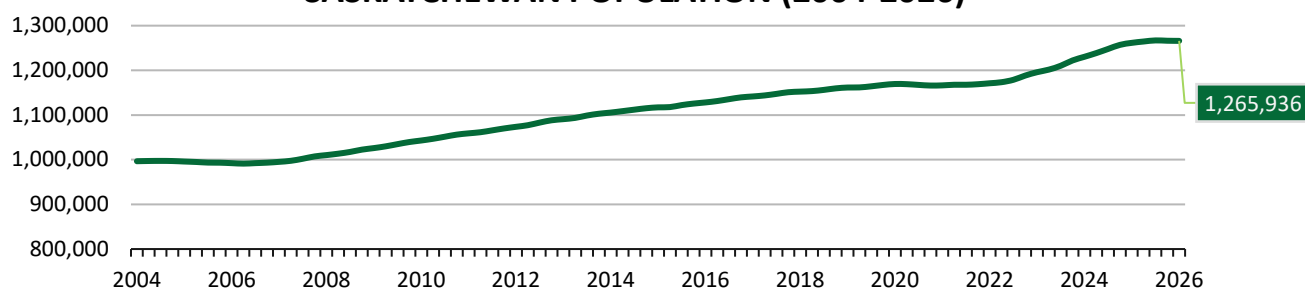

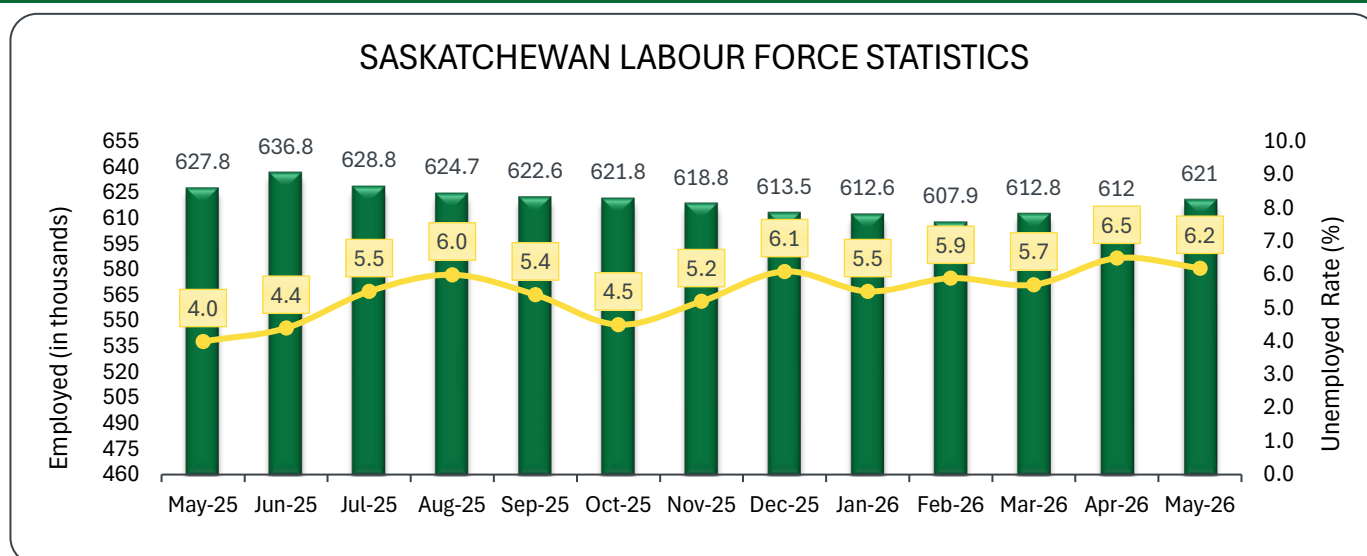

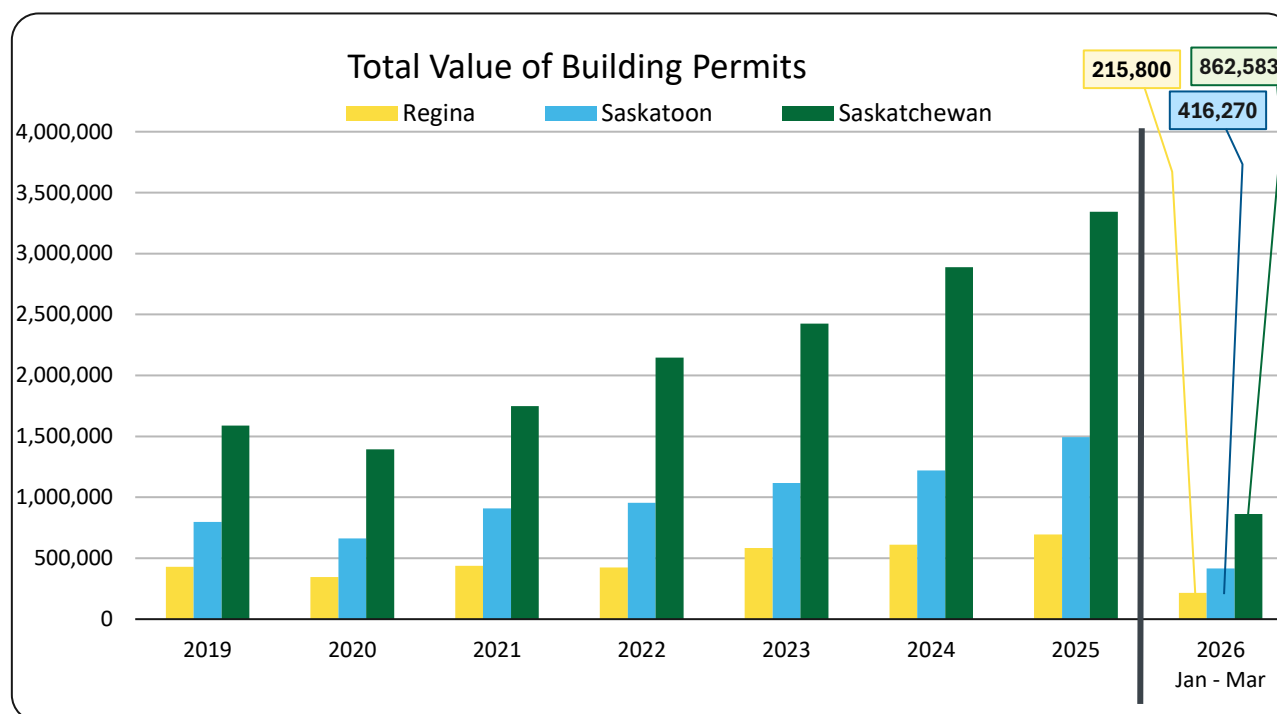
