-out is projected to rise to 2.5 million tonnes, well above last year and the five-year average.

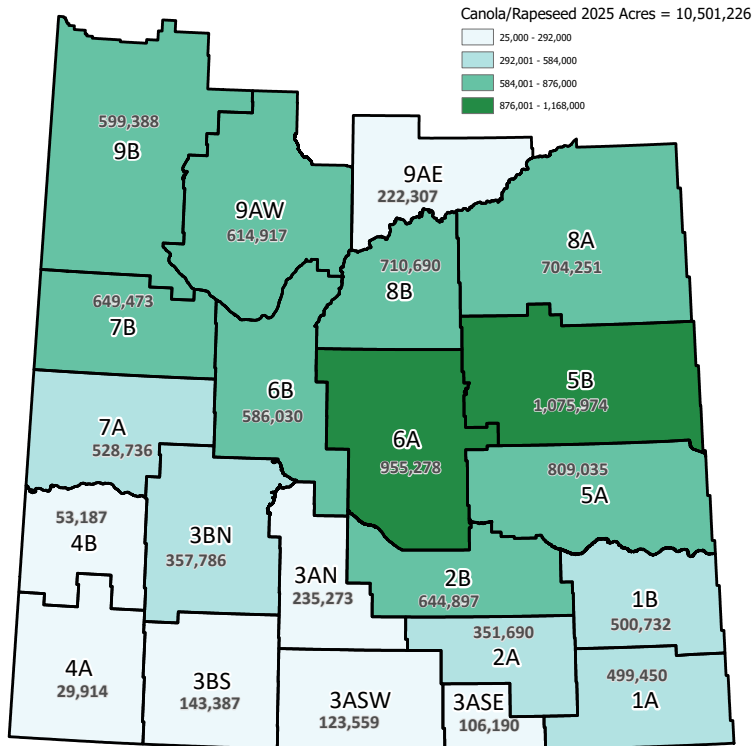
In trade, Saskatchewan exported \$1.3 billion in canola seed in 2024 (mainly to China, Japan, and Mexico), \$1.1 billion in oil (to the United States, Mexico, and China) and hundreds of millions in meal (to the United States, China and Southeast Asia). In 2025, the United States and China remained as key markets, though tariffs added uncertainty. Opportunities are emerging in southeast Asian markets, while Japan and Mexico continue as consistent buyers.

Flax

The 2025 growing season in Saskatchewan began with improved early moisture that supported crop establishment across much of the province. Conditions became variable through the summer, with dryness in central and southern regions limiting yields in some areas. Overall, yields were more stable than in 2024 and favourable late season weather allowed for a timely harvest, with most flax taken off in good condition.

Saskatchewan's final Crop Report for 2025 indicated that 94 per cent of the flax crop had been harvested, with nearly all graded as number one or two. In 2025, 536,900 acres of flax were seeded in Saskatchewan, a 29 per cent increase from 417,855 acres in 2024, though still below the five-year average of 616,920 acres. Saskatchewan accounted for 87 per cent of Canada's flax acreage. CDC Rowland was the most widely grown flax variety, followed by CDC Glas.

Provincial production reached 375,600 tonnes, a 92 per cent increase from 196,000 tonnes in 2024. Average yields were 27.8 bu./acre, higher than both the five-year average of 19.0 bu./acre and the 2024 yield of 18.7 bu./acre. Carry-out is expected to rise notably to 195.0 thousand tonnes.

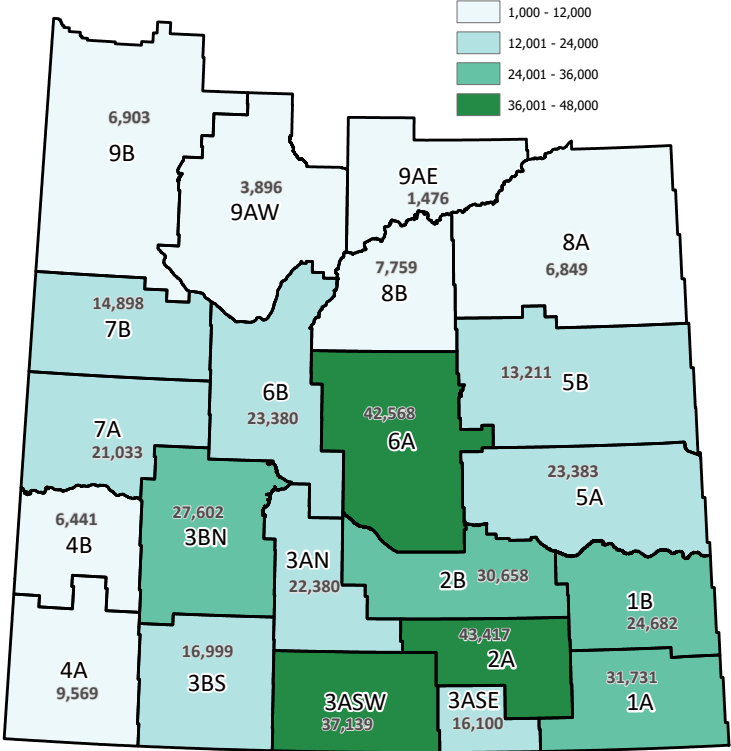
Canada's flax exports in 2024 were valued at US\$154 million, with the United States (about 70 per cent), China (15 per cent) and Belgium (10 per cent) as the main buyers. These markets are expected to remain dominant in 2026 despite tariff uncertainty and rising global competition.

