Order No. 102/26. The CHICKEN FARMERS OF SASKATCHEWAN Board, pursuant to the provisions of *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* and *The Agri-Food Act, 2004*, hereby determines and orders as follows:

- 1 In accordance with *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* and as set out in the procedures, rules and criteria set forth in this Order, the Board shall execute offerings of new entrant base quota in the manner described in section 1 of the Appendix.
- 2 Notice of the base quota offerings will be published on the Chicken Farmers of Saskatchewan website and in such ways as considered necessary by the Board, with sufficient notice to allow for responses.
- 3 If the base quota described is not distributed through this offering, the Board may retain the base quota in abeyance until such time as it is deemed appropriate to reconsider the offerings.

4 Order No. 77/18 – Sale of Base Quota to New Entrants is hereby wholly revoked.

5 This Order will remain in effect for a period no longer than ten (10) years from the date this Order is approved by the Agri-Food Council.

The Chicken Farmers of Saskatchewan (CFS) New Entrant Program is intended to award a portion of sector growth as new entrant base quota to new producers who are committed to being long term, active members of the broiler chicken sector.

Base quota offered entitles a new entrant to produce a specified number of kilograms of chicken per production period. All quota remains the property of CFS in accordance with *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations*.

Quota Available

- 1 The CFS will receive offers to acquire new entrant base quota as outlined in this Offering Notice.
- 2 The offering of new entrant base quota to the successful, eligible applicant shall consist of 35,400 kilograms allotment(s) of chicken quota per production period. The number of new entrants selected will be based on the number of available 35,400-kilogram allotment(s) available.

Eligibility

- 3 Applicants must be at least 18 years of age.
- 4 Those not eligible to submit an offer to acquire under this program include:
 - (a) existing licensed producers or base quota owners;
 - (b) individuals, corporations and partnerships that have previously been broiler chicken base quota owners or licensed producers in the last ten (10) years (for clarity, children of previous licensed broiler producers or base quota owners are eligible to submit an offer);
 - (c) employees of CFS or Chicken Farmers of Canada (CFC).
- 5 Only one application per married or common-law* couple is allowed.
- 6 Only one application per specified production location is allowed.
- 7 Preference may be given to applicants who are not currently and have not previously been quota owners in any supply managed sector.
- 8 Immediate family members of CFS directors, CFS staff and CFC staff including spouses or common-law* partners, and children and children-in-law are eligible to apply however the criteria of these applications will be evaluated by an independent third party.

9 CFS will contact the unsuccessful applicants from the 2025 New Entrant Program draw to confirm their desire to be included in the 2026 New Entrant Program. Upon confirmation, those 2025 applicants may submit an application with the application fee waived.

14 The contents of the submitted sealed envelope must include:

- (a) a completed “Offer to Acquire Form”, which can be obtained on the CFS website or by contacting the CFS Board office;
- (b) a completed “Application for Grower License”, which can be obtained on the CFS website or by contacting the CFS Board office;
- (c) a detailed Business Plan that describes:
 - (i) proposed Legal Land Location (if known at time of application) where the applicant will set up production or purchase plans (if applicable);
 - (A) if the intended production facility is not within 200 kilometers of a licensed Saskatchewan processor, an agreement to purchase the production with a Saskatchewan licensed processor must be included;
 - (ii) progress towards compliance and permits with municipal zoning bylaws (if applicable);
 - (iii) description or schematic of production facility along with estimated construction cost and timelines to build or renovate existing infrastructure and potential for expansion;
 - (A) an indication of when the applicant intends to begin production must also be included;
 - (iv) description or schematic of equipment along with estimated costs;
 - (v) projection of balance sheet or detailed financial analysis of production costs;
 - (vi) operations plan including the applicant’s experience and knowledge of broiler production including level of involvement in the day-to-day activities of the facility;
 - (vii) the applicant’s experience and knowledge of animal care, animal husbandry, food safety, and biosecurity practices;
 - (viii) any other details that the applicant deems to be relevant and beneficial when the application is being considered;
- (d) a cheque for \$1,000 made out to Chicken Farmers of Saskatchewan as a non-refundable application fee;

Review of Offers

15 After the closing date for receipt of offers, all offers will be opened by an independent third party appointed by CFS in the presence of a scrutineer appointed by CFS.