Bankruptcies by Industry

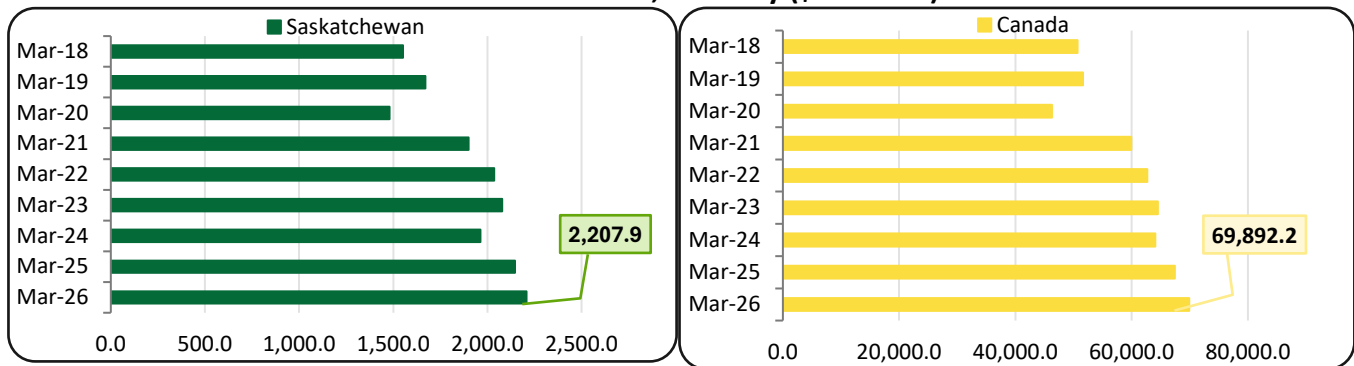

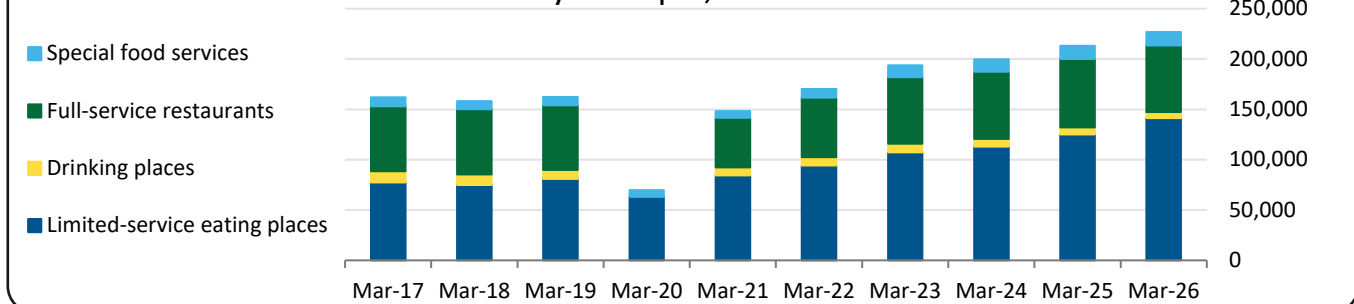