Mustard

The 2025 growing season in Saskatchewan began with reduced seeded acres and continued dry conditions across most mustard-growing regions. Hot, arid weather stressed the crop, resulting in lower yields and a significant decline in production compared to the previous year. Despite this, dry late-season weather provided excellent harvesting conditions, allowing the crop to be taken off in good quality, though in smaller volume.

Mustard acreage in Saskatchewan fell 43 per cent, from 409,700 acres in 2024, to 233,800 acres in 2025, well below the five-year provincial average of 330,900 acres. Production was 89,700 tonnes, down 34 per cent from 2024. Yields averaged 847 lb./acre, an improvement over the 740 lb./acre in 2024. Andante was the most grown yellow mustard variety, and Centennial Brown was the most grown brown mustard variety.

Saskatchewan accounted for 65 per cent of Canada's seeded mustard acres, with Alberta making up the remainder. Of Saskatchewan's mustard area, 57 per cent was yellow, 27 per cent brown and 17 per cent oriental.

Canada's 2024 mustard exports, valued at about US\$298 million, were led by yellow mustard to the United States, brown mustard to Belgium and the Netherlands and oriental mustard to Japan, with these four countries remaining the dominant markets. The United States alone accounted for roughly half the value, making it Canada's largest buyer.

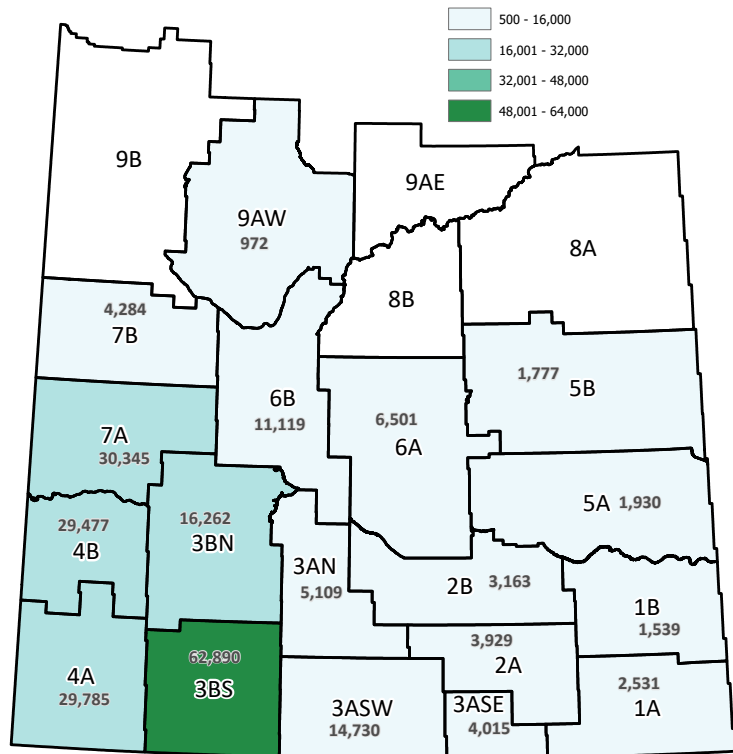

Winter Wheat

Winter wheat is primarily grown in the east central region, particularly in areas with higher livestock production. Poor moisture conditions since the fall of 2021 led to a decline in winter wheat acres; down to as low as 50,300 acres in 2023. However, conditions have now improved and acreage increased to 96,500 acres in 2024 and once again in the fall of 2025 to 126,300 acres.

