

Saskatchewan Agriculture Exports 2022



June 2023

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All export calculations are based on international exports from Saskatchewan. Some of the totals of Saskatchewan's lesser exported commodities may have been over or under-reported, which is a result of interprovincial trade. All trade statistics were taken from Global Trade Tracker and are subject to revision and change.

Export values are rounded totals. The year-to-year percentage change is calculated using actual export values. This approach was used in all subsequent tables.

Quick Facts

Saskatchewan's top five agri-food export products by value represent 70 per cent of total agri-food exports.

- Canola oil – \$3.5 billion (19 per cent of total agri-food exports)
- Non-durum wheat – \$2.8 billion (15 per cent of total agri-food exports)
- Canola seed – \$2.7 billion (15 per cent of total agri-food exports)
- Lentils - \$2.0 billion (11 per cent of total agri-food exports)
- Durum - \$1.8 billion (10 per cent of total agri-food exports)

The top five agri-food export markets by value represent 66 per cent of total agri-food exports.

- United States – \$6.2 billion (33 per cent of total agri-food exports)
 - China – \$3.3 billion (18 per cent of total agri-food exports)
 - Japan – \$1.2 billion (seven per cent of total agri-food exports)
 - Mexico - \$1.0 billion (five per cent of total agri-food exports)
 - Algeria - \$0.6 billion (three per cent of total agri-food exports)
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- Saskatchewan (SK) agri-food exports totaled \$18.5 billion in 2022. This represents 20 per cent of Canada's total agri-food exports.
 - SK is Canada's second largest agri-food exporter, behind Ontario. Ontario's agri-food exports were \$23.8 billion.
 - High global commodity prices were a major contributing factor for some of the increases seen in the value of SK agri-food exports in 2022.
 - Other contributing conditions include shifts in trading patterns, disruptions in the Black Sea Region caused by the war in Ukraine, very strong global demand for food and fuel, low exporter stocks, and many important crop production areas around the world experienced poor crop conditions.
 - SK agri-food exports increased six per cent by value while it decreased 23 per cent by volume as the province experienced normal growing conditions after the 2021 drought.
 - SK has received significant new investments in our canola crush sector due to increasing demand for food and fuel. The province is on track to meet its 2030 Growth Plan goal of crushing 75 per cent of Saskatchewan's canola seed within its borders. Canola oil and meal exports are expected to increase in the years ahead.
 - The United States (U.S.) remains our largest agri-food export destination in 2022, with one-third of SK's total agri-food exports destined for this market.

Agri-food exports

Saskatchewan had a record year in 2022 with agri-food exports valued at \$18.5 billion. Agri-food exports are up \$3.7 billion or 25 per cent compared to the 10-year average of \$14.8 billion and are up 24 per cent compared to the five-year average of \$15.7 billion.

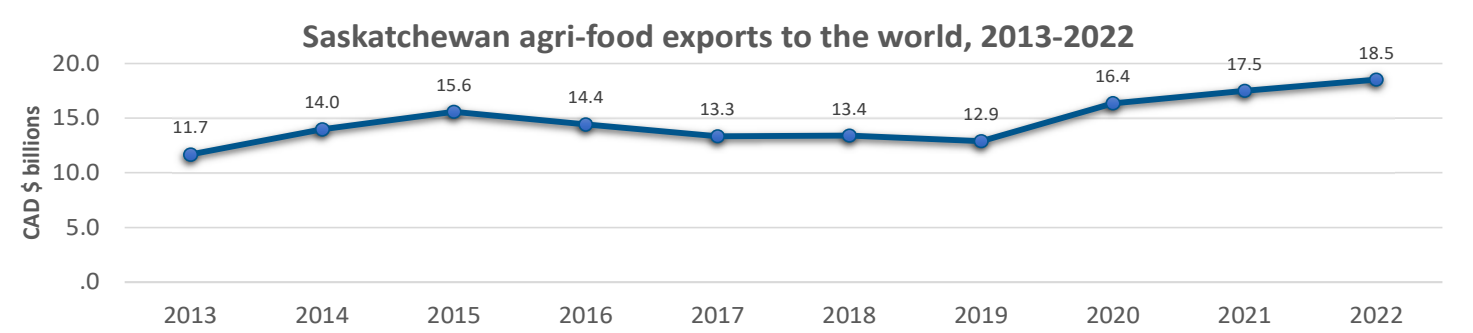
In 2022, the value of agri-food exports is up six per cent compared to the same period in 2021. This is mainly due to price increases of all of Saskatchewan’s main field crops. Agri-food exports accounted for over one third of the province’s total exports.