16 Offers must meet the requirements and comply with *The Agri-Food Act, 2004*, *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* and all CFS Orders.

17 In the case of more applicants than allotments offered, all applications will be reviewed by the CFS Board. Applications which contain inaccurate or misleading information or containing details unrelated to broiler production will be deemed ineligible for the draw without refund of application fee.

18 The CFS Board will have final determination on eligibility of applicants based on the application criteria of the Offering Notice.

19 All applications deemed eligible will move forward into the draw, with the successful recipients being randomly chosen by drawing of names/applicants, conducted by an independent third party.

Award of Quota

20 New Entrant base quota will be awarded in accordance with the applicant(s) meeting all application criteria to become a licensed producer.

21 The acquisition fee will be \$3.9548 per kilogram.

Terms of Purchase

22 Acceptance of an offer to acquire new entrant base quota will create a binding contract between CFS and the successful applicant.

23 The successful applicant will have thirty (30) days to provide a signed bank letter demonstrating proof of financing to build the necessary facilities and produce the quota.

24 A non-refundable deposit equal to 25% of the acquisition fee must be delivered to the CFS within fourteen (14) days of receiving a written notice of acceptance of the successful applicant's offer. Notices are deemed to be received ten (10) days after being mailed or three (3) days after emailed. Payment must be in the form of a cheque, certified cheque, bank draft or money order payable to the SCIDF.

25 New Entrant base quota acquired under this Order must be put into production within one (1) year of the successful applicant receiving written notice of acceptance of their offer, or such longer period of time as CFS, in its sole discretion, may allow.

26 The new entrant base quota must be produced on land owned by the successful applicant, and such land may not serve as a production location for any other licensed producer. No other licensed producer or any individual who has a direct or indirect beneficial interest in another licensed producer, may have any direct or indirect beneficial interest in a new applicant or in the production location where a successful applicant puts the base quota into production.

27 The full purchase fee must be delivered to CFS at the time the new entrant base quota is put into production. Payment must be in the form of a cheque, certified cheque, bank draft or money order payable to the SCIDF. The successful applicant may choose to pay the full acquisition fee at any time prior to putting the new entrant base quota into production and may then lease out to other licensed producers for up to one (1) year with CFS Board approval.

28 New Entrant base quota acquired under this Order shall be forfeited and cancelled if:

- (a) it has not been put into production in accordance with this Order; or
- (b) it is subsequently determined by the Board that the purchaser no longer satisfies the eligibility or other requirements outlined in this Order.

29 New Entrant base quota acquired under this Order may not be transferred by the base quota owner in accordance with the provisions of *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* prior to the tenth (10th) anniversary of the base quota being awarded and are subject to all applicable provisions and restrictions of *The Agri-Food Act, 2004*, *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations*, and all CFS Orders.

Withdrawal of Quota for sale

10 CFS reserves the right to withdraw the new entrant base quota offering under this Order at any time before or after the closing time for receipt of offers. Unless and until CFS has accepted in writing an offer from a successful applicant, a contractual relationship (either expressed or implied) is not created with any person submitting an offer in response to this Order.