Winter wheat production for 2025 (2024 fall seeded crop) is estimated to be 129,600 tonnes, down from 136,400 tonnes in 2024 (2023 fall seeded crop). The loss in production is due to the decrease in yield from 54.6 bu./acre to 42.1 bu./acre in 2025.

Winter wheat must be seeded in the fall to vernalize (expose to cold temperature) the kernel which allows the crop to produce a head and eventually kernels the following summer. Without vernalization, the plant would not produce heads normally and only be useful for grazing.

Winter wheat is not as winter hardy as fall rye and requires more adequate soil moisture to begin germination and should be seeded as early as possible to allow the proper growth before the soil temperature drops.

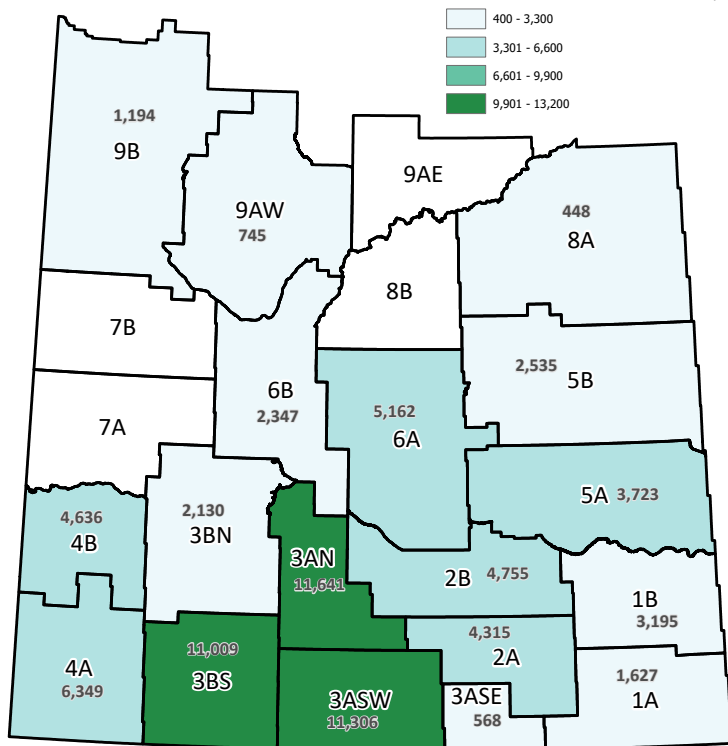

Durum

Saskatchewan has the perfect weather and climate for durum production, especially the southern regions where the soil types, moisture restrictions and growing season length allow for superior quality durum. Saskatchewan produces high quality durum that has excellent milling qualities, high semolina yield and other qualities sought after by processors. Durum produced in Saskatchewan is eventually used to make a wide variety of products, including dried pasta, fresh pasta, couscous and baked bread.

Seeded acreage for durum remained consistent at around 5.118 million acres in 2025 up from 5.115 million in 2024, this is the largest acreage since 2016. Acreage has steadily increased since 2020, likely due to the dry growing conditions lowering the acreage of less drought tolerant crop types. The most grown variety of durum is CDC Defy, which has overtaken Transcend. AAC Stronghold, AAC Grainland and CDC Precision still have strong acreages.

The 2025 durum production was the largest since 2020 due to less extreme temperatures throughout the summer and timely rains late in the season. However, for many producers in the durum growing region these rains came too late to save their yield potential. The average yield across the durum growing region rose to 39.6 bu./acre in 2025 from 35.8 bu./acre in 2024. This increase in yield resulted in an overall production of 5.4 million tonnes, up from 4.9 million tonnes in 2024.

Poor harvest conditions resulted in a decline in durum grades. The Saskatchewan Crop Report indicated that only 23 per cent of durum graded as number one, 32 per cent graded as number two and 34 per cent as grade three.

Italy, Algeria, Morocco and the United States remain the largest importers of Canadian Durum.

