

Saskatchewan Assured Income for Disability (SAID)

Information for Medical Professionals

What is SAID?

SAID is an income support program for people who have ‘significant and enduring’ disabilities. This means their disability or disabilities must:

- be permanent; and
- require support in the form of an assistive device, another person, a service animal, a modified environment or other accommodation.

What does Social Services need from medical professionals?

Social Services asks medical professionals to complete the Medical Report Form (1092) to assist in determining the nature of an individual’s disability. Please confirm:

- what the individual’s disability or disabilities are, or how their health conditions contribute to their disability;
- if the disability or disabilities are permanent; and
- what treatments are available or being provided to treat the disability or disabilities.

Please fill out forms completely and legibly. This will help the Ministry avoid calling to receive clarification.

Social Services does not provide payment for the completion of this form. Payment is provided through the Medical Services Branch, Ministry of Health, as per the Physician’s Payment Schedule.