BASE QUOTA LEASING

Order No. 103/26. The CHICKEN FARMERS OF SASKATCHEWAN Board, pursuant to the provisions of *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* and *The Agri-Food Act, 2004*, hereby determines and orders as follows:

- 1** A licensed producer (leaser) may lease their domestic base quota to another licensed producer (lessee).
- 2** A lease application must be made as kilograms of base quota to be leased out and produced in a given production period.
- 3** A complete, written quota lease application signed by both the leaser and lessee must be:
 - (a) submitted to the Board office four (4) weeks prior to the lessee's chick placement date;
 - (i) lease submissions within three (3) or less weeks to the lessee placement may be denied;
 - (b) limited to one production period at a time; and
 - (c) include any other information that the Board requires.
- 4** Subject to sections 5 and 6, the maximum allowable amount of quota that may be leased by any licensed producer at any given time is 50% of that producer's base quota.
- 5** In exceptional circumstances, more than 50% but less than 100% of a producer's base quota may be leased if:
 - (a) an 'Act of God' requires a licensed producer's production unit to be out of operation for up to seven (7) production periods;
 - (b) a start-up period of no longer than seven (7) production periods is needed to allow for new licensed producers to build or acquire production units acceptable for production;
 - (c) a grace period of no longer than seven (7) production periods is needed to allow existing licensed producers who have acquired additional base quota to build or acquire additional production unit capacity.
- 6** A producer may lease out 100% of their base quota if the lease does not exceed two (2) production periods in a calendar year and is approved by the Board.
- 7** Production Period is defined in Order No. 92/21 (Base Quota Allocations).
- 8** Any lease authorization granted by the Board may be subject to terms and/or conditions that the Board considers appropriate in the circumstances.

9 The leaser and lessee are:

- (a) jointly responsible for the marketing of chicken in accordance with these regulations; and
- (b) jointly and individually liable for:
 - (i) all service charges and levies assessed pursuant to these regulations; and
 - (ii) any judgment obtained in respect of service charges or levies assessed pursuant to these regulations.

10 The Board shall not allow a lease of base quota from a leaser to a lessee if:

- (a) either party has outstanding service charges, overproduction penalties or levies payable to the Board; or
- (b) the proposed lessee would exceed the base quota limit established under Order No. 106/26 (Base Quota Limits).

11 No subleasing or co-oping of base quota shall be permitted.

12 Order No. 98/23 – Base Quota Leasing is hereby wholly revoked.

13 This order will remain in effect for a period no longer than ten (10) years from the date this order is approved by the Agri-Food Council.

RESEARCH PRODUCTION REGISTRATION

Order No. 104/26. The CHICKEN FARMERS OF SASKATCHEWAN Board, pursuant to the provisions of *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* and *The Agri-Food Act, 2004*, hereby determines and orders as follows:

- 1** Researchers who desire to perform research on chickens, and have that chicken enter into the food supply, in the Province of Saskatchewan shall register with the Board.
- 2** Researchers, for the purposes of this Order shall be defined as individuals conducting research with majority of the results and benefits of the research being distributed to the industry and subject to section 3, shall be able to produce chicken without owning base quota.
- 3** Eligibility for research production registration shall be determined by the Board and shall be initiated by filing with the Board a complete, Board-approved application form which shall include, but not be limited to, the following information with respect to each research project:
 - (a) the name, address and contact information of the researcher;
 - (b) the name and address of the institution or business where the research is to be conducted;
 - (c) a summary of the research initiative;
 - (d) the expected date of placement, date of processing and quantity of chicken to be produced; and
 - (e) the attachment of evidence with respect to the provision of approved protocol governing the research project.

- 4 Research production registration holds no value and such registration, time limits and production amounts shall be at the discretion of the Board.
- 5 The Chicken Farmers of Saskatchewan will deduct from allocated provincial base quota kilograms of chicken that has been approved for use by registered researchers.
- 6 The cost associated with purchasing and growing the research chickens shall be the responsibility of the researcher.
- 7 Levies must be paid on all marketed kilograms of chicken as outlined in Order No. 101/25 (Levies).
- 8 Periodic updates from the registrant with respect to the registered research production will be required by the Board as identified in the timelines provided in the approval notice given to the researcher.
- 9 All research production shall be required to follow Order No. 108/26 (On Farm Food Safety and Animal Care Program).
- 10 Order No. 95/23 – Research Production Registration is hereby wholly revoked.
- 11 This Order will remain in effect for a period no longer than ten (10) years from the date this Order is approved by the Agri-Food Council.