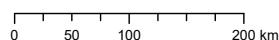
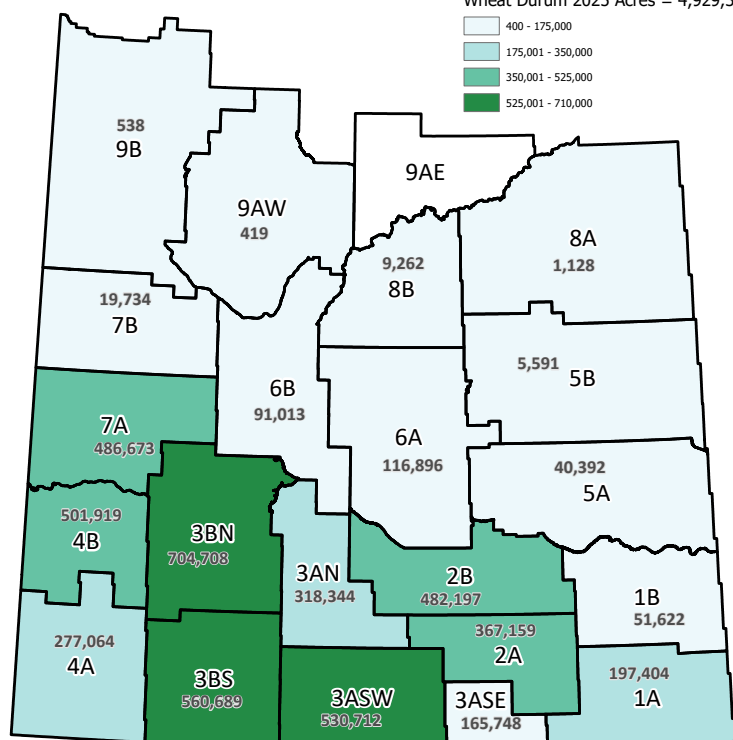
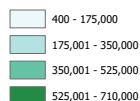

Oats

Saskatchewan represents nearly half of the total oat crop area in Canada each year. In 2025, the oat acreage saw a slight rebound, resulting in 1.285 million acres compared to 1.263 million acres in 2024. This increase in acreage coupled with improved yields resulted in oat production increasing to over 1.7 million tonnes in 2025. Yields improved significantly in 2025 reaching an average of 101 bu./acre. Due to rain during harvest, overall grades for oats were poor with only 35 per cent graded as number one and 55 per cent graded as number two.

Oats grown in Saskatchewan supply three primary markets: milling oats for human consumption, pony oats (feed for high-end racehorses) and high yielding feed oat varieties. CS Camden is still the most popular variety grown in Saskatchewan. However, CDC Arborg has steadily increased in acreage since 2019 and is almost overtaking CDC Camden in acreage.

Most oats produced in Saskatchewan are exported to the United States where they are milled into value added products. Mexico and Chile are the next two largest importers and both markets are growing. The oat market is also growing in Japan where consumers are heavily focused on the health benefits of oat-based food products.

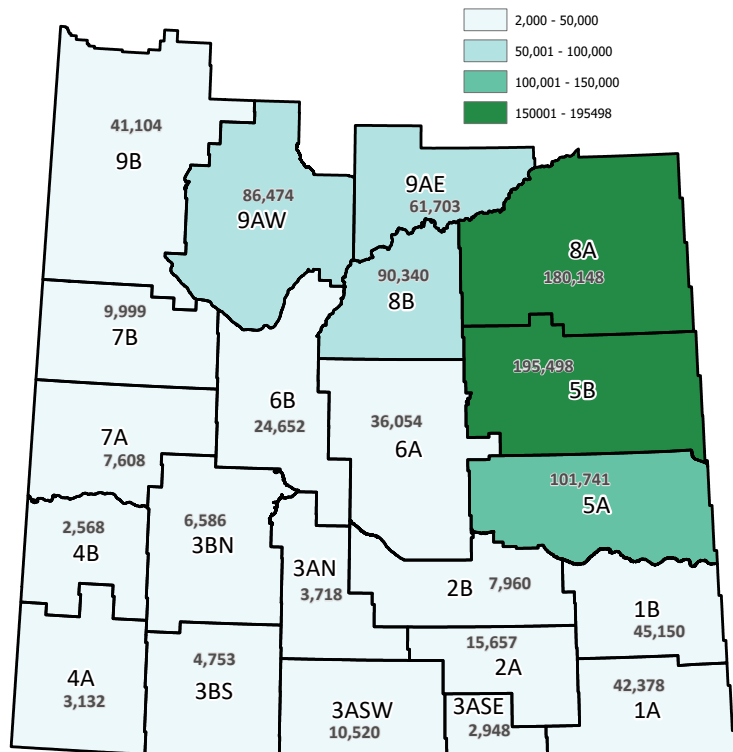
The economic impact of oats in Canada is roughly \$4.2 billion and employs more than 22,000 people.

