Overview of Travel and Objectives

The United Kingdom (UK) is a key trading partner for Saskatchewan (SK) with exports reaching nearly C\$596.6 million (M) in 2024, a 7% increase over 2023. Top exports included natural uranium (C\$405.1M) and non-durum wheat (C\$100.9M). The UK is also a source of investment for SK. As the UK accelerates its nuclear energy program and looks to secure reliable supplies of critical minerals, SK is well positioned to meet these needs through its reliable uranium production, by sharing its clean energy expertise, and by deepening collaboration to learn from each other's experience in nuclear strategy development, paving the way for stronger partnerships and innovation in the sector.

The Honourable Jeremy Harrison, Minister of Crown Investments Corporation and his delegation traveled to London to participate in the World Nuclear Symposium (WNS) 2025, the nuclear sector's leading international gathering. This year marked the 50th anniversary of the event, bringing together over 800 participants from 49 countries, including government ministers, industry leaders, researchers, and financiers. The theme, "*Energizing the Future Now*," set the tone for a forward-looking agenda focused on tripling global nuclear capacity by 2050 through innovation, investment, and collaboration.

Minister Harrison joined these global conversations to showcase SK's leadership in uranium and critical minerals and to build partnerships that will help advance the province's own nuclear strategy. By engaging directly with international stakeholders, SK is strengthening relationships, positioning itself as a trusted global supplier and gaining the insights needed to support future energy projects, attract investment and create jobs.

Mission Objectives:

- participated in the WNS to engage with global stakeholders, explore partnership opportunities, and showcase Saskatchewan as a leader in uranium and critical minerals;
- gathered insights on the future of nuclear energy, including the development of small modular reactors (SMRs), best practices for launching a nuclear program in a new jurisdiction, and strategies for policy and regulatory development; and,
- learned from other jurisdictions' approaches to workforce training, supply chain development, project financing, nuclear fuel supply, and waste management to inform Saskatchewan's nuclear strategy.

Travel Activity

- During the mission, Minister Harrison:
 - attended the WNS, joining global industry leaders, governments, and researchers to explore opportunities for collaboration and growth in the nuclear sector. Minister Harrison also spoke on a panel on *Regional Policies Enabling Industrial Clusters and Facilitating Load Growth*;
 - participated in Canada-UK Nuclear Day, held on the margins of the WNS, alongside senior Canadian and UK government representatives, where he spoke on a Provincial Energy Ministers Panel;

- participated in a Canadian Nuclear Association (CNA) – Nuclear Industry Association (NIA) Forum, where he presented SK's progress on advancing its nuclear strategy; and,
- witnessed the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the National Skills Academy for Nuclear (NSAN) and Saskatchewan Polytechnic to support the delivery of nuclear training programs in Saskatchewan.
- Minister Harrison also met with key government officials and industry partners including:
