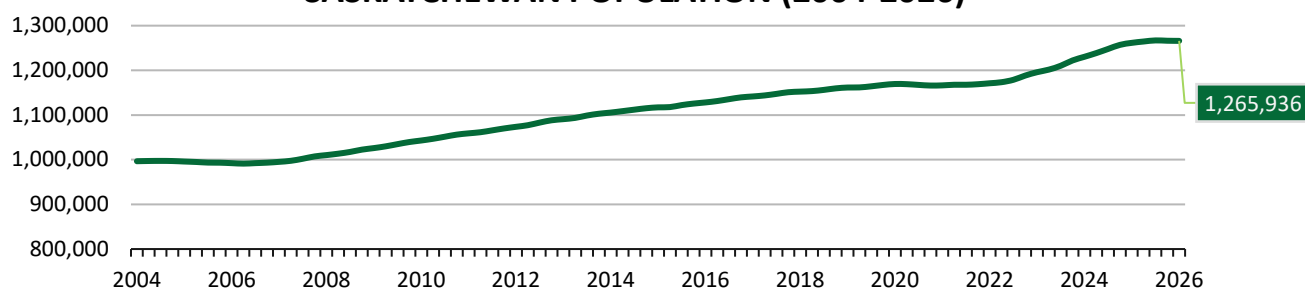

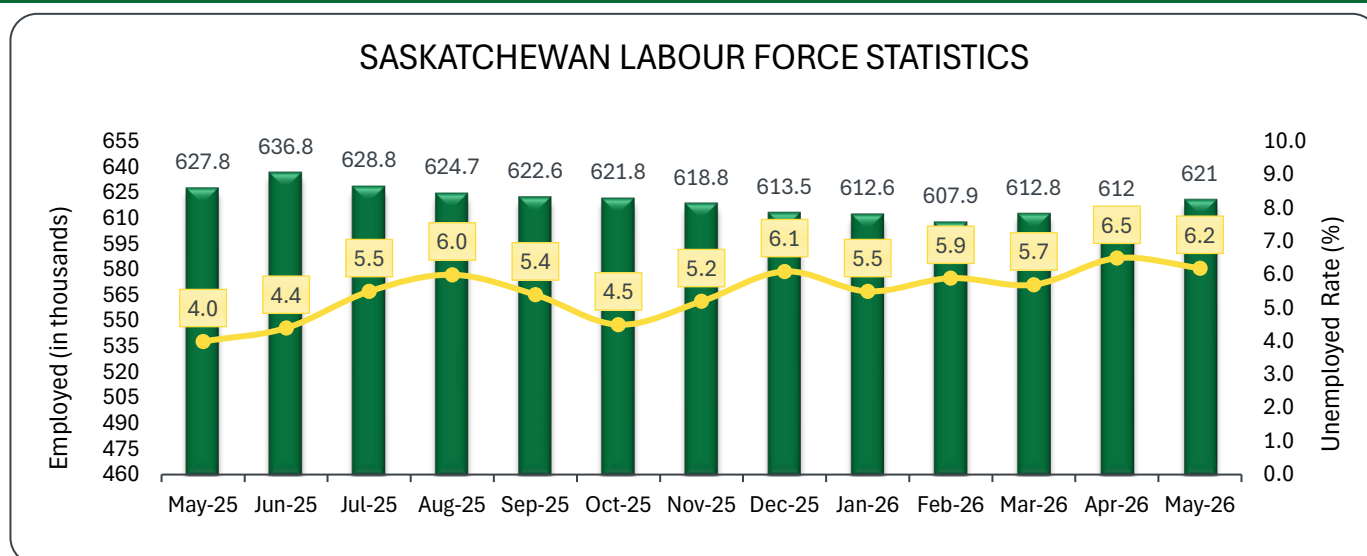

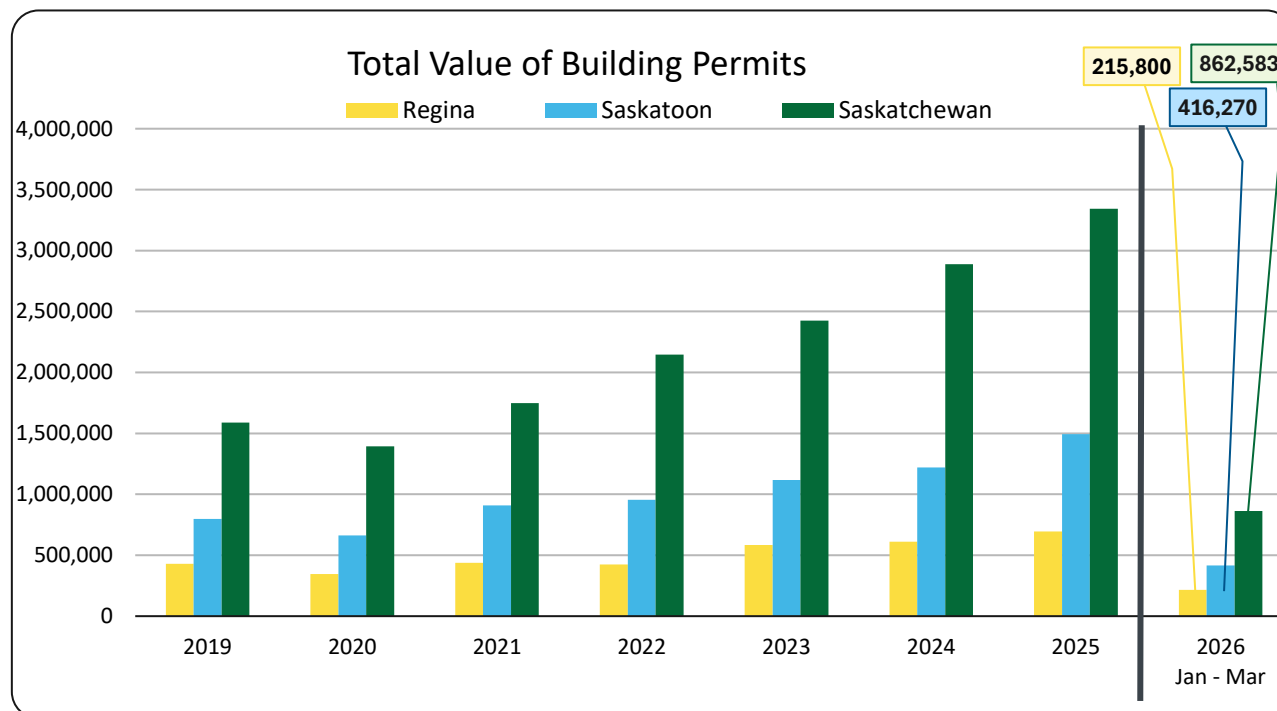

