### Introduction

In 2022, Saskatchewan's economy grew by 5.7 per cent, the highest among the provinces despite a tight labour market.

Following the COVID-19 pandemic and the severe drought conditions that occurred in 2021, significant progress has been made in the recovery of the economy. A 52 per cent increase in crop production and a rise in commodity demand contributed greatly to this growth.


In addition, agriculture, forestry, fishing, and hunting rebounded with a 45.6 per cent increase, manufacturing was up by 1.4 per cent, mining and oil and gas grew by 4.0 per cent, and arts, entertainment, and recreation increased by 20.5 per cent.

Internationally, the Fraser Institute's industry survey ranked Saskatchewan as the third most attractive jurisdiction in the world for mining investment in 2022.

### Canadian Economic Growth


Figure 1: Quarterly Real GDP and Growth Rates, Canada

According to Statistics Canada, the real national gross domestic product (GDP) at market price increased by 3.4 per cent in 2022 (see Figure 1). In the first half of 2022, the labour market in Canada performed well. However, in the second half, economic activity experienced a slowdown as businesses and households adapted to increased borrowing costs. This led to a decline in business entry and a sharp contraction in housing investment.

### Global Economic Growth


Figure 2: 2022 Real GDP Growth Rates

Russia's war in Ukraine and the accompanying supply chain impacts in many countries slowed down global economic growth to 3.4 per cent in 2022 from 6.3 percent in 2021 (see Figure 2 and Figure 3).

In particular, the European economy was affected by material and commodity shortages and rising prices. China's economy slowed to three percent in 2022 as a result of unexpected shocks, including the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown policies and extreme heat waves.

Figure 3: Real GDP Growth Rates





## **Oil & Natural Gas**

In 2022, Saskatchewan's natural gas sales increased by 44.1 per cent. Oil sales also increased from \$10.9 billion to \$16.3 billion.

Saskatchewan remained the third-largest natural gas-producing province in Canada during this period, producing 3.9 billion cubic meters of natural gas, a decrease of 170.4 million cubic metres from 2021 (4.0 billion cubic metres).

Saskatchewan continued to rank second among oil-producing provinces in Canada. Oil production in 2022 was 26.4 million cubic metres (166.0 million barrels), an increase of 619.3 thousand cubic metres (3.9 million barrels) from 2021 (see Figure 4).

## **Export**

In 2022, United States remained Saskatchewan's biggest export market. Exports reached a record high of \$29.3 billion. Saskatchewan's exports to the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) amounted to \$2.9 billion in 2022, a significant 91.3% increase compared to 2021.

## **Potash**

Production of potash increased by 0.8 per cent in 2022 from 14.2 million tonnes in 2021 to 14.4 million tonnes. During the same period, the average price of a tonne of potash ( $K_2O$ ) was \$1,252.4, an increase of 136.1 per cent from \$530.5/tonne in 2021. Potash sales increased


substantially from \$7.6 billion in 2021 to \$18 billion in 2022. The increase was due to higher prices caused by strong fertilizer demand and shortages caused by Russia's war in Ukraine.

The United States, Brazil, Indonesia, and China accounted for 72.5 per cent of Saskatchewan's potash exports.

## **Agriculture**

Saskatchewan's agriculture industry had a strong recovery from the significant drought in 2021 including registering a 52 per cent increase in crop production. The total seeded area in 2022 was 16.2 million hectares, a slight decrease from 2021. For major crops, wheat had the largest seeded area in 2022, with 5.4 million hectares (41.4 bsh/ac). Following closely behind was canola with 4.6 million hectares (37.0 bsh/ac) of seeded area. There were also significant seeded areas for flax, lentils, oats, peas, and barley (see Figure 5). The province had \$18.6 billion in agricultural and food exports last year, accounting for more than one-third of its total exports. In 2022, Saskatchewan's realized net farm income was \$4.5 billion, the highest among provinces.

China was Saskatchewan's top export market for grains and oil seeds with a value of \$2.1 billion in 2022, down from \$2.2 billion in 2021.

## **Employment & Income**

A total of 19,800 jobs were added to the Saskatchewan economy in 2022. It is estimated that 8,900 more people were added to the labour force. During this period, the unemployment rate decreased by 1.9 percentage points to 4.7 per cent.

Saskatchewan's average weekly earnings increased by 3.0 per cent from \$1,108 in 2021 to \$1,140 in 2022.

At \$2,200 per week, the mining, oil, and gas sector continues to offer the highest wages in the province.

## **Investment**

In 2022, new capital investments were \$14.3 billion, an increase of \$2.3 billion from 2021. Among the industries with the highest share of capital spending, mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction accounted for 38.6 per cent of total capital expenditures in 2022.

