Overview of Travel and Objectives

The purpose of this travel was for Premier Scott Moe to attend the 2025 Summer Meeting of the Council of the Federation (COF).

Established in 2003, COF comprises the 13 Premiers of Canada's Provinces and Territories (PTs). It is a forum for managing PT relations with the federal government, reinforcing the work of sectoral forums, and providing leadership on issues of importance to Canadians.

The meeting was held in Huntsville, Ontario, and presented an opportunity to discuss the overall state of the Canadian federation, including projects of national significance, internal trade and labour mobility, and emergency management.

Saskatchewan attended the meeting with the primary objective of focusing on areas that are of critical concern to the Province, including removing United States (US) and Chinese tariffs on Canadian goods. Saskatchewan also emphasized the importance of the federal government respecting PT jurisdiction and priorities and not making decisions that would disproportionately impact one region or sector.

The COF meeting was preceded by a First Ministers' Meeting focused on Canada-US relations and major projects of national interest.

Saskatchewan also signed four Memorandums of Understanding:

- Economic Cooperation Memorandum of Understanding: Manitoba and Saskatchewan;
- Memorandum of Understanding Between Arctic Gateway Group Limited Partnership, by its General Partner Arctic Gateway Group GP Inc. and Government of Saskatchewan and Government of Manitoba;
- Alberta-Ontario-Saskatchewan Cooperation Memorandum of Understanding on Pipelines, Critical Minerals and Responsible Energy Development; and
- Economic Cooperation Memorandum of Understanding Between the Government of Saskatchewan and the Government of Prince Edward Island.

Travel Activity

Premier Moe attended the COF Summer Meeting from July 20, 2025, to July 23, 2025. Canada's Premiers discussed several topics related to Federal-Provincial-Territorial relations, including Canada-US relations, international trade, sovereignty, national security and defence, infrastructure, and energy security.

Outcomes included two joint communiqués focused on seven priority areas:

- 1) Emergency Management and Wildfires
- 2) Building Canada
- 3) US Relations and International Trade
- 4) Internal Trade and Labour Mobility
- 5) Immigration
- 6) Health
- 7) Public Safety