Barley

Seeded acreage of barley in Saskatchewan decreased again in 2025 to 2.25 million acres from 2.31 million acres in 2024. Despite the decrease in acreage, barley production was up in 2025 to 3.5 million tonnes, compared to 2024 which saw production at 3.0 million tonnes. This production increase was due to the yields reaching an average of 78.2 bu./acre, up from the 64.9 bu./acre seen during the 2024 harvest.

Spring 2025 began with warm, dry conditions that aided seeding, followed by timely late June to July moisture and cooler temperatures. These factors led to improved kernel plumpness, better test weights and grain quality conducive to malting. The Saskatchewan Crop Report stated that 27 per cent of the barley crop from 2025 was selected for malt. This is typical although malt barley varieties represent more of the barley acreage in Saskatchewan, most barley grown enters the feed market.

China remains the dominant international market, accounting for the majority of Canadian barley exports. Other export markets include the United States and Japan. Exports to the United States were comparatively subdued due to stronger corn production drawing traditional feed demand. Japan remains a solid buyer, especially for food and malt grade barley.

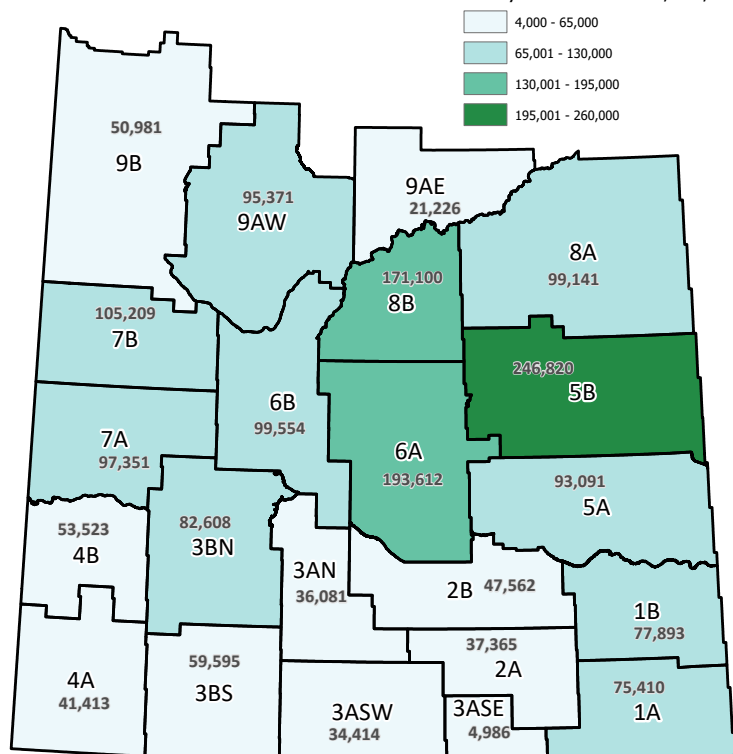

Fall Rye

Fall rye is a winter cereal crop that can make use of moisture from winter and early spring precipitation. During the spring thaw, the crop begins to quickly grow and build potential yield. Fall rye is protected from dry conditions in late July and August due to maturing earlier than spring-seeded crops. However, the risk of poor crop development in the fall due to inadequate moisture, can lead to increased winter kill and a delayed harvest the following year.

Fall rye uses nutrients and water efficiently and the crop also responds well to proper agronomic management. With the shift from open-pollinated varieties to hybrid varieties, producers find these varieties need a little more attention but considerably outperform older varieties.

Yields remained steady in 2025 (2024 seeded crop), with yields averaging 54.9 bu./acre. Seeded acreage in the fall of 2024 was a total of 141,600 acres but only 118,700 acres survived the winter and remained by the spring of 2025. The table below includes data for both spring and fall rye.

The harvested crop in 2025 had an estimated production of 139,800 tonnes, this is an improvement over production in 2024. Fall rye seeded acreage for 2025 is estimated to be roughly 118,000 acres. Precipitation received in August allowed proper soil moisture conditions for suitable crop establishment. Producers are hoping for adequate snow coverage to allow for the largest chance of winter survival.

