Overview of Travel and Objectives

Mission Objectives included:

- Engaging with key United States (US) legislators to establish and build on relationships that will support and advance advocacy efforts on Canada-US relations and trade.
 - The United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) is continuing its review process and tariff negotiations between the US and Canada remain ongoing.
- Showcasing Saskatchewan's leadership in the critical minerals and energy sectors.
 - Critical minerals are vital to the economy and the national security of the US and Canada. The global demand for many critical minerals is predicted to grow significantly over the next two decades.
 - Saskatchewan was ranked as the top jurisdiction in Canada and the seventh-best globally for investment attractiveness in the 2024 Fraser Institute Annual Survey of Mining Companies.
- Emphasizing that maintaining open trade is in the best interest of Canada and the US.
 - Saskatchewan is one of the most trade-oriented provinces within Canada and the US is the province's most important trade and investment partner.
 - Secure supply chains between Canada/Saskatchewan and the US are integral to trade and economic growth in all jurisdictions, particularly as both countries aim to grow their economies.
