Overview of Travel and Objectives

Enserva is the voice of Canadian energy services, supply, and manufacturing companies and its vital workforce. As an industry association, Enserva plays a pivotal role in elevating the profile and visibility of the entire energy services, supply, and manufacturing sector. Enserva bridges the gap between government and industry by demonstrating the broader implications of public policy.

The Government of Saskatchewan has taken steps to diversify its energy sector, on the strength of the oil and gas industry. Saskatchewan is seeing increasing exploration of lithium, helium, geothermal, and hydrogen. Saskatchewan also plays a prominent role in the global nuclear fuel supply chain, as the second largest producer of uranium in the world and home of the world's highest grade uranium resources. Premier Moe travelled to Calgary to meet with industry, advance Saskatchewan's relationships, and identify opportunities for further growth and investment.

In 2024, Saskatchewan produced an average of 449,000 barrels of oil per day, supported by an estimated \$4.0 billion in capital investment, roughly 1,300 oil wells drilled, and over 26,000 direct and indirect jobs. The value of Saskatchewan's produced oil and gas in 2024 was \$13.5 billion. Saskatchewan has a Growth Plan goal of 600,000 barrels of oil produced per day by 2030.

Travel Activity

While in Calgary, Premier Moe participated in:

- Providing the keynote speech at the Enserva Speaker Series event on energy development and role that Saskatchewan plays in Canada becoming a global energy supplier.
- Participation in a panel discussion with industry and Premier Danielle Smith about joint commitments to encourage energy production growth in their respective provinces.
- Participated in a roundtable with members of the entire energy supply chain regarding the critical role of energy development across Canada.
- Participation in the Global Partnership Reception. The reception included outreach to Heads of State and diplomatic staff from several countries.
- Meeting with energy stakeholders and companies interested in doing business in Saskatchewan.