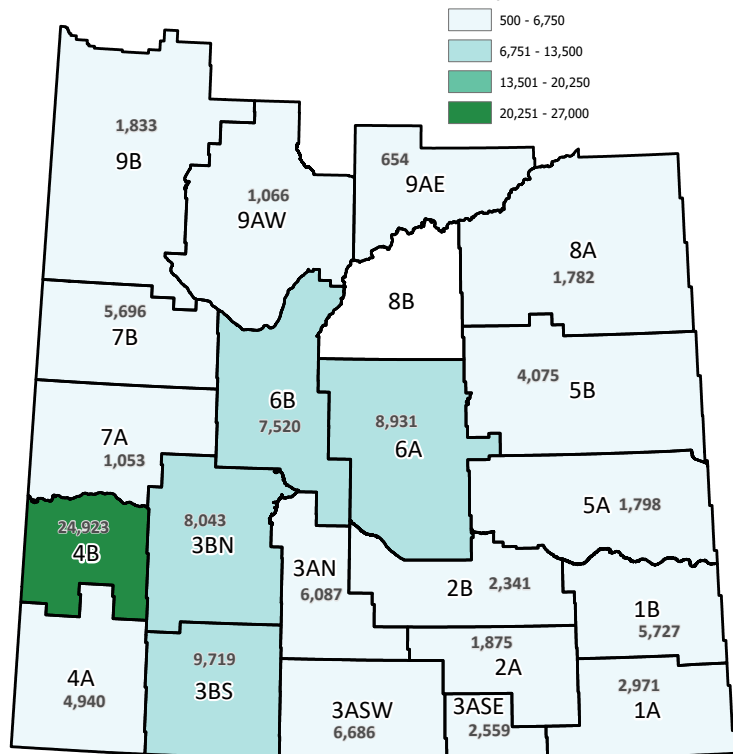
The United States are still the top exporting market for fall rye, purchasing nearly all of Canada's exports. Japan and Korea are the next two largest importers.

Canary Seed

Canary seed was first introduced in Canada in the 1970s and has since been bred and adapted for suitable growing on the Canadian prairies. Since introduction, seed varieties have been developed through traditional methods at the University of Saskatchewan's Crop Development Centre.

Canary seed grows well on heavier soils that can hold moisture, but it is sensitive to dry conditions. The wet spring conditions delayed seeding but also allowed for a good start to the crop for most of the canary seed growing region. Areas that were drier, seeded more quickly but saw a slow start to crop development.

Saskatchewan has the most canary seed acreage across the three prairie provinces. Seeded acreage was up from 280,200 acres in 2024 to 307,500 acres in 2025. Increased seeded acreage along with strong yields has raised the overall production estimate to 226,200 tonnes. This is the highest production estimate since 2020.

Regular "hairy" canary seed still makes up the majority of harvested acres but "glabrous" varieties that cause less irritation during handling and harvest are narrowing the difference in acreage each year, as producers see improved performance in newer varieties. In 2016, hairless varieties, when dehulled, were approved for human consumption in Canada and the United States. The human consumption market is still limited, but it is growing year after year with the advocacy and promotion by Alpiste Canada and the Canary Seed Development Commission of Saskatchewan.

Saskatchewan produces almost all the canary seed in Canada. Exports are expected to remain stable at around 135,000 tonnes for 2025-26. Mexico, China, Belgium, Brazil, Spain, United States and Colombia are the largest export markets for canary seed as they have large populations of caged birds.

