Overview of Travel and Objectives

After the 2025 Canadian federal election, Saskatchewan released its “Strong Saskatchewan, Strong Canada Plan” – 10 key policy changes the federal government must make to reset Ottawa’s relationship with Saskatchewan. The bilateral meeting with Prime Minister Mark Carney provided an opportunity to advance key Saskatchewan priorities.

Additionally, China imposed a 75.8% preliminary anti-dumping duty on Canadian canola seed in August 2025, following a 100% tariff on Canadian canola meal and oil earlier this year. Canola is major economic driver for Saskatchewan and Canada. The total economic impact on the Canadian economy from the canola sector is approximately \$43.7 billion per year. There are 206,000 full time equivalent jobs supported by the canola sector. In response to the Chinese tariffs, Premier Moe led a trade mission to China in September 2025. This is the first time a Canadian Premier has conducted a trade mission to China in six years.

Meetings with the Canola Industry and Prime Minister Mark Carney provided an opportunity to update the industry and the federal government on the Premier Moe’s trade mission and discuss next steps in the trade dispute with China.

- Meeting with the Canola Industry, Prime Minister Mark Carney, the Minister of Agriculture and Agri-Food, Heath MacDonald, the Minister of International Trade, Maninder Sidhu, the Secretary of State (Rural Development), Buckley Belanger, and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Prime Minister, Kody Blois.
