Unmatched Resources

Saskatchewan mineral sales totalled \$7.9 billion in 2019. Natural Resources Canada (NRCan) estimates that Saskatchewan accounted for 14% of national sales value, third highest in Canada.

The province is the largest potash producer in the world, accounting for approximately one-third of total production, and hosting over half of the globe's potash reserves. Saskatchewan is home to the world's largest high-grade uranium deposits. Saskatchewan was the second-largest producer of uranium in the world in 2022, accounting for about 15 per cent of global production and is the sole producer of uranium in Canada.

Saskatchewan has large, underexplored areas with high gold potential. The Seabee Operation produced 1.9 million oz of gold since 1991. The operation remains active today and has recently experienced several consecutive years of record annual production, including over 136,000 oz of gold in 2022.

Saskatchewan also produces coal, sodium sulphate, helium, clays, limestone and has undeveloped deposits of base metals, diamonds and a host of other critical minerals including Rare Earth Elements (REE), Platinum Group Metals and lithium.