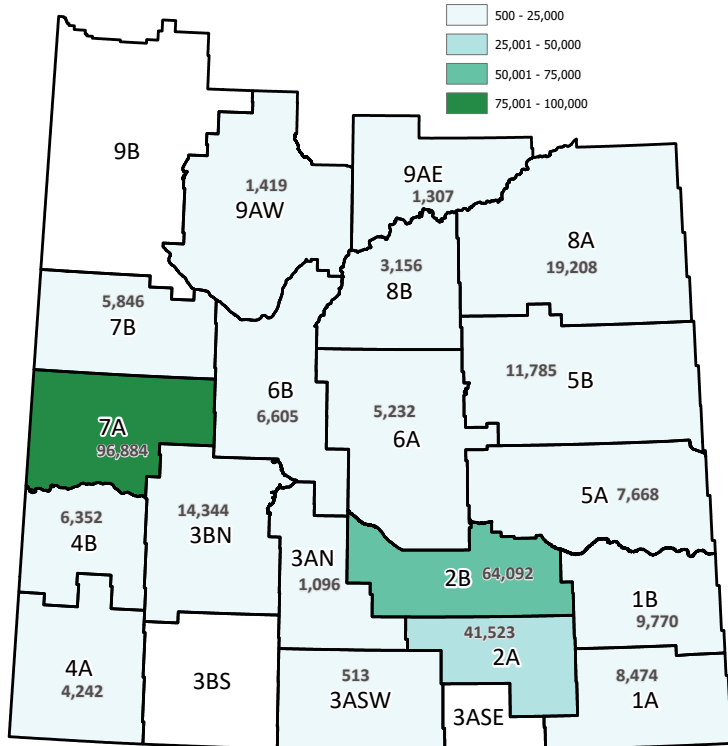

Spring Wheat

Spring wheat is widely grown across Saskatchewan with the highest concentration of the crop in central and northern areas of the province where soil types and precipitation allow for larger yields. Canada Western Red Spring is the most common class grown in the province, however there are several classes of wheat grown in Saskatchewan and Western Canada. These different classes allow for multiple-end uses which help strengthen the wheat industry both domestically and internationally. Saskatchewan produced Canada Western Red Spring wheat has superior milling performance, a high flour yield and minimal protein loss when milled into flour.

Seeded acreage of spring wheat in 2025 fell slightly to 8.7 million acres from 8.9 million acres in 2024. While seeded acreage decreased, overall production increased in 2025 due to improved yields at 55.8 bu./acre up from 49 bu./acre.

Spring wheat production in 2025 was 12.72 million tonnes up slightly from 11.88 million tonnes in 2024. Crop growth was hampered early in the spring due to abnormally dry conditions, but as moisture was received and temperatures stayed out of the extremes, the wheat crop rebounded nicely. The Saskatchewan Crop Report indicated that 63 per cent of spring wheat was graded as number one and 29 per cent as number two.

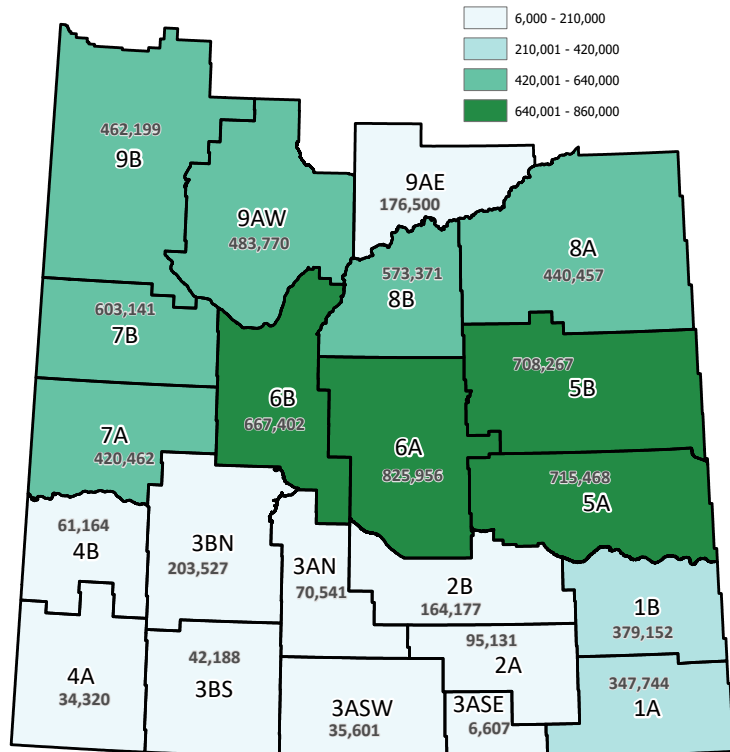
China and Indonesia continue to be the largest importers of Saskatchewan grown wheat followed by Japan, Bangladesh and the United States. Global production for wheat was high in 2025, and this is likely to put a strain on the export market.

