Overview of Travel and Objectives

After the 2025 Canadian federal election, Saskatchewan released its “Strong Saskatchewan, Strong Canada Plan” – 10 key policy changes the federal government must make to reset Ottawa’s relationship with Saskatchewan.

Prime Minister Mark Carney also committed to making Canada an “energy superpower”. The Government of Saskatchewan supports this goal and is negotiating on federal policy changes that would make this commitment achievable.

In 2024, Saskatchewan produced an average of 449,000 barrels of oil per day, supported by an estimated \$4.0 billion in capital investment, roughly 1,300 oil wells drilled, and over 26,000 direct and indirect jobs. The value of Saskatchewan’s produced oil and gas in 2024 was \$13.5 billion. Saskatchewan has a Growth Plan goal of 600,000 barrels of oil produced per day by 2030.

Premier Moe and Deputy Premier Reiter travelled to Calgary to meet with the federal government to advance the Strong Saskatchewan, Strong Canada Plan. Premier Moe and Deputy Premier Reiter also travelled to meet with industry to advance Saskatchewan’s relationships and identify opportunities for further growth and investment, including the goal of making Canada an energy superpower.

Travel Activity

While in Calgary, Premier Moe and Deputy Premier Reiter participated in:

- Meetings with the federal government on advancing federal-provincial relations including the Strong Saskatchewan, Strong Canada Plan. Meeting attendees included:
 - Hon. Tim Hodgson, Minister of Energy and Natural Resources;
 - Marc-Andre Blanchard, Chief-of-Staff to Prime Minister Mark Carney;
 - Christiane Fox, Deputy Clerk of the Privy Council and Associate Secretary to the Cabinet and Deputy Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs.
- Attendance at a policy panel discussion with the Japanese Ambassador to Canada and the Acting Indian High Commissioner to Canada.
- Meeting with Saskatchewan energy stakeholders and companies interested in doing business in Saskatchewan.
