Overview of Travel and Objectives

The purpose of this trip was for Premier Scott Moe to attend a First Ministers' Meeting to discuss international relations, internal trade, major projects, electrification, and public safety. A meeting of the Council of the Federation was held the day prior to discuss positioning and strategy with other Premiers ahead of meeting with Prime Minister Mark Carney.

The meeting was held in Ottawa, Ontario, and presented an opportunity to discuss the state of international affairs and the upcoming review of the Canada-United States-Mexico Agreement. In addition, First Ministers discussed what additional work is needed to improve internal trade and enhance public safety.

Saskatchewan's primary objective during the meeting was to support a collaborative approach with Provinces and Territories as it relates to engaging with international partners and to push for further progress on major projects, internal trade, and public safety. Saskatchewan also emphasized the importance of removing impediments for projects to move forward and to ensuring the nation's international competitiveness.

Travel Activity

Premier Moe attended the Council of the Federation Winter Meeting on January 28, 2026, and the First Ministers' Meeting on January 29, 2026. First Ministers met to discuss the ongoing geopolitical situation, in addition to joint work on several files including major projects, electricity, internal trade, and public safety.

Outcomes included a joint statement of First Ministers that underscored the need for continued coordinated work to diversify trading relationships, support tariff-impacted sectors, and advance major projects. First Ministers agreed to work collectively to reduce trade barriers in food and alcoholic beverages and align practices and promote harmonization for the approval of new building materials and prefabricated homes, in addition to advancing labour mobility for regulated occupations. First Ministers directed Attorneys General and Ministers responsible for Justice and Public Safety to report back in summer 2026 with a practical action plan for community safety.
