



Fish and Wildlife Development Fund Funding Application Form

A. Information/Background

Saskatchewan hunters, anglers and trappers recognize that healthy and diverse wildlife populations are a barometer of the ecosystem. Their responsible conservation ethic and love of nature are making positive and vital contributions to the management and preservation of fish and wildlife populations and habitat. This ensures that habitat, and thereby fish and wildlife, are preserved for everyone to enjoy. The Fish and Wildlife Development Fund (FWDF) was created when these users offered to pay more for hunting and angling licences, provided the extra money was put into a special fund to conserve and enhance fish and wildlife. The FWDF now receives 30% of the revenue generated from all fur, angling and hunting licences sold in the province.

While the FWDF supports many types of projects related to fish, wildlife, fur and habitat, priority is given to those projects directly applicable to game species. The FWDF will accept applications for multi-year projects, however funding will only be considered for a single-year term. Applicants with multiyear projects must apply in each year they wish to be considered for funding. Future funding will be contingent on a

final report (see 'Final Report Form') being provided by February 15 of the year following application approval.

Please note that the applicant (Primary Contact) must not have any outstanding obligations regarding Research Permit requirements (ie. data submissions) in order to be considered.

*Guidelines for Budget Classification: Consumables vs. Capital Items

Consumables are eligible for funding under the project budget. These are items that are typically used up or depleted within the project's duration. Examples include laboratory supplies (e.g., chemicals, reagents, glassware), office materials (e.g., paper, pens, printer ink), and minor equipment with short lifespans (e.g., pipettes, small tools). Consumables are generally low-cost (e.g., under \$100 per unit), frequently replaced, and not expected to be used beyond the project's end.

Capital items, such as major laboratory equipment, furniture, and infrastructure improvements, have a longer useful life, higher cost (e.g., over \$500 per unit), and are subject to depreciation. These items should be funded through other sources or listed as in-kind contributions, as they are not eligible under the project budget.