Housing starts increased by 0.9 per cent between 2021 and 2022. The value of building permits increased by 22.8 per cent during the same period.

## **Retail Trade**

Saskatchewan retailers ended 2022 with \$25.1 billion in sales, an increase of 7.6 per cent from 2021. A per capita increase of \$1,272 in retail trade was recorded between 2021 and 2022.

There was a 25.5 per cent (\$6.4 billion) share of motor vehicles and parts in retail sales. This remained the largest share of retail sales, similar to 2021.

From 2021 to 2022, Saskatchewan retail sales recorded the seventh-highest percentage change of all provinces. In the same period, retail sales increased by 8.3 per cent nationally.


## **Population**

A total of 1,214,618 people lived in Saskatchewan in 2022, an increase of 29,307 from 2021. This is the largest reported annual growth since 1914.

There were 14,285 births and 10,634 deaths in the province, with deaths slightly above the 10-year average of 9,818 deaths. For the same period, natural population growth increased by 14.5 per cent to 3,651. The net migration in 2022 (25,656 persons) was higher compared to the previous year (3,002 persons).

Saskatchewan's population increase of 0.79 per cent (9,499) in the last quarter of 2022 was the fourth highest among the provinces and higher than the national average of 0.70 per cent.

Compared to 2021, Saskatchewan's 2022 net interprovincial loss of 5,883 persons was lower than in 2021 (8,503). In 2022, over 18,000 Canadians migrated to the province, while 24,307 residents left. Saskatchewan saw a net increase of 31,539 persons through international migration in 2022 which was higher than the net increase of 11,505 international migrants in 2021.



## **Vehicles**

A total of 1,190,034 vehicles were registered in Saskatchewan in 2022, an increase of 6,520 from 2021. There was a significant increase in registrations in the light (1.7 per cent) and heavy (1.6 per cent) truck categories, which account for almost 60.0 per cent of the total number. A 3.1 per cent decrease was recorded for the cars category.

Registration of electric vehicles increased by 74.8 per cent in 2022, continuing a steady rise since 2010.

Diesel and gasoline-powered vehicle registrations increased slightly by 1.7 per cent and 0.5 per cent, respectively.

## Utilities

A total of 26,160 GWh of electricity was consumed by Saskatchewan in 2022, an increase from 25,544 GWh in 2021. There was a significant increase in consumption by commercial, industrial, oil fields, and residential components. The amount of wind power generated in 2022 increased by 76.5 per cent to 2,260 GWh.

In Saskatchewan, 85.0 per cent of the electricity produced came from gas, coal, and hydropower.


## Conclusion

Among all the provinces, Saskatchewan had the highest growth rate in real GDP in 2022, at 5.7 per cent. Saskatchewan's economy experienced a significant upswing due to expansions in both goods-producing (10.3 per cent) and service-producing (2.0 per cent) industries. Saskatchewan ranked second among

provinces in terms of per capita investment (\$12,044) in 2022, exceeding the national average by a considerable margin (\$4,080).

In 2022, Saskatchewan experienced significant population growth at 1,214, 618 persons, an increase of 29,307 from 2021. This was largely driven by net international migration of 31,539.

In 2022, agriculture sector was the highest contributor to real growth in Saskatchewan (see Figure 7).

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





**Figure 10: Population by Age**




**Figure 11: Population by Economic Region**



**Figure 13: Unemployment Rate**




**Figure 14: Employment by Industry, 2022**





**Figure 17: 2022 Average Weekly Hours**





**Figure 18: 2022 Average Weekly Earnings**







**Figure 20: Retail Trade by Kind of Business**






**Figure 22: All-Items Consumer Price Index, 12-Month Change**





**Figure 28: CAPEX on Construction, Machinery and Equipment**



**Figure 29: Per Capita Total New Investment Expenditures**





**Figure 30: Crude Oil Statistics**



**Figure 31: Average Distance Drilled**



**Figure 32: Change in Volume Relative to 2012**





**Figure 33: Mineral Sales by Kind**



**Figure 34: Value of Potash Exports**





**Figure 35: Value of Forest Product Exports**





**Figure 40: Farm Operating Expenses and Depreciation**




**Figure 41: Seeded Hectares by Crop Type**





**Figure 46: Livestock Market Cash Receipts**





**Figure 47: Livestock Population**



**Figure 48: Total Receipts**



**Figure 49: Air Traffic Statistics**





**Figure 50: Saskatchewan Residents Returning from Abroad by Type of Transportation**



**Figure 51: Foreign Visitors Entering Saskatchewan by Type of Transportation**





**Figure 53: Number of Tax Filers By Income Level, Saskatchewan**