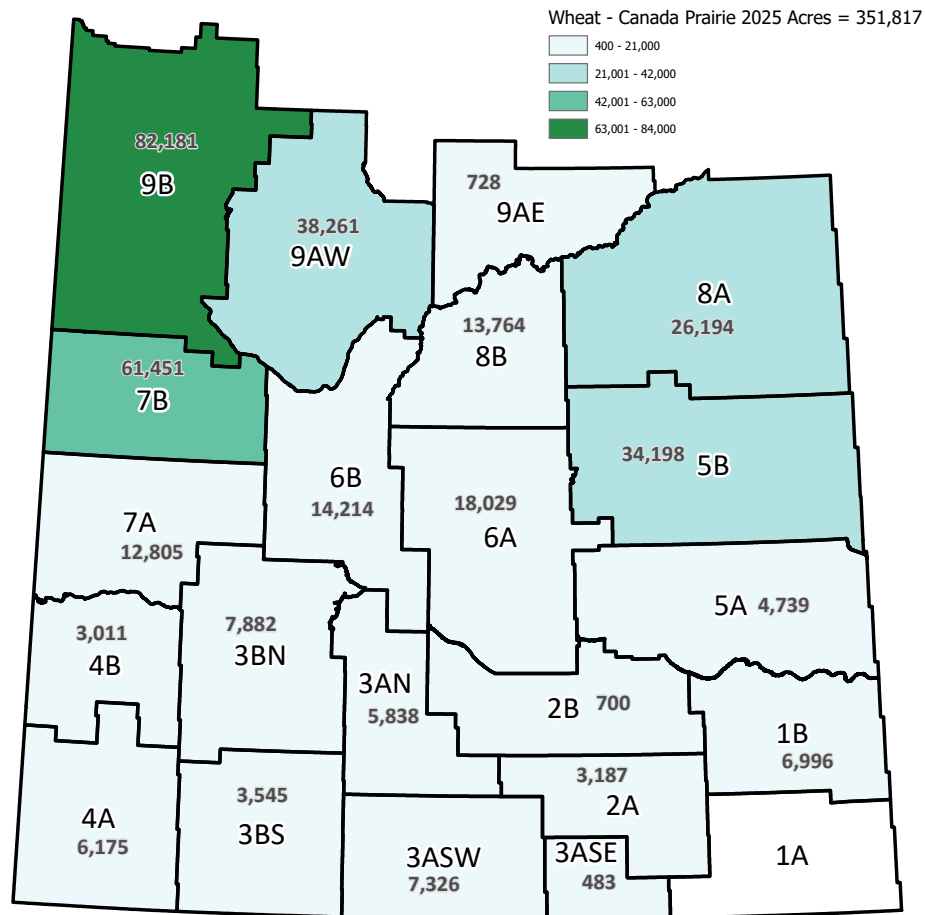

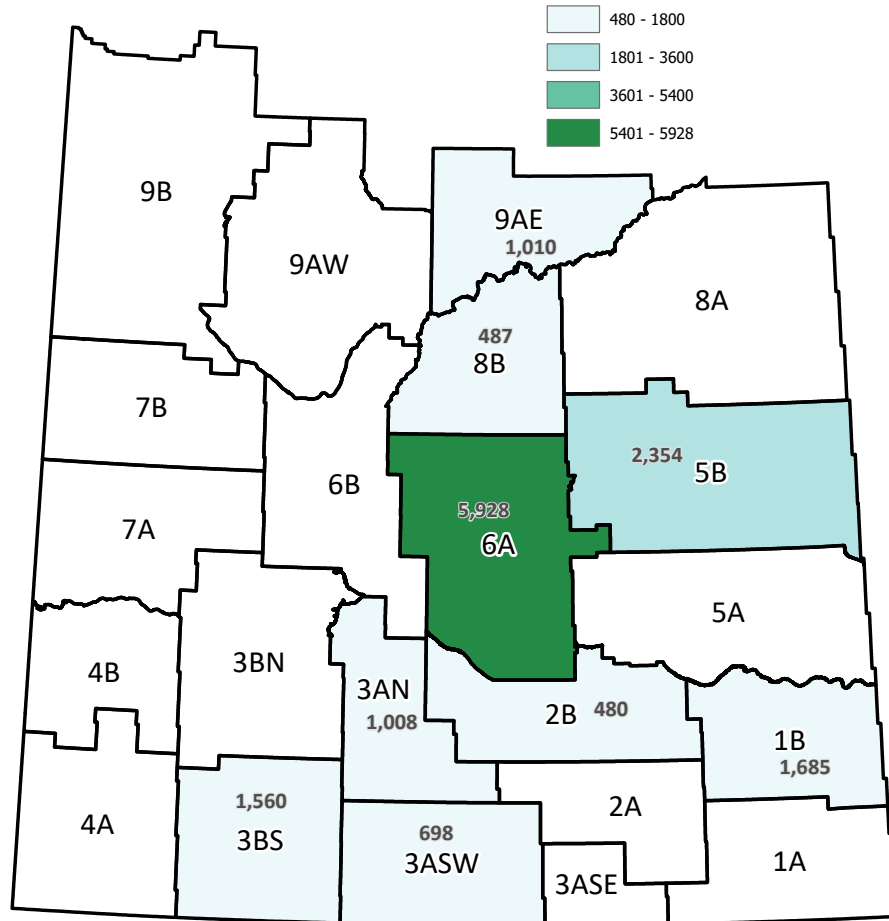