Agri-food export analysis

Nationally, Canadian agri-food exports to the world in 2022 are up 13 per cent in value, with sales of \$93.0 billion. Saskatchewan is the nation’s second largest agri-food exporter, representing 20 per cent of total Canadian agri-food exports and is behind Ontario by \$5.3 billion.

In 2022, the value of agri-food exports increased for eight of Saskatchewan’s top 10 export commodities. The most significant increases (in absolute terms) were seen in canola oil, durum and lentils with increases of 30 per cent, 21 per cent and 14 per cent, respectively. Canola seed and barley exports decreased by value 24 per cent and 19 per cent, respectively. In terms of volume of Saskatchewan agri-food exports, nine of Saskatchewan’s top 10 export commodities declined in volume. The most significant declines in volume were seen in barley and canola seed with decreases of 46 per cent and 42 per cent, respectively. Cereal grains (hulled, rolled, flaked) was the only top 10 commodity that did not decrease in 2022, with exports flat when compared to the previous year.

Oilseeds

In 2022, Saskatchewan exported \$3.5 billion worth of oilseeds to the world, down 26 per cent compared to 2021 (\$4.7 billion). This is due to a decrease in the value of Saskatchewan's canola seed exports by 24 per cent, valued at \$2.7 billion in 2022 compared to 2021 with exports of \$3.6 billion. The primary reason for the decrease was reduced exports to important markets including the UAE, France and Japan, down 93 per cent, 57 per cent and 30 per cent, respectively. Australia's canola seed exports have increased 135 per cent in 2022 compared to 2021 values. Their largest export markets include Germany, Belgium, France, UAE and Japan.¹

Canola

Saskatchewan's canola seed exports decreased 24 per cent to \$2.7 billion in 2022. Saskatchewan experienced export value decreases to nine of our top 10 export markets. In addition to export decreases to China, Japan, Mexico, U.S.A., Pakistan, France, Bangladesh and Belgium, UAE declined from \$422 million in 2021, to \$27 thousand in 2022. According to the Trade Commissioner Service in this market, the decline was due to a shortage of supply from Canada; the UAE imported significant amounts of canola seed from Australia.

Saskatchewan canola oil exports experienced an increase by value of 30 per cent in 2022. The U.S. is our top canola oil market valued at \$2.8 billion. The U.S. imported over 71 per cent of our canola oil exports, an increase of almost 50 per cent compared to 2021. Mexico is four percent of our export market for canola oil; the value of exports in 2022 increased by almost 80 per cent. China, South Korea and Chile all saw decreases of 46 per cent, 22 per cent and 21 per cent, respectively.

Saskatchewan's exports of canola meal increased in 2022 by five per cent, for total sales of \$907 million. Alberta has surpassed Saskatchewan as the Canada's leading exporter of canola meal, with exports of \$1.1 billion. The U.S. and China were Saskatchewan's key canola meal markets in 2022. Exports to the U.S. increased by 10 per cent and China's exports increased by six per cent.

Other Oilseeds

Saskatchewan's exports of flaxseed decreased in 2022 from \$273 million in 2021 to \$187 million in 2022, a decrease of 32 per cent. The U.S. remains the province's major market for flaxseed with an increase of 45 per cent in 2022. Flaxseed exports to China declined significantly by over 90 per cent. In 2022, China sourced over 95 per cent of their flaxseed from the Black Sea region.

Cereal Grains

Exports of Saskatchewan cereal grains increased by 10 per cent in 2022, from \$5.4 billion in 2021 to \$5.9 billion in 2022.¹

Non-Durum Wheat

Overall, the province's exports of non-durum wheat increased eight per cent valued at \$2.8 billion in 2022. Major export destinations including China, Japan, U.S., and Bangladesh recorded significant increases of non-durum wheat shipments in 2022. The most dramatic increase in percentage terms was in Bangladesh. Non-durum wheat exports to this market increased almost 40 per cent, from \$132 million to \$182 million.

Durum

Saskatchewan's exports of durum increased in value in 2022. Sales increased by 21 per cent, from \$1.5 billion to \$1.8 billion. Exports to the U.S. reached \$297 million, an increase of over 200 per cent. Morocco and Italy remain our top two markets, with increases in exports of 39 per cent and 36 per cent, respectively. Morocco's imports of Canadian wheat were up in 2022 due to drought which resulted in a decline in production.²

Other Cereal Grains

In 2022, the province's exports of oats increased by three per cent, from \$296 million in 2021 to \$304 million. The U.S. remains Saskatchewan's largest oat market by far, accounting for 96 per cent of our exports. Saskatchewan's exports of barley decreased by 19 per cent in 2022, primarily due to a decrease in exports to China falling from \$627 million in 2021 to \$432 million in 2022. Exports to the U.S showed the most growth, increasing almost 180 per cent with sales of \$103 million.