Order No. 104/26 is made pursuant to clauses 5(c), 7(a), 7(d), 7(h) and 7(y) of *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* and shall be effective upon the date of this Order. By order of the Chicken Farmers of Saskatchewan.

SPECIALTY CLASS AND SPECIALTY CLASS REGISTRATION

Order No. 105/26. The CHICKEN FARMERS OF SASKATCHEWAN Board, pursuant to the provisions of *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* and *The Agri-Food Act, 2004*, hereby determines and orders as follows:

- 1 A specialty class of chicken production, to be known as “specialty class”, shall be established that is defined as chicken raised in a manner to meet small niche market demand including but not limited to organic, halal, free-range and pasture-raised chicken.
- 2 Eligibility for the specialty class production shall be determined by the Board and shall be initiated by filing with the Board a complete, Board-approved application form which shall include, but not be limited to, the specialty class chicken producer’s:
 - (a) name, address and legal land location where the production shall occur;
 - (b) email address and telephone and fax numbers (where applicable); and
 - (c) a summary of the business plan for the production of the specialty class.
- 3 A registration fee in the amount of \$350 must be paid to the Board by the specialty class producer:
 - (a) when submitting the producer’s first Board-provided application; and
 - (b) upon subsequent registrations, by January 31st of each year.

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- 4** The Board may grant the registration of a specialty class producer if the applicant:
- (a) meets the definition of specialty class chicken production;
 - (b) meets all board requirements as outlined in sections 2 and 3 above;
 - (c) is not a licensed producer with the Board;
 - (d) does not hold a communal group production exemption defined in Order No. 107/26 (Communal Group Production Exemption); and
 - (e) resides on or adjacent to the same parcel of land on which the production facilities are located at which the chicken is produced.
- 5** The specialty class producer's registration will allow that specialty class producer to produce up to 4,000 chickens in any given calendar year without having to own quota or meet the licensing requirements of Order No. 99/23 (Producer License).
- 6** Chicken produced under the specialty class must only be:
- (a) used by the specialty class producer for personal use; and/or
 - (b) marketed to consumers from:
 - (i) the land referred to in clause 4(b);
 - (ii) the land that is adjacent to the land referred to in clause 4(b);
 - (iii) a stall at a farmers market;
 - (iv) orders placed by consumers to the specialty producer; or
 - (v) any other means of sale that the Board deems acceptable.
- 7** The registration of a specialty class producer may not be sold, transferred, reallocated, leased or divided.
- 8** If the specialty class producer is granted an allocation or reallocation of provincial base quota, the specialty class registration is cancelled immediately upon the granting of the provincial base quota.
- 9** Within two (2) weeks of the delivery of chicks to the specialty class producer, the registered specialty class producer must report to the Board the number of chicks so acquired via a copy of the delivery invoice.
- 10** A specialty class registration may be penalized or cancelled, either permanently or for such period as the Board considers appropriate, if the specialty class producer:
- (a) produces in excess of 4,000 chickens in any calendar year;
 - (b) fails to comply with clause 6(b) when marketing any chicken;
 - (c) fails to report the information required by section 9;
 - (d) fails to submit levies on all marketed kilograms as per section 1 of Order No. 113/24 (Levies); or
 - (e) fails to follow Order No. 108/26 (the On-Farm Food Safety and Animal Care Program).
- 11** With respect to section 10, penalties will be enforced regarding item 10(a) as described in Order No. 99/23 (Producer License) and enforced regarding items 10(b), (c) and (d) as described in Order No. 79/21 (Statistics and Reporting).
- 12** The total amount of specialty class registrations granted by the Board may be restricted to 1.5% of Saskatchewan's total provincial base quota for any given year less the amount of exemptions granted through Order No. 107/25 (Communal Group Production Exemption).
- 13** Order No. 94/23 – Specialty Class & Specialty Class Registration is hereby wholly revoked.

