Overview of Travel and Objectives

The United States (U.S.) is SK's most important trading and investment partner. In 2024, SK exported \$26.7 billion (B) (58% of all exports) to the U.S and imported \$13.3B (81% of all imports) from the U.S.

CeraWeek is one of the world's most significant energy conference, bringing together global leaders to discuss the future of energy.

Mission objectives included:

- Promote SK as a safe and reliable source of oil and gas and critical minerals, such as uranium and lithium.
- Showcase SK's importance in North American energy security.
- Highlight the importance of the Canada/SK-U.S. trading relationship and that maintaining fair and open trade is in the best interest of Canada and U.S.
- Emphasize how tariffs will be harmful to both Canada/SK and the U.S., driving up prices of energy, food, and household necessities on both sides of the border.