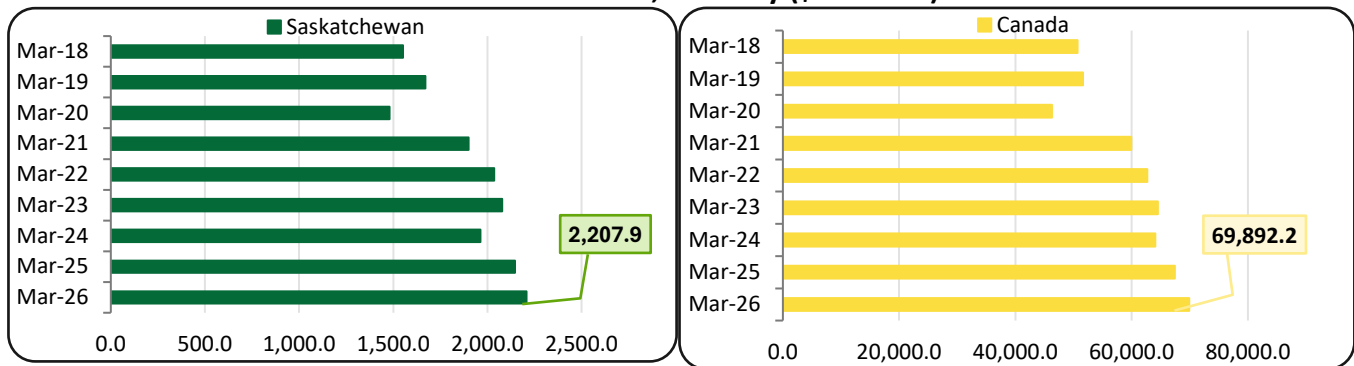

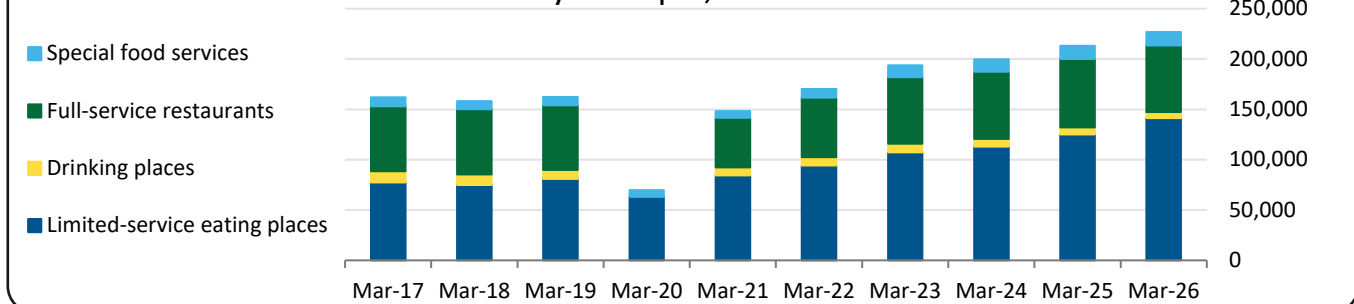