14 This Order will remain in effect for a period no longer than ten (10) years from the date this Order is approved by the Agri-Food Council.

BASE QUOTA LIMITS

Order No. 106/26. The CHICKEN FARMERS OF SASKATCHEWAN Board, pursuant to the provisions of *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* and *The Agri-Food Act, 2004*, hereby determines and orders as follows:

1 The following definitions are applied in this Order:

(a) “person” shall include an individual, corporation, cooperative, partnership, trust and any other entity designated as a person under *The Interpretation Act, 1995* or the *Income Tax Act (Canada)* and shall include a family member unit as specified under subsection 41(1) of *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations*; and

(b) “interest” shall be determined by deeming a person to have full ownership of any corporation, partnership or cooperative, trust and any other entity such person has ownership in, or any other contractual or other relationship with which such person is involved.

2 No person, either directly or indirectly, in any manner whatsoever including without limiting the generality of the foregoing through an interest in a corporation, partnership, cooperative, trust or in any other manner including by agreement through a trust, through any family member unit as specified under subsection 41(1) of *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* may hold more than 6.0% of the total provincial base quota allocated by the Board, unless such family member unit constitutes a separate economic unit.

3 No more than 6.0% of all provincial base quota allocated by the Board may be produced at one production facility and premise.

4 With regard to sections 2 and 3, the amount of base quota shall be determined as follows:

(a) the holding of base quota for a person is the sum of:

(i) the base quota held by that person;

(ii) the full quota of any corporation, partnership, cooperative, trust or any other entity in which a person has an ownership interest; and

(iii) any base quota in which the person has an ownership interest as a lessee of quota; and

(b) the holdings of a corporation, partnership, cooperative, trust or any other entity is the sum of:

(i) the base quota held by that corporation, partnership, cooperative, trust, unincorporated organization or group of individuals;

(ii) the full quota of any corporation, partnership, cooperative, trust or any other entity which a person has ownership interest in; and

(iii) any base quota in which the corporation, partnership, cooperative, trust or any other entity has an ownership interest as a lessee of quota.

5 The Board shall not allocate, reallocate, or approve the lease of any base quota if, as a result of that allocation, reallocation or lease, any person would hold quota in excess of that allowed pursuant to this Order.

6 Subject to section 9 of *The Agri-Food Act, 2004*, the Board may reduce, suspend or cancel base quota if the licensed producer to whom it was allocated or the person to whom it has been leased:

- (a) has failed to observe, perform or carry out the provisions of *The Agri-Food Act, 2004*, *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* or an Order;
- (b) is not utilizing or has voluntarily given up all or part of that producer's base quota or portion leased;
- (c) has not received the approval of the Board for any change in ownership interest in relation to that producer if that base quota has been allocated or leased in the name of a company; or
- (d) has had their license cancelled or suspended; or
- (e) has failed to notify the Board of any agreement or interest in any other licensed producer's base quota.

7 Base quota that has been cancelled pursuant to section 6 shall be returned for sale in accordance with procedures described in Order No 76/18 (Base Quota Adjustment).

8 No producer shall be compensated for any quota cancelled pursuant to section 6.

9 Quota that is allocated to a licensed producer shall relate to and be attached to a particular production unit that is situated in Saskatchewan on a legally defined parcel of land registered at the Land Titles Office.

10 Order No. 86/21 – Base Quota Limits is hereby wholly revoked.

11 This Order will remain in effect for a period no longer than ten (10) years from the date this Order is approved by the Agri-Food Council.

Order No. 106/26 is made pursuant to sections 22 and 26, clauses 7(f), 7(h), 7 (y) and 7(gg) of *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* and shall be effective upon the date of this Order. By order of the Chicken Farmers of Saskatchewan.

