Overview of Travel and Objectives

Minister Makowsky met with government partners, post-secondary institution partners, and students in Mexico City and Mérida, Yucatán.

The mission built on the province's new International Education Strategy to meet the commitments outlined in the Saskatchewan Growth Plan.

Key activities focused on building partnerships, strengthening relationships, and building new opportunities for post-secondary institutions in Saskatchewan and Mexico to collaborate around student mobility and research.

Travel Activity

While in Mexico City the Minister:

- met with officials from the Canadian Embassy in Mexico City;
- gave a keynote address to faculty, students and authorities at the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM);
- witnessed the renewal of a Student Exchange agreement between University of Saskatchewan and UNAM;
- witnessed a signing of a memorandum of understanding between the University of Saskatchewan and the National Polytechnic Institute of the United Mexican States (IPN); and,
- met with the Minister of Foreign Affairs Mexico.

While in Mérida, the Minister:

- joined the Constitutional Governor of the State of Yucatán at an event to celebrate 130 students from Yucatán who were selected to travel to Saskatchewan for language training this summer, with the first cohort arriving the week of May 16th;
- promoted the province and the post-secondary education sector in a keynote speech at the Technological Metropolitan University (UTM); and,
- witnessed the signing of a letter of intent between the Saskatchewan Polytechnic and the Autonomous University of Yucatán.
