

## Statutory Declaration

**NOTE:** Section 131 of the *Criminal Code* provides a person commits perjury by making a false statement with intent to mislead, under oath or solemn affirmation in a statutory declaration, knowing that the statement is false. A person who commits perjury is guilty under section 132 of the *Criminal Code* of an indictable offence and may be liable to imprisonment for up to 14 years.
