Notes:

- ◆ This procedure is performed by urologists.
- ◆ 97% of all radical prostatectomies reported over this time period were categorized as cancer surgeries. Only cancer surgeries are included in this table.
- ◆ 28% of bladder resections reported here were categorized with a diagnosis-based priority of four weeks or less. The remainder have a diagnosis-based priority of six weeks or longer. Emergency procedures are excluded.
- ◆ Time periods where patients specify that they are unavailable for surgery are subtracted from the wait time.
- ◆ Postponed cases are included, regardless of whether the reason for postponement is patient or system related.
- ◆ The results are based on the Jul 19, 2026 refresh of the Saskatchewan Surgical Patient Registry data mart and are subject to minor changes as data is added or corrected.
- ◆ The Canadian Cancer Society's **Cancer Statistics 2009** report shows that prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer among Canadian males. Although common, the disease can be more or less aggressive necessitating a variety of treatment approaches.
- ◆ Men are encouraged to become familiar with this information to supplement one-on-one counseling from health providers.
