

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

## NOVEMBER 2021

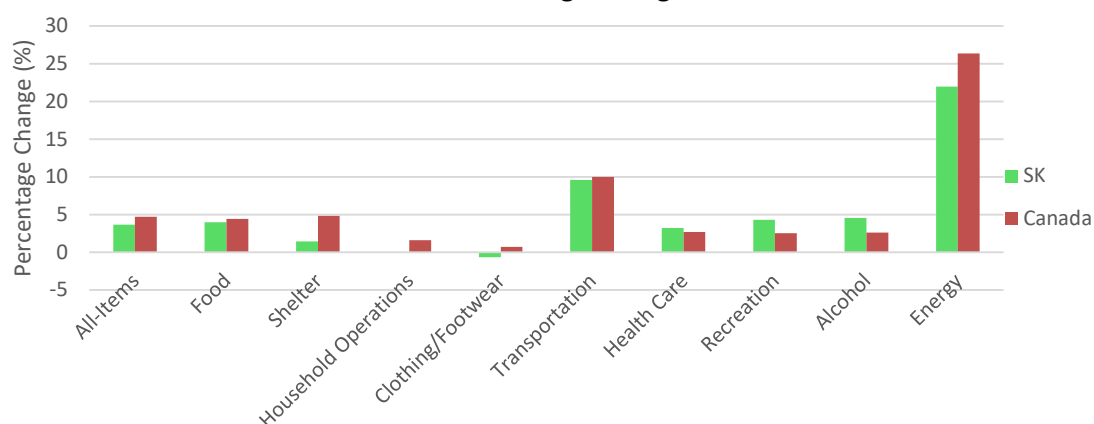
### YEAR OVER YEAR CHANGE

- Saskatchewan All-items CPI increased 3.7%
- Canada All-items CPI increased 4.7%
- Regina All-items CPI rose 3.4%
- Saskatoon All-items CPI rose 3.4%

In Saskatchewan, the main upward contributors to the change in Consumer Price Index were gasoline; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; homeowners' replacement cost; purchase and operation of recreational vehicles; and natural gas.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for passenger vehicle insurance premiums; mortgage interest cost; telephone services; electricity; and travel tours.

November 2020 to November 2021 Percentage Change for Saskatchewan and Canada



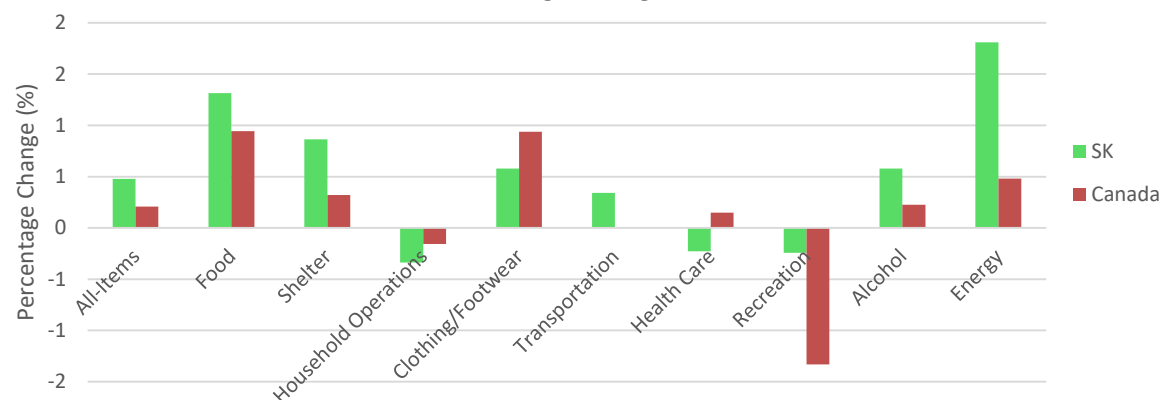
### MONTH OVER MONTH CHANGE

- Saskatchewan All-items CPI increased 0.5%
- Canada All-items CPI increased 0.2%
- Regina All-items CPI rose 0.5%
- Saskatoon All-items CPI rose 0.5%

In Saskatchewan, the main upward contributors to the change in Consumer Price Index were rent; natural gas; gasoline; fresh vegetables; and women's clothing.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for telephone services; travel tours; recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles); fresh or frozen chicken; and clothing accessories, watches and jewellery.

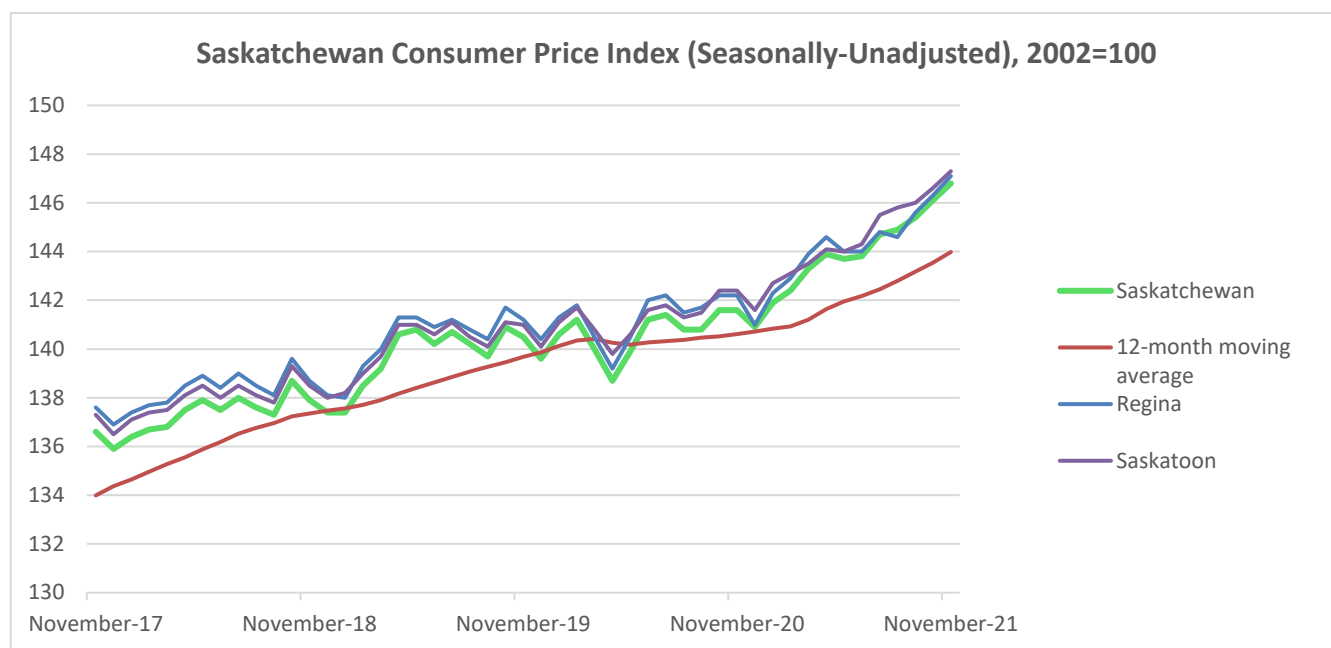