Pulses

Saskatchewan's global pulse exports increased 15 per cent compared to 2022. China, India and Turkey account almost 50 per cent of SK's pulse exports.

Lentils

Lentil exports increased 14 per cent in 2022, due to increased demand from Turkey, UAE and Bangladesh. India's demand was flat compared with the previous year. They remain SK's largest lentil market with sales of \$391 million.

Other Pulses

In 2022, exports of Saskatchewan peas increased eight per cent with sales valued at \$1.1 billion. This is significantly higher than the previous five-year average (2017-2021) of \$806 million. Pea exports increased to U.S. and China by 29 per cent and 13 per cent, respectively. Exports to Bangladesh decreased by 30 per cent with sales of \$83 million. In 2022, exports of Saskatchewan chickpeas increased by almost 70 per cent from \$149 million to \$250 million.





Livestock

Saskatchewan's livestock industry depends on both inter-provincial and international trade. Based on Saskatchewan cattle permits in 2022, there were over 1.2 million head of cattle that left the province. The majority of Saskatchewan inter-provincial trade of cattle was to Alberta in 2022 at 855,000 head. The U.S. market makes up 100 per cent of Saskatchewan's international live cattle exports. In 2022, Saskatchewan's exports of live cattle increased 50 per cent by value, from \$152 million to \$229 million. By volume, the number of head increased 32 per cent from 106 thousand to 139 thousand.

Exports of live swine were flat in 2022 compared to the previous year at \$59 million. The U.S. is Saskatchewan's largest swine export market, with an eight per cent increase in 2022 to \$51 million. The second largest market is Vietnam, with exports of \$6.4 million. Live swine exports to Russia dropped by 78 per cent from \$4.5 million in 2021 to \$1 million in 2022.

Saskatchewan's Top 15 Agri-Food Export Markets

Out of Saskatchewan's top 15 agri-food export markets, seven countries had growth in the value of exports in 2022. The most significant increase was seen in the U.S., with exports increasing by value by 43 per cent. The most significant decrease was seen in the UAE, with exports decreasing by 43 per cent from \$636 million in 2021 to \$363 million in 2022.

In 2022, Saskatchewan exported over \$300 million in agri-food products to each of 13 different countries. Although demand fluctuates annually between countries due to various factors and market conditions, Canada and Saskatchewan are recognized as a trusted, safe, stable, supplier of a sustainable range of agri-food products and commodities.

Saskatchewan's Trade and Investment Office Network

Saskatchewan has the agriculture products the world needs. The International Trade and Investment Offices provide exporters and investors with support to navigate business opportunities and increase trade.

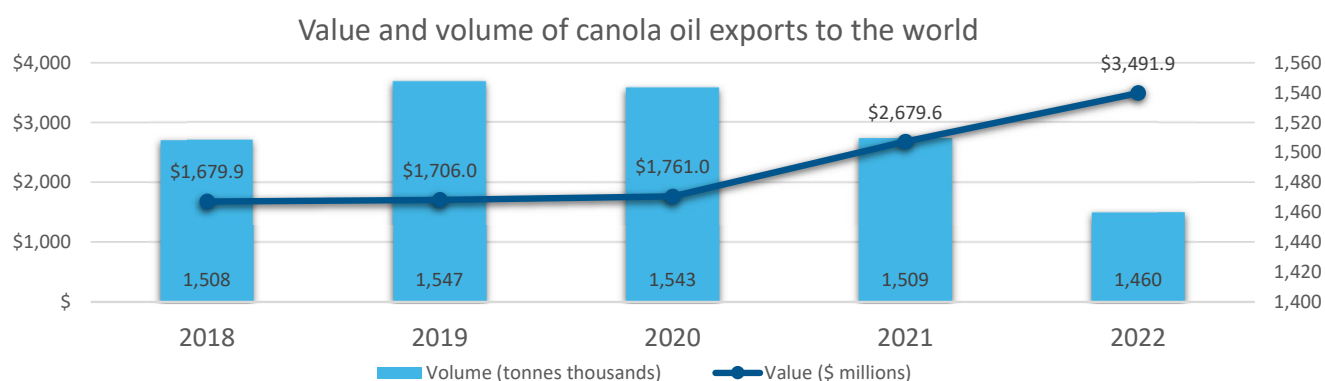
