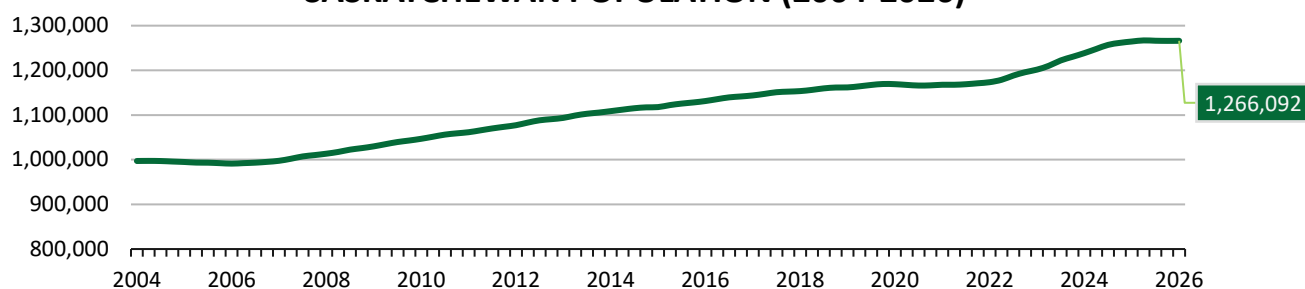

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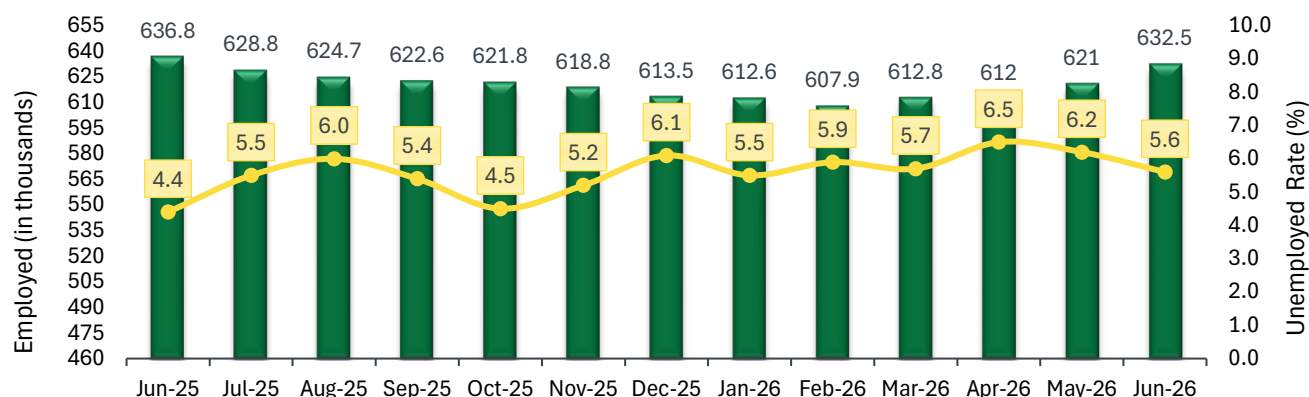
SASKATCHEWAN POPULATION (2004-2026)

