Overview of Travel and Objectives

The Canadian Association of Energy Contractors (CAOEC) is the trade association for the Canadian energy services industry operating close to the wellhead from coast to coast to coast. With 300+ member organizations, CAOEC represents drilling and well servicing explorers and producers on land and offshore.

In 2024, Saskatchewan produced an average of 449,000 barrels of oil per day, supported by an estimated \$4.0 billion in capital investment, roughly 1,300 oil wells drilled, and over 26,000 direct and indirect jobs. The value of Saskatchewan's produced oil and gas in 2024 was \$13.5B. Saskatchewan has a Growth Plan goal of 600,000 barrels of oil produced per day by 2030.

The Government of Saskatchewan has taken steps to diversify its energy sector, on the strength of the oil and gas industry. Saskatchewan is seeing increasing exploration of lithium, helium, geothermal, and hydrogen. Saskatchewan also plays a prominent role in the global nuclear fuel supply chain, as the second largest producer of uranium in the world and home of the world's highest grade uranium resources.

Premier Moe travelled to Calgary to meet with industry, advance Saskatchewan's relationships and identify opportunities for further growth and investment.

While in Calgary, Premier Moe participated in:

- The CAOEC spring luncheon, where he delivered a keynote address; and participated in a fireside chat with industry representatives.
- Industry roundtable with the theme of "Saskatchewan's Energy Future" including CAOEC and Explorers and Producers Association of Canada (EPAC) members.
- Meeting with Saskatchewan energy stakeholders and companies interested in doing business in Saskatchewan.
