Care after immunization:

- Encourage the student to use their arm as usual.
- Common side effects like fever, redness, pain and tenderness at the injection site, a fever, or feeling tired are generally mild and usually last for 1 – 2 days. For redness or swelling at the injection site, apply a cold compress.
- Only treat your child's fever (at least 6 to 8 hours after immunization) if they are uncomfortable, refusing fluids and not sleeping.
- For specific vaccine side effects, refer to the vaccine fact sheets that were included with your child's consent form or go to: www.saskatchewan.ca/immunize

- Please report unexpected or serious side effects to a public health nurse, 811, a physician or nurse practitioner.

Use **Acetaminophen** (Tylenol®, Tempra®) or **Ibuprofen** (Advil®, Motrin®) to treat fevers and pain in children and adults. **Never give ASA** (Aspirin®) to anyone younger than 18 years old because of the serious risk of Reye's syndrome.

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- If a student aged 13 years old or younger does not have an account, a MySaskHealthRecord account must be created for them by following the directions at the link above.
 - Parents/guardians must have their own MySaskHealthRecord account to request access to their child's health information in MySaskHealthRecord. Your child's information will be directly linked to your account.
- Students 14 years and older must create their own confidential MySaskHealthRecord account at the link above.
- If you choose to not sign up for MySaskHealthRecord, you may contact your local public health office to inquire about receiving an emailed or printed copy of the student's immunization record.