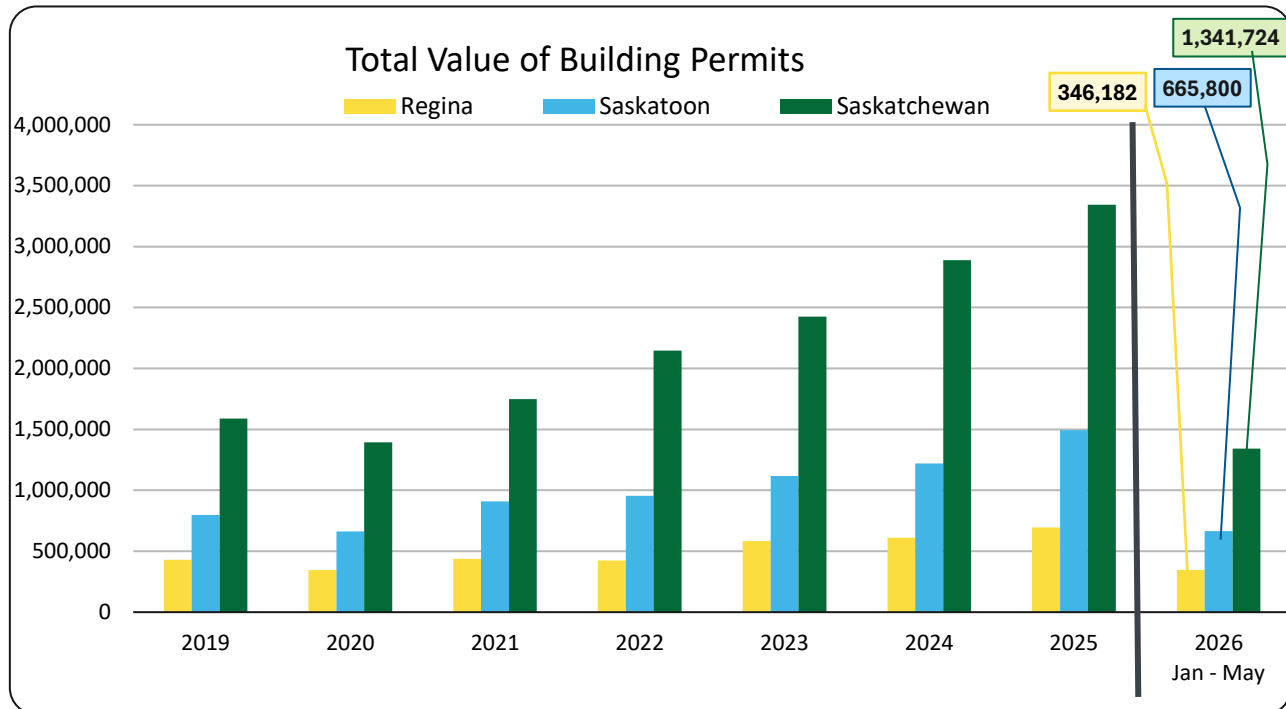

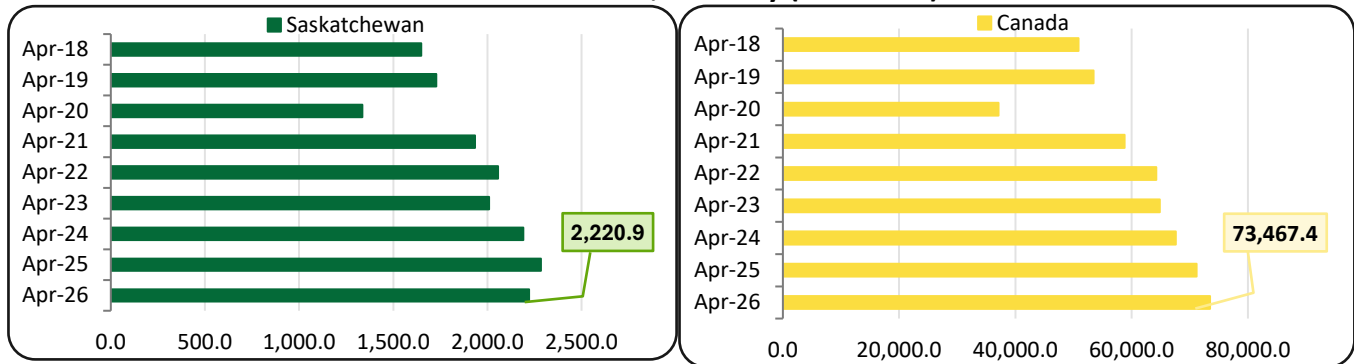

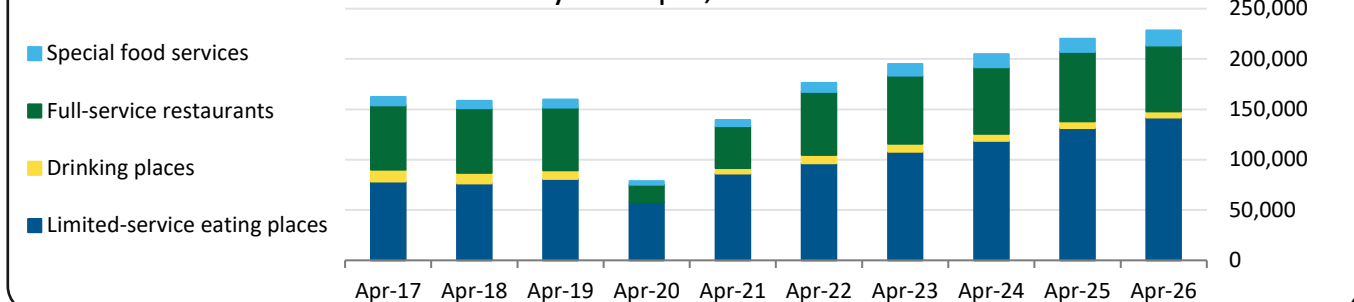

