An Act to transfer the assets and liabilities of the
Doukhobors of Canada C.C.U.B. Trust Fund and to repeal
The Doukhobors of Canada C.C.U.B. Trust Fund Act

(Assented to)

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

Short title

1 This Act may be cited as *The Doukhobors of Canada C.C.U.B. Trust Fund Amendment Act, 2009*.

2 *The Doukhobors of Canada C.C.U.B. Trust Fund Act* is amended in the manner set forth in this Act.

New section 19.1

3 The following section is added after section 19:

“Dissolution and winding up

19.1(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, after consulting with recognized Doukhobor societies organized in Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia, the Lieutenant Governor in Council may, by order:

- (a) dissolve the body corporate called the Doukhobors of Canada C.C.U.B. Trust Fund Board;
- (b) wind up the fund; and
- (c) transfer the assets and liabilities of the board and the fund to any person, agency, organization, association, enterprise, institution or body within or outside Saskatchewan that, in the opinion of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, is capable of representing the interests of the Doukhobors of Canada.

(2) In ordering the dissolution, winding up and transfer mentioned in subsection (1), the Lieutenant Governor in Council may do all or any of the following:

- (a) impose any terms and conditions with respect to the dissolution, winding up and transfer;
- (b) provide for adjusting and settling the assets and liabilities of the board and the fund;

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(c) provide for the disposal or destruction of the records of the board and the fund;

(d) order any other matter or thing that the Lieutenant Governor in Council considers necessary for the purposes of the dissolution, winding up and transfer”.
