Overview of Travel and Objectives

The Provincial/Territorial Energy Summit: *Connecting Canada - Building an Energy Superpower* provided an excellent platform to highlight Saskatchewan's leadership in the energy and resources sector, foster collaboration with other P/T ministers, officials and industry leaders and contribute to the province's long-term economic growth and sustainability.

Minister Young was joined at the Summit by Minister Harrison, Crown Investments Corporation. While Minister Harrison was best able to address electricity infrastructure and nuclear energy and transition, both ministers had the opportunity to promote Saskatchewan's responsible resource development interests; advance opportunities to streamline regulatory processes, strengthen investor confidence and improve trade corridors; and to build strategic alliance with provincial and territorial partners to address key policy changes.

Travel Activity

The Summit kicked-off with a half-day tour of the Darlington Nuclear Generating Station and reactor mock-up facility in Clarington. This was followed by a reception dinner for ministers in Toronto providing an opportunity for dialogue.

Day two of the Summit was dedicated to formal programming. The morning consisted of panel discussions focusing on building knowledge and awareness on various topics related to key nation-building projects, such as nuclear energy, transmission interties and fuels pipelines.

The last half of the day built off the momentum from the morning and provide P/T ministers with a forum for closed-door discussion focused on advancing progress on energy infrastructure (nuclear energy, transmission interties and pipelines), strategies for engaging the federal government on potential reforms to support continued economic growth and competitiveness and potential next steps should Canada reach a potential trade agreement with the U.S.