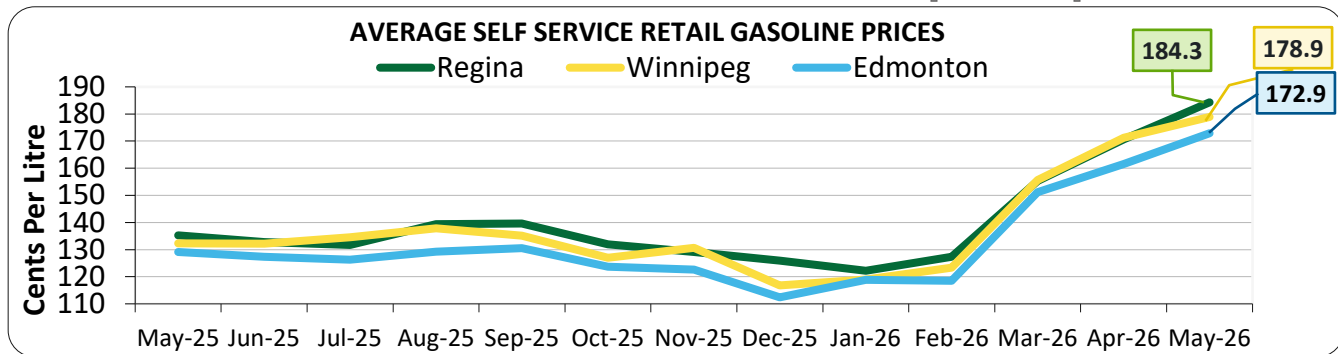
Monthly Receipts, Year-over-Year

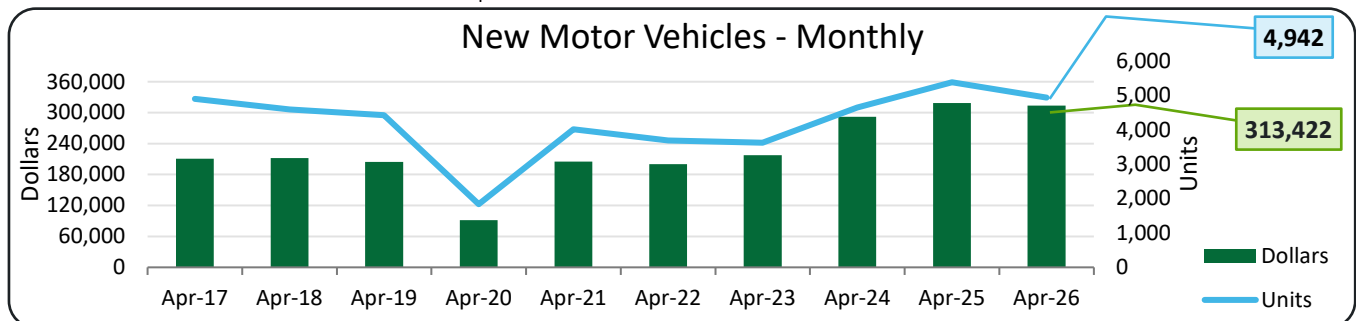