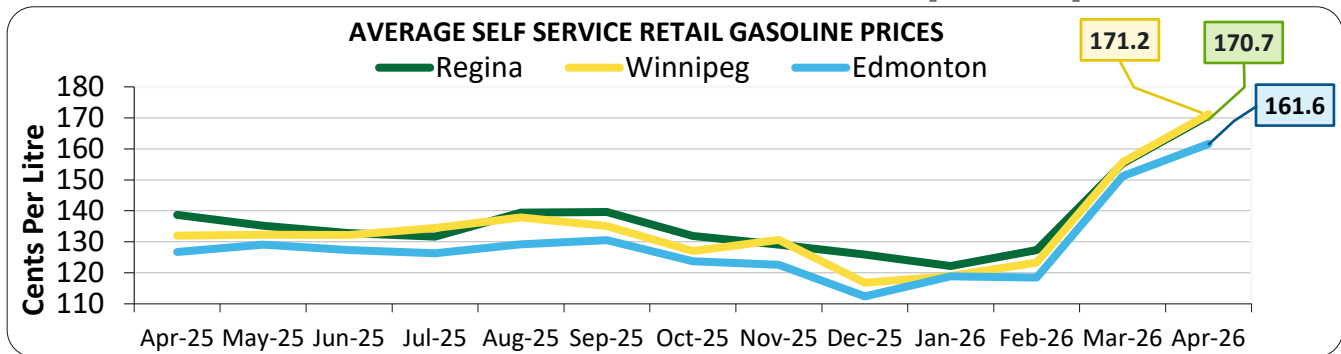
### Monthly Receipts, Year-over-Year

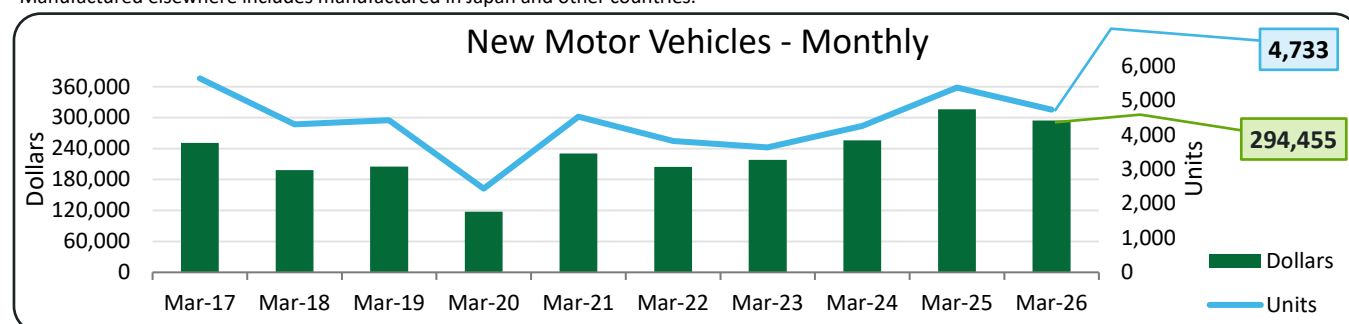