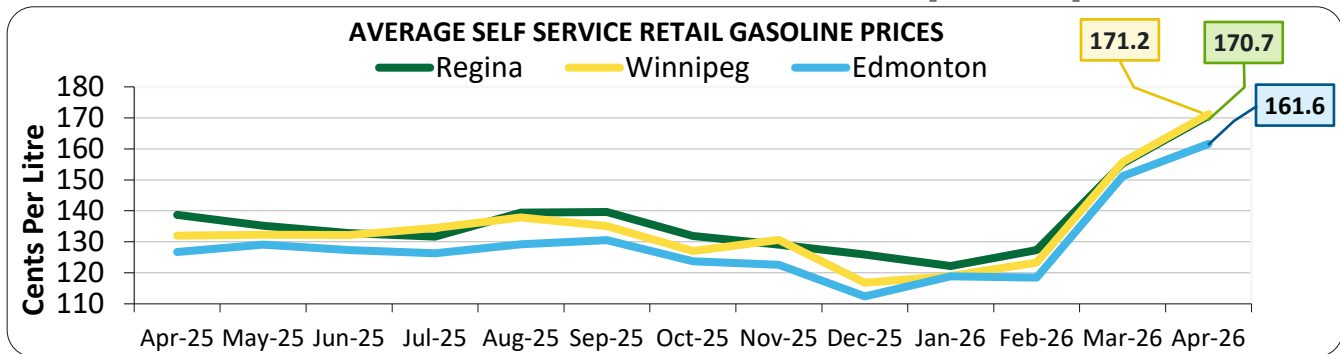
Monthly Receipts, Year-over-Year

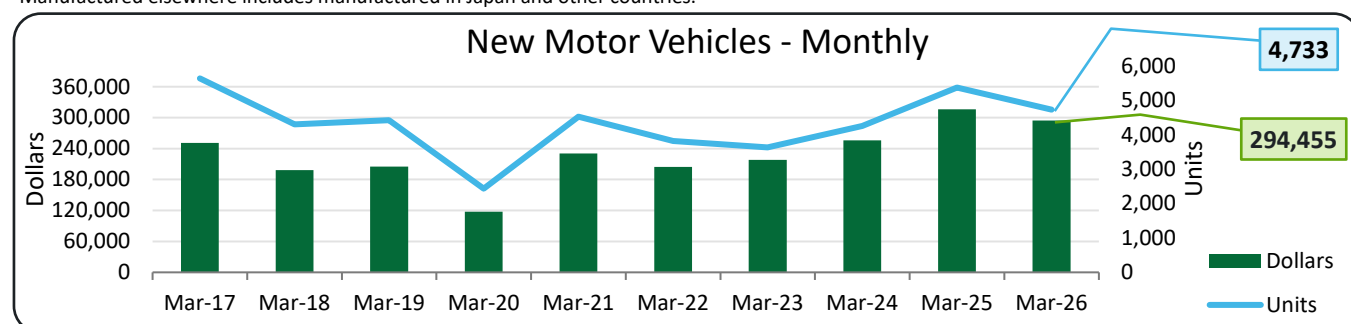