COMMUNAL GROUP PRODUCTION EXEMPTION

Order No. 107/25. CHICKEN FARMERS OF SASKATCHEWAN Board, pursuant to the provisions of *The Chicken Marketing Plan Regulations* and *The Agri-Food Act, 2004*, hereby determines and orders as follows:

- 1** A “communal group” shall be defined as persons living in a communal situation for such reasons as faith, lifestyle, or other valid reasons and whose resources and income are shared in some manner other than by partnership or joint venture.
- 2** By filing a complete, Board-provided application form, a communal group may apply to the Board for a communal group production exemption to produce 5,000 or less chickens in any given year without having to own quota or meet the licensing requirements of Order No. 99/23 (Producer License).
- 3** The Board may grant an exemption if the applying communal group:
 - (a) is not a licensed producer with the Board; and
 - (b) resides on or adjacent to the same parcel of land on which the production facilities are located at which the chicken is produced.

- 4 Chicken produced under an exemption must only be:
 - (a) used by the communal group for personal use; and/or
 - (b) marketed to consumers from:
 - (i) the land referred to in clause 3(b); or
 - (ii) the land that is adjacent to the land referred to in clause 3(b);
 - (iii) a stall at a farmers market; or
 - (iv) any other means of sale that the Board deems acceptable.
- 5 Exemption fees in the amount of \$350 must be paid to the Board by:
 - (a) the exemption applicant when submitting an exemption application; and
 - (b) the exemption holder by January 31st of each year.
- 6 An exemption may not be sold, transferred, reallocated, leased or divided.
- 7 Within two (2) weeks of the delivery of chicks to the exemption holder, the exemption holder must report to the Board via a copy of the delivery invoice, the number of chicks so acquired.
- 8 If the exemption holder is granted an allocation or reallocation of provincial base quota, the exemption is cancelled.
- 9 An exemption may be penalized, reduced or cancelled, either permanently or for such period as the Board considers appropriate, if an exemption holder:
 - (a) produces in excess of 5,000 chickens in any calendar year;
 - (b) fails to comply with clause 4(b) when marketing any chicken;
 - (c) fails to submit annual fees required in clause 5(b); or
 - (d) fails to report the information required by section 7.
- 10 With respect to section 9, penalties will be enforced regarding item 9(a) as described in Order No. 99/23 (Producer License) and enforced regarding items 9(b), (c) and (d) as described in Order No. 79/21 (Statistics and Reporting).
- 11 Before the Board proceeds to amend this Order, the Board must:

 - (b) all information regarding production unit completion and initial placement dates must be disclosed to the Board by the licensed producer within three (3) months of placement of the initial flock.
- 4 In the event a licensed producer's production unit is not OFFSP and ACP certified or recertified, or a new licensed producer's production unit is not engaged in the process of initial OFFSP and ACP certification, the Board shall have the discretion to impose one or more of the following sanctions, namely:
 - (a) provide the licensed producer with additional time to comply with certification, recertification or initial certification under certain terms and conditions;
 - (b) impose monetary penalties on all kilograms marketed by the licensed producer while the production unit is not certified or compliant;
 - (c) reduce that licensed producer's periodic allocation in such manner as the Board deems appropriate;
 - (d) suspend or cancel the license producer's license;
 - (e) refuse to renew a licensed producer's license; or
 - (f) impose other sanctions as may be required or taking such actions as may be required to ensure that licensed producer's production units are OFFSP and ACP certified.
- 5 Order No. 83/21 – On-Farm Food Safety Assurance Program and 91/21 – Animal Care Program are hereby wholly revoked.

- 8 Directors or Committee members shall abide by the Directors Code of Conduct and Confidentiality. Breaches of the Code of Conduct and Confidentiality shall result in disciplinary actions as follows:

 - (d) removal from the Board or Development Fund Committee.

APPOINTMENT OF RETURNING OFFICERS
